

Garden Vegetable Beef Soup

Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1.5 pounds sirloin steak, or beef stew meat (or whatever lean steaks are on sale), cut into about 1" cubes
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 cup diced carrots
- 1 cup frozen or canned peas
- 1 cup frozen or canned corn
- 1 cup green beans
- 1 lb. potatoes, diced
- 8 cups beef stock
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 (28 oz.) can diced tomatoes, with juice
- 1 Tablespoon worcestershire sauce
- 1 Tablespoon Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon salt, or more/ less to taste

• 1/2 teaspoon freshlyground black pepper (optional garnish: chopped fresh parsley or dill)

Directions:

In a large stockpot, heat 1 tablespoon of the oil over medium-high heat. Add half the steak and cook, stirring frequently, until well browned, about 2 minutes. Remove the steak with a slotted spoon and transfer to a separate plate. Add the remaining steak and cook until browned, then remove and transfer to a separate plate.

Reduce the heat to medium-low and add the remaining tablespoon of oil to the pot. Add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally for about 5 minutes. Add the garlic, carrots and potatoes, and continue sauteing for another 3 minutes.

Add the remaining ingredients along with the cooked steak to the pot, and stir to combine. Bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. Reduce the heat to medium-low, cover pot, and simmer for at least 20-30 minutes, or until the steak and vegetables are all tender. Season with additional salt and pepper if needed.

Remove the bay leaves when ready to serve. Serve the soup warm, garnished with chopped fresh parsley or dill if desired.




