How often should the smoke alarms in your home be replaced? If you don't know, you're not alone. A national survey conducted by the National

Fire Protection Association shows that nine out of 10 Americans don't k n o w ofhow ten smoke alarms need to be

replaced. The correct answer: every 10 years.

As the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week, the Association is promoting this year's campaign theme, "Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years," to better educate the public about this potentially life-saving message.

"While the public generally knows that smoke alarms play an important role in home fire safety, some smoke alarm messages are not as well understood," says Lorraine Carli, vice president of Outreach and Advocacy for NFPA. "Not knowing how often smoke alarms

need to be replaced - or that they even have an expiration date - are among them."

A c cording to Carli,

that lack of awareness means some U.S. homes may have smoke alarms that have outlasted their full functionality, putting people at increased risk in the event of a home fire. NFPA statistics show that three out of five U.S. home fire deaths occur in homes with no smoke alarms or no working alarms.

"Working smoke alarms reduce the risk of dying in a home fire in half," said Carli. "That's why it's so Continued on page 6

Grant is One to Watch

An NHL training camp is not a tryout camp, teams already know who will be on their roster to start the season. The rest of the players are competing for spots in hockey's various minor leagues. But one unheralded player has stood out at in Buffalo and seems likely to snare a roster spot as the last man standing, or skating, for the Sabres.


Derek Grant posted four points in two home games to continue his hot streak from last year in the AHL where he scored 27 times in just 36 games, on pace for a 50+ goal season. His 36 goals were the sixth highest total in the league

even though he played less than half a season.

Grant had never been a big scorer in his career with his previous best being a respectable 21 goals in 73 games with AHL Binghamton in 2014-15. But it all came together for him last season and his career seems to on an rapid upward trajectory. He was drafted by Ottawa in 2008 in the fourth round, 119th overall, so Sabres GM Tim Murray, formerly with the Senators, obviously paid attention to his success and signed him as a free agent this past summer. Grant won the fastest skater competition at the AHL all star game and his

speed would fit in well in Buffalo. He's also strong in the face off circle where he could give the Sabres a reliable second fiddle to Ryan O'Reilly.

But how will his scoring prowess translate to the NHL? His preseason has been impressive but those are essentially AHL games with a few NHL'ers sprinkled into the lineup. Grant has 40 NHL regular season games on his resume and has yet to score a single goal. Only time will tell...



Shrimp Scampi

Ingredients:

- 1 pound linguini
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 4 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
- 2 shallots, finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Pinch red pepper flakes, optional
- 1 pound shrimp, peeled and de-veined
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- Juice of 1 lemon
- 1/4 cup finely chopped parsley leaves

Directions:

For the pasta, put a large pot of water on the

stove to boil. When it has come to the boil, add a couple of tablespoons of salt and the linguini. Stir to make sure the pasta separates; cover.

When the water returns to a boil, cook for about 6 to 8 minutes or until the pasta is not quite done. Drain the pasta.

Meanwhile, in a large skillet, melt 2 tablespoons butter in 2 tablespoons olive oil over medium-high heat. Saute the shallots, garlic, and red pepper flakes (if using) until the shallots are translucent. about 3 to 4 minutes.

Season the shrimp with salt and pepper; add them to the pan and cook until they have turned pink, about 2 to 3 minutes.

Remove the shrimp from the pan; set aside and keep warm.

Add wine and lemon juice and bring to a boil.

Add 2 tablespoons butter and 2 tablespoons oil.

When the butter has melted, return the shrimp to the pan along with the parsley and cooked pasta.

Stir well and season with salt and pepper.

Drizzle over a bit more olive oil and serve immediately.

decent signage, no intermodal accessibility and is hardly ever actually open. With the recent indefinite closure of the Exchange Street Station, now is the time to consider our future options.

Inter-modal passenger transport, also called mixed-mode commuting, involves using two or more modes of transportation in a journey. Mixed-mode commuting is often used to combine the strengths (and offset the weaknesses) of various transportation options.

Imagine Buffalo reclaiming its place among the great cities of the U.S. with a downtown intermodal train station, an iconic hub for trains, buses, light rail and bicycles. Imagine a seamless transit point taking you to Niagara Falls, the airport and maybe even to the Central

Terminal for a high speed rail connection to NYC, Chicago and beyond.

Mayors and Governors from Rochester, NY, to Raleigh, NC, recognize that as their economies grow, so will traffic. Here in Buffalo, there are signs everywhere, from Hertel Avenue experiencing growing pains and parking issues to the Medical Campus and its parking problems in the Fruitbelt. Every day, buildings are going up on the skyline, and with that will come people, in their cars, that will fill them.

An inter-modal train station downtown offers the opportunity to re-imagine the public space as a landmark hub that will ensure the sustainability of Buffalo's renaissance by leveling the cost of transportation and widening economic opportunity for everybody.



important to make sure they're working properly."

A smoke alarm's age can be determined by looking on the back or side of the smoke alarm, where the date of manufacture can be found. Smoke alarms should be replaced 10 years from that date (not the date of purchase or installation). In addition, smoke alarms should be tested monthly, and batteries should be replaced when they begin to chirp, signaling that they're running low.

Fire departments throughout the U.S. play a key role in making Fire Prevention Week an annual success by implementing the campaign in their communities; departments throughout the country will be hosting open houses and other local events throughout the month of October.
