Forum to Address Asthma Solutions

Parents of children with asthma have a hard time “breathing easy” when their kids cannot. 24 million people in the United States have asthma and 6 million are children - including an estimated 17,700 kids in Erie County alone. A child affected with asthma may have a hard time breathing, feel a tightness or pain in their chest and suffer from coughing fits, putting them at risk for hospitalization, illness, and in extreme cases, even death.

That’s why the American Lung Association, together with the Asthma Coal-

ition of Erie County and the Health Leadership Fellows of the Health Foundation of Western & Central New York are hosting a Community of Solution Event: Parent & Patient Forum on October

28th from 5:30 pm – 8:30 pm at the American Red Cross Training Center, located at 786 Delaware Ave in Buffalo.

“No one with asthma – or with a child who has

asthma – should ever feel helpless or hopeless,” said Jennifer Sullivan, Director of the Asthma Coalition of Erie County. “There are things that can be done on a family level – and there are things that we can accomplish as a community – to make the air cleaner, schools safer, and public spaces more friendly to those with asthma. Anyone who wants to be a part of that effort should join us for the Parent and Patient Forum to learn more.”

Two Games, Two Different Teams

Sabres fans welcomed the new season last Thursday at the newly named Key Bank Arena with some trepidation as young star Jack Eichel is sidelined for two months. Buffalo was also missing two newcomers that night, scoring winger Kyle Okposo and defenseman Dmitri Kulikov.

The home opener went downhill fast as an injury to Evander Kane meant that three of the Sabres top six forwards were sidelined. With Montreal's superstar goaltender Carey Price injured and out of the lineup, the Sabres found it hard to score against back-up Al Montoya despite getting 31 shots, and lost 4-1 with Matt Moulson scoring Buffalo's only goal on a clever pass from Sam Rhinehart. The Sabres defense was over matched against the speedy Canadiens forwards, especially

Casey Nelson whose soft play and turnovers were especially noticeable. Goaltender Robin Lehner did little to reassure the Sabres faithful that he will establish himself as the starter, surrendering four goals on only 24 shots.

Kyle Okposo made his Sabres debut in the next game at Edmonton and showed his value scoring the opening goal and set-

ting up Ryan O'Reilly for a 2-0 lead. O'Reilly had a career best four points going 2-2- 4 with Brian Gionta scoring a pair of goals and Matt Moulson adding another in a 6-2 win. The Sabres took advantage of shaky goal tending from the Oilers scoring six times on 24 shots while Robin Lehner was solid with 31 stops on 33 shots against.

It is encouraging to see that the veterans Gionta and Moulson each have a pair of goals in the first two games. With Eichel and Kane on the mend, more teammates will need to step up their contributions if the Sabres hope to keep their playoff hopes afloat in their absence.

It is with a heavy heart that I write this column. My dear friend and former employee Paul Likoudis lost his three year battle with colon cancer. Those of you who have been around North Buffalo for two decades will remember Paul as editor of our weekly papers, the North Buffalo Rocket and the West Side Times. He was a familiar face and had many great friends in the immediate area. He will be missed by family and friends.

Back in the early eighties, the North Buffalo Rocket and the West Side Times were representative weekly newspapers in their respective areas of Buffalo. The staff was limited to two graphic artists, one salesperson and a part time photographer. One day the two graphic artists and the salesperson decided to leave and start their own business. Without any notice the three paraded into my office and told me it was their last day. In fact the one graphic artist said, "this means you will have to go out of business." Not hardly.

Instantly ran an ad in the Rocket and within days a young man came into the office looking to fill the position. He was unaware of what had happened and earnestly

lobbied for at least one of the openings. He was qualified to fill any of the three job listings. He was a writer, photographer, graphic artist and could sell. So he was hired and for a while did do all of the three. We eventually hired at least one graphic artist. However it was he who just happened to step in and save the newspapers. He worked for Rocket Communications for eight years. When he was offered a more prestigious writing job with a major paper he took it. His work in his years here were outstanding. His love for the papers was second only to the love for his family. A wife and six children.

Through the years we have remained good friends. My wife and I were fortunate enough to have been invited to his daughter's wedding down where they live near Seneca Lake. I mention this as one thing transpired at the wedding that I will always remember. Back when Paul worked for me he and his wife Paulette were in the midst of having children, too easily. At this particular time he had four. He and I both being of the Catholic faith followed the rules of our church. So the children kept coming. I had eight and he was concerned about having any more

than the four. Yet, he wanted to remain a good Christian.

I told him a little story about a dryer salesman at Sears. My wife and I were concerned about the payments as we had just had our fifth. He said, "Not to worry about being able to provide, as each new child brings their own shoes." I always remembered that statement and related it to our family. Each of the children we had seemed to "bring their own shoes." With each birth something happened that made our life a little easier. Bigger

house, better job, better income. Seemed like each child did in some way bring their own shoes. We are now so happy we had all of them. It was tough back then but it was always good.

Well I related the shoe theory to Paul and he did have two more children. At his daughter's wedding he told the story of the shoes that I had passed on to him. So he kind of chuckled and said to his daughter she might not be here if it wasn't for the shoe story and she had me to thank. I liked that and it would

make me happy to think that I had something to do with her being here. She is a sweet person.

We were able to take the ride to see him this last summer and without really knowing at the time, saying our last goodbyes. He was not only a good friend, a former employee, a fan, and a dedicated family man, he was an inspiration til the end.

Goodbye good buddy, rest in peace.

alition's recent media campaign, "Not breathing is not normal," which aimed to educate parents about the causes and dangers of asthma. The campaign directed families struggling with asthma to call the Lung Association's Lung HelpLine at 1-800-LUNGUSA, where the association offers free advice from registered nurses, respiratory therapists, and counselors, including detailed and accurate information about asthma along with multiple other lung health topics. The Asthma Coalition of Erie County now seeks to build a grassroots community effort to identify, address and overcome asthma barriers in Erie County.

"Asthma can be a debilitating and scary disease if you don't have knowledge or tools to treat it effectively," said Jeff Seyler, Presi-

dent and CEO of the American Lung Association of the Northeast. "Children and parents will breathe easier when they are informed about strategies for dealing with asthma, and can actively participate in community-wide solutions to help those with asthma live healthy lives."

The American Lung Association recommends that affected families can be proactive in helping to control a child or loved one's asthma. Their suggestions include creating an asthma action plan, utilizing the Open Airways for Schools program, getting flu shots, and being aware of the daily air quality index.

The event is open to the public and offers free child care and dinner for all those who RSVP. Participants can register by contacting Jennifer Sullivan at: Jennifer.Sullivan@lung.org.

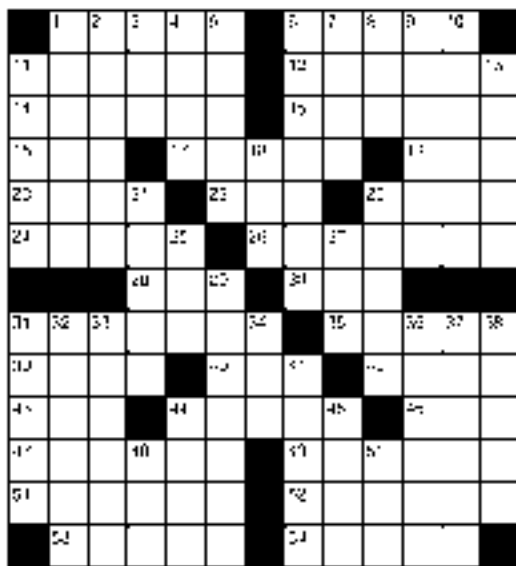
