
Without the right precautions, Halloween can truly become spooky and scary. Follow these tips, provided by the Erie County Department of Health, to keep you, your

Bag Your Leaves

Mayor Byron Brown today announced that the City of Buffalo will collect bagged leaves and yard waste from now until December 1st. City residents can put their bagged leaves at the curb during this time period for composting.

To participate in this collection, city residents are asked to place their leaves in clear plastic bags or brown recyclable bags. These bags are available at local hardware stores, home centers, and other retailers. There is no limit to the number of paper leaf bags residents may place at the curb for pickup.

Yard waste in the form of sticks and branches should be tied in bundles with 'twine' or 'rope' and be no longer than 4 feet in length. Do not rake leaves into the street; leaves should not be placed in garbage totes. Also, residents should be advised that raking leaves into city streets is illegal and punishable by fine.

Residents are also asked to place their yard waste on the curb. Yard waste and bagged leaves may be picked up on a different day than the garbage day. City residents should not be Continued on page 6




Matt Moulson Reborn

With a resume dotted with multiple 30 goal seasons with the New York Islanders (30 in 2009-10, 31 in 2010-11 and 36 in 2011-12), Matt Moulson brought an expectation of production when he was acquired for Thomas Vanek in the 2014-15 season. With solid 6-3-9 totals in 11 games for Buffalo and 21 goals in 68 games that season, his reputation was intact. While 17 goals in 64 games split between Buffalo and Minnesota in 2015-16 was trending downward, it did project to 20+ goals over a full season which is a solid season in the modern low scoring grind it out NHL.

Now on his second stint with the Sabres, Moulson's 13 goals during the tank season in 2014-15 was a career low but expectations were high for the next year as the team emerged from tanking mode with their young crop of talented for-

wards. But Moulson was a major disappointment last year. While his measly eight goal output was shockingly low, it was the nature of his playing style that drew attention. He wasn't getting to the areas where goal scorers need to be. Or maybe he couldn't get there anymore. Never the fastest skater, Moulson relied on creating a presence in front of the net and using quick hands to generate scoring chances. And his defensive play suffered as well as he seemed to be unable to keep up with the pace of the game.

The speed of the NHL game gets faster every year and Moulson was clearly falling behind. In the off season GM Tim Murray declared that he still had faith in Moulson but that he needed to make a commitment to training properly. While many were skeptical that Moulson could turn his game around he has silenced his skeptics with a solid beginning to the season with two goals along with a game winning shootout goal in his first four games. His improved goal scoring is the result of his renewed commitment to getting into the scoring area as evidenced by his 2.75 shots per game (11 shots in 4 games) which is double last season 1.37 average (111 shots in 81 games). His shooting percentage has also increased from 7.1% to 18.2%. While he's unlikely to maintain his current scoring pace which would net him 40 goals, a 20 goals season would be rather respectable.



This week's recipe come to us from long time Buffalo Rocket reader Kelly Burns of North Buffalo. Kelly says these kabobs work great as appetizers or as part of a festive meal.

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice
- 1/4 cup orange juice
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon paprika
- 1 tablespoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon ancho chile powder
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne

pepper

- 1 pound Chicken Breast Fillets, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 large red onion, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 red, orange or yellow bell pepper (or more as needed), cut into 1-inch pieces
- 12 (12-inch) skewers*

Directions

Prep 35 minutes Cook 10 minutes Ready In 5 hours

Mix juices, oil and spices in large plastic food storage bag. Add chicken cubes; seal bag. Massage bag to coat chicken. Refrigerate 4 hours or overnight to marinate.

Heat grill. Thread chicken, onion and bell peppers onto skewers. Grill about 10 minutes until chicken is cooked through, turning as needed for even browning.

Serve with squeeze of fresh lime and garnish with cilantro if desired.

* Tip - Make sure to soak wooden skewers in water for 30 minutes prior to putting food on them to avoid charring on the grill.





bulbs.

Remove or highlight potential tripping hazards.

Wet leaves should be swept from sidewalks and steps.

Restrain pets so they do not inadvertently jump on or bite a trick-or-treater.

Avoid open flames. Opt for battery-operated candles or LED lights in-

Do not overload extension cords.

All Dressed Up: Plan costumes that are bright and reflective. Make sure shoes fit well and that costumes are short enough to prevent tripping, entanglement or contact with

flame.

Because masks can limit or block eyesight, consider non-toxic makeup and decorative hats as safer alternatives.

When shopping for costumes, wigs and accessories look for and purchase flame resistant products.

Review with children how to call 9-1-1 if they ever have an emergency or become lost.

Exuberant or nervous pets may bolt out doors opened for trick-or-treat candy handouts. Ensure they are wearing up-todate proper identification in case they become lost.
