Sabres Goaltenders Stand Strong

When The Hockey News November most recent issue labeled "The Goalie Issue" hit newsstands last week, it included a section ranking all NHL teams from top to bottom on the perceived strength of the goaltenders. Ranking last were the Buffalo Sabres. Ironically on that same day, the Sabres team goals against average (GAA) was the fourth best in the NHL While GAA is a team statistic which reflects an overall defensive competency, the goalies have a major influence on that number.

disconnect be-The tween the Sabres high ranking and The Hockey News evaluation shows the author of that story needs to dig a little deeper in their research. The duo of Robin Lehner and Anders Nilsson have been a Swedish delight so far for Buffalo with Nilssons 1.96 GAA and .942 save % and Lehner at a 2.36 GAA and .923 save %. Goal support is a different story.

The offense has been anemic of late, usually scoring only one or two goals per game in the

absence of top forwards Ryan O'Reilly and Jack Eichel. The defense corps has not contributed much to the attack, they have not scored a single goal. And they're not contributing much as play makers either. Led by Rasmus Ristolainen's eight assists, the group has only 15 assists in 15 games Only nine of those assists have come during five of five play. Josh Gorges, Zach Bogosian, and Dmitri Kulikov have exactly zero points. Cody Franson who is in the lineup specifically for his offensive skills has only four helpers.

Jake McCabe has three.

And Top pair Kulikov and Ristolanien were embarrassed at home when Ottawa forward Ryan Dzingel skated between them them and scored on a one on three for his eighth career goal in 45 games.

Major disappointments at forward include Zemgus Girgensons with only one goal despite taking 31 shots and Tyler Ennis who despite his hard work has only a single goal, two points and a -6 in 12 games before going down with an injury. Sam Reinhart has only two goals on 34 shots. Much was expected from him after his breakout 23 goal season in 2015-16. With the injuries he has taken on more offensive responsibility where his lack of top end speed is apparent. His output should improve as he regains his role as the finisher when he pairs up again with Jack Eichel as the speedy puck carrier on his line.



Interviews will be conducted on a first-come, first-served basis. All prospective clientele are welcome to apply for HEAP assistance at outreach sites, regardless of age or disability. Emergency Heap Applicants must have a final disconnection notice. General HEAP applicants are required to bring the following documentation to the session:

• One (1) form of identification for all household members (Birth Certifi-

cates, License, Social Security Card).

• Proof of income received within the last 30 days for all household members (Pay Stubs, Social Security or Pension Award letters, Proof of Child Support, Rental Income, Unemployment Benefits, Worker's Compensation, etc.).

• Current Heat and Elec-

tric Bills including current shut off or disconnect notices, if applicable.

If an Applicant is missing information, they may be allowed to mail the information and complete the Application Process.



has no outlet to explore what area within the life sciences arena may show the most promise for them.

Fortunately, and thanks to a generous grant from the Cullen Foundation, the Buffalo Zoo is one of the newest tools available to complement traditional career counseling. As a result of the grant, the Zoo has developed an innovative experiential learning program for teenagers (ages 14-18) who show an interest in careers in life science.

The Life Science Career Lab program gives teens the chance to try on at least six different life science career hats to see if any of them fit. Excited by this offering, Buffalo Zoo Curator of Education Tiffany Vanderwerf stated that "Teens today need every bit of help in defining their potential career path, so we are thrilled that we have the chance to work with this age group to explore their options in this field: a field near and dear to our hearts."

The Zoo's mission includes educating the public and professionals alike in the topics of threatened and endangered species, habitat conservation, and the overall puzzle of how each component in the environment is directly linked to one another. To this point, Vanderwerf adds "Science isn't just about putting on a lab coat and looking under a microscope. While that can be fun for some, science can also be about getting outdoors to figure out how to save plants and animals from extinction, caring for the health of humans and animals, or managing the use of land resources."

This new and unique program will take a handson approach to career exploration. Six weeks in duration and running on Saturday mornings, the program culminates with an event at the Zoo for students to showcase their efforts to family, educators, and friends. Not only that, students will be rewarded for their efforts if completing the program in its entirety, with a \$240.00 Visa

gift card.

securely shred and recycle their confidential personal papers. Papers suitable for shredding include any confidential documents containing account numbers or social security numbers, bank or medical statements, tax documents, or other paper items of a personal nature. There will be a five (5) box limit per vehicle. All materials will be shredded on-site.

GObike of Buffalo will also be on site to accept bicycles in any condition. The Recycle-a-Bike program works with at risk students to teach them about bicycle repair and maintenance, as well as safety, health and the environment, while building their own bike from refurbished parts.

Also participating in the event is Mayor Brown's Western New York Coalition for Donated Goods, a consortium on nonprofit organizations. They will accept clothing, including worn and torn items, shoes




