Protect Your Pet



Pets frequently lose their sense of scent in snow and ice and can easily panic. Make sure you monitor your pet and keep current contact information on them at all times.

Cold weather is once again upon us so please take every precaution in ensuring you dogs and cats are only outdoors for very short periods of time with your supervision! Other basic cold weather tips include:

Keep a tight leash and never let your dog off the

leash on snow or ice, especially during a snowstorm. Pets frequently lose their scent on snow and ice, especially if snow is falling at a fast rate, and your pet can easily lose his sense of direction. Pets may also panic during a snowstorm and run away; many pets are lost during the winter months. Remember to keep current identification on your pet at all times!

Never leave your pet alone in a car during cold weather. A car can act as a refrigerator in the winter, holding in the cold. Your pet could literally freeze *Continued on page 4*



Sabres Prove Talent Against Formidable NY Rangers

Their dominating 4-1 victory over the New York Rangers puts to rest the theory that the Buffalo Sabres do not have a talented team. Their defensive commitment against the Rangers made it difficult for the league's highest scoring team to even get a shot on goaltender Anders Nilsson. The Rangers entered the game leading the NHL in wins and third in points while the Sabres were 28 th overall.

First period goals by Zemgus Girgensons and Evander Kane and the final tally by Jack Eichel were the result of players driving hard to the net without the puck, an all too infrequent sight in recent games.

The Sabres attack featured quick north south passes which create a speedy attack, another of coach Dan Bylsma's mantras which his players usually fail to follow.

While Rangers goalie Henrik Lundqvist had an off night allowing four goals on 19 shots, the Sabres earned this victory the old fashioned way, by outworking the leagues highest scoring team. While the Sabres first period effort was impressive they choked off any hope of a Rangers comeback from a 3-1 deficit in the third period by holding them without a shot for the first 14 minutes. 


to death. Leave your pet at

home where they are safe. Thoroughly wipe off

your pet's legs and stomach when she comes in and out of the rain, snow or ice. Check her sensitive foot pads, which may be bleeding from snow or ice encrusted in them. Your pet may also pick up salt



When your pet has to go outside, make sure he is dressed appropriately for the conditions.



and other chemicals on her feet accidentally. These chemicals could hurt her if she swallows them while licking her feet.

Check cars for cats during the winter, stray or neglected cats outdoors sometimes sleep under the hood of the car where it's warm and comfortable. If you start the motor, cats could get caught in or flung about by the fan belt, causing serious injury or death. To prevent this, bang loudly on the hood and sides of your car before turning on the ignition to give the cat a chance to escape.

Take your dog outside only for as long as it takes for him to relieve himself. Dogs, particularly small, short-haired breeds like Chihuahuas and terriers, suffer from the cold despite their seemingly warm fur coats.

Your pet runs the chance of catching a cold when wet, especially in cold weather so. If you absolutely must bathe your pet, consult a professional groomer or veterinarian.

Limit the clipping of your pet's hair in the cold winter months, keeping your pet as warm as possible. Brush your pet daily in lieu of clipping to keep your pet's coat healthy, shiny, clean and mat-free. Make sure your pet has a warm place to sleep far away from outside drafts.

Speak to your veterinarian about increasing your pet's supply of food, particularly protein, to keep his fur thick and healthy through the winter months. Inquire about vitamin and oil supplements.

ANTIFREEZE IS POI-SON TO PETS: antifreeze, even in small doses, is a lethal poison for dogs and cats! Because of its sweet taste, animals are attracted to it. Be sure to clean up spills thoroughly, and consider switching to an animal-friendly antifreeze. Ensure that, if you store Antifreeze in a garage, shed, or other places accessible to your pets, it is well out of pets' reach.


