Tension in Sabres Locker Room Leads To Victory

Following a 4-2 loss to the Vancouver Canucks on Sunday, goaltender Robin Lehner unloaded on his teammates in his post game comments. The teams were tied 2-2 after one period but the game was lost when the Sabres surrendered a pair of goals in the second, continuing a season long trend of poor second period play.

Second periods involve the longer distance to the bench from the defensive zone making it harder to change your defensemen and left winger on the far boards. A lack of hustle on these line changes from several Sabres players has been obvious along with extended shifts which keeps tired players on the ice too long.

Deep shoot ins are important in the middle period because it allows your players enough time to get to the bench and for their replacements to get into the play while their opponent retrieves the puck and moves back up the ice.

Against the Canucks some poor entry decisions by Jack Eichel caused turnovers putting undue stress on the team late in the second period. The Canucks ended up taking the last 14 shots of the period in only five minutes, scoring twice to secure the victory.

Lehner called for his teammates to follow the structure set forth by the coach which involves chipping the puck in deep during the second period and making responsible line changes. His point is well taken. The Sabres second period goal differential this season is an abysmal -20 as compared to a decent +3 in first periods and +2 in third periods.

Perhaps some players were living in the recent past with visions of Saturday night's victory in Toronto fresh in their memories. The Sabres had an impressive 2-0 lead before the Leafs even had a shot on goal. But they still surrendered 44 shots on goal while taking only 23 with Lehner putting in a near flawless performance surrendering only one flukey goal in their 3-1 win at the air Canada Center.

The pattern of continued Monday night in Ottawa with the Sabres surrendering 14 shots in the final eight minutes of the second period and surrendering a single goal to trail 2-1 at the horn. The team rallied with two third period goals for a 3-2 win with Robin Lehner stopping 39 of 41 shots.

Lehner has asserted his role as the teams starting goalie with his strong play. His save percentage ranks seventh in the NHL and he is the only Sabre among the league leaders in any meaningful category. So he has earned the right to speak out and and accordingly is taking on a leadership role. Hopefully his teammates will rally to the cause with their effort and not just their mouths.

This year's theme is "GAR-NET: The NYS Gem". Many varieties of garnets may be found around the world and can be cut into beautiful gem stones. 



NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF DRAFT DESIGN APPROVAL DOCUMENT

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) is developing a design plan to rehabilitate portions of the existing retaining wall along NY Route 33 – Kensington Expressway between Dodge Street and East Delevan Avenue in the City of Buffalo, Erie County. A portion of this project runs along the historic Martin Luther King Jr. Park which is listed as a Section 4(f) historic resource under 23 CFR Part 774 Parks, Recreation Areas, Wildlife and Waterfowl Refuges, and Historic Sites.

Design plans for the project have been developed by the NYSDOT after coordination with Federal, State and Local agencies. A Draft Initial Project Proposal/Final Design Report (IPP/FDR) has been prepared which assesses the project's effect on the quality of the human environment in accordance with the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA).

In addition, this notice conveys to the public that the proposed project is in compliance with Section 4(f) of the United States Department of Transportation Act of 1966, and a de minimis finding for the action of acquiring a permanent easement along Martin Luther King Jr. Park for the construction and future maintenance of the retaining wall. This action will not adversely impact the activities, features or attributes that qualify the property (Martin Luther King Jr. Park) for protection under Section 4(f). Copies of the Draft IPP/FDR are available for review and copying during business hours at the offices of New York State Department of Transportation, 100 Seneca St. Buffalo, New York 14203.
