The rule that Catholics cannot eat meat on Fridays during Lent is actually more lenient than what most Catholics in history have had to observe. Centuries ago, the Catholic Church had a law that forbade consuming meat on all Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays.

Strong Play of Lehner, Kane Validate GM Murray's Vision

Heading into the final third of the season coach Dan Bylsma announced his decision to ride goalie Robin Lehner in a final push for playoff contention. While Lehner has had a strong season, Sabres fans expressed their discontent over his penchant for giving up soft goals, inability to make a save in shootouts and his overall losing record. They also cite the high price paid as Sabres GM Tim Murray had sent a first round pick to Ottawa for Lehner.

But Lehner's losing record stemmed from poor goal support in the first 20 games before Jack Eichel returned from injury. And his play since taking over the heavy role as starter has been stronger. With his 2-0 shutout of Colorado on Saturday, Lehner rose to third in league save percentage before dropping to 7th following Chicago's 5-1 beat down on Sunday. He also led the team on it's first sustained winning streak, albeit a modest three game, which pulled them withing one point of the Toronto Maple Leafs and the eighth and final playoff position.

Murray had faced some criticism for his acquisition of Lehner from Ottawa

where he had previously been employed as a scout by his uncle, senators GM Bryan Murray. Lehner did not present a body of work that showed he could handle the workload of a number one goaltender but Murray believed in his potential. Lehner's play and leadership so far this season are proving that he has the right stuff to be a franchise goaltender.

Evander Kane has inspired some discontent outside and within the organization. His well known off ice escapades are fodder for the media. His play on the ice was also the subject of much criticism. Long known as a skilled player who went up his wing and fired long distance wrist shots on goal with a very little chance of scoring, it was felt he would never develop beyond this one dimensional game.

While Kane's off ice life-

style has been quieter his play on the ice lately has drawn the right kind of attention. Since Eichel's return Kane has been the hottest Sabre scorer. He has 21 goals on the season, all coming in 37 games since December 3rd. He had 20 goals last season in 61 games. He leads the NHL with 20 goals at even strength. His success stems from diversifying his attack, working in closer for shots, finding open ice where teammates can set him up, establishing a presence in front of the net where he can pounce on rebounds. In short, he has evolved as a player to become part of an attacking unit rather than a one man show.

Kane was the centerpiece in the Sabres big trade with Winnipeg sending Tyler Myers, Drew Stafford and Joel Armia west. There has been lots of chatter lately about moving Kane for a top four defenseman. His is a free agent after next season and his trade value will never be higher. For now, his rising prominence is a testament to the vision and patience of the organization who took a chance on him and is paying dividends.







Bishop Richard J. Malone will distribute ashes at the 12:05 pm Mass at St. Joseph Cathedral,50 Franklin St., Buffalo, on Wednesday, March 1st, Ash Wednesday.

Church guidelines for Lent include, for all Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday, abstaining totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent including Good Friday. Catholics who are between their 18th and 59th birthdays are also bound to observe the Law of Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions in the course of the day.

Also, all Catholics who have made their First Communion are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This must be done during the Easter season, between March 5 (first Sunday of Lent) and June 11 (Trinity Sunday), unless, for a good reason, it is fulfilled at another time.

laxed to remove meat from the diet on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays. In 1966. Catholic bishops in America, with the blessing of Pope Paul VI, further relaxed the rule. Nowadays meat is only prohibited on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and Fridays of the Lenten season. Catholics are obligated to observe this fast as a minimum; they can make up stricter requirements for themselves, if they so desire.

The stated reason for Catholics not being allowed to eat meat on Fridays during Lent is to remind the faithful that Jesus died on a Friday. Jesus gave up His body (His flesh), and Catholics, in an effort to attain greater communion with Christ, refrain from consuming flesh.

If there is no eating meat on Fridays, then why is eating fish allowed for Catholics? The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops states that fish are a different category of animal. So it's only the meat of warm-blooded animals that is prohibited. Eggs, butter, and milk are also allowed.

Many restaurants in Buffalo offer a fish fry and Western New York has a strong Catholic community that abstain from most meat products on Fridays during Lent. This is why the Fish Fry became a popular tradition this time of the year. The Fish Fry is a fillet of haddock or cod, deep fried or broiled, served with French fries, coleslaw, a side of potato or macaroni salad, tartar sauce, a slice of lemon and bread.

Who has the best? That is for you to decide. Here are a few of the local restaurants that are offering a Fish Fry during Lent that may help you make that decision: Wellington Pub, 1541 Hertel Avenue, St. Mark Parish, 399 Woodward Avenue, TC Jr's, 2941 Delaware Avenue, and Johnny's Meats (take out only,) 1191 Hertel Avenue.

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) is developing a design plan to rehabilitate portions of the existing retaining wall along NY Route 33 – Kensington Expressway between Dodge Street and East Delevan Avenue in the City of Buffalo, Erie County. A portion of this project runs along the historic Martin Luther King Jr. Park which is listed as a Section 4(f) historic resource under 23 CFR Part 774 Parks, Recreation Areas, Wildlife and Waterfowl Refuges, and Historic Sites.

Design plans for the project have been developed by the NYSDOT after coordination with Federal, State and Local agencies. A Draft Initial Project Proposal/Final Design Report (IPP/FDR) has been prepared which assesses the project's effect on the quality of the human environment in accordance with the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA).

In addition, this notice conveys to the public that the proposed project is in compliance with Section 4(f) of the United States Department of Transportation Act of 1966, and a de minimis finding for the action of acquiring a permanent easement along Martin Luther King Jr. Park for the construction and future maintenance of the retaining wall. This action will not adversely impact the activities, features or attributes that qualify the property (Martin Luther King Jr. Park) for protection under Section 4(f). Copies of the Draft IPP/FDR are available for review and copying during business hours at the offices of New York State Department of Transportation, 100 Seneca St. Buffalo, New York 14203.
