Sabres Show Their Mettle With 7 losses in 8 Games

After losing a 3-0 lead Sunday night at Pittsburgh to fall 4-3, the Sabres returned home and laid a season defining stinker losing 6-3 to the Philadelphia Flyers Tuesday night at Key Bank. While goalie Robin Lehner takes his share of the blame for a poor performance, surrendering six goals on 30 shots, his teammates certainly didn't provide much help.

"We weren't ready from the start, the first period they really took it to us. We were lucky to come out tied (1-1)," said captain Brian Gionta following the game. Coach Dan Bylsma added, "I thought we weren't ready to play the game, that's what it looked like. Maybe we were a little shell shocked, maybe back on our heels from the previous game."

Those statements are an indictment of a flawed team, that can't regroup 48 hours after a disappointing loss. Other than Jack Eichel's two goals and Evander Kane single tally, and some occasional spirited play in the Flyers defensive zone, the Sabres gave the fans little reason to cheer. All of the talk about contending for a playoff spot which is still only five points away rings hollow with this being the teams seventh loss in their last eight games.

The Flyers scored six even strength goals to Buffalo's one, continuing a season long trend where the Sabres are the leagues lowest scoring team five on five.

Eichel had three points on the night to extend his point scoring streak to 11 games with 16 points on five goals and 11 assists. He also picked up his 100th point as a Sabres, the third youngest player to do so behind Phil Housley and Pierre Turgeon. He now has 101 career points in 127 games. Since February 1st, Eichel has picked up 24 points, the most of any player in the NHL.





State College Great Lakes Center and SUNY Erie Community College. 
Through hands-on experiences, such as educational tours, water-quality monitoring practice and community restoration cleanup projects, participants in the Water Academy will gain valuable knowledge, skills and abilities to further their environmental careers. Environmental priorities of the program include local climate change solutions, addressing watershed contamination, and safeguarding fresh water. The Water Academy program will include work-

shops such as "The Love Canal Legacy in Western NY," "Healing Scajaquada Creek," and "Restoring Niagara's Hazardous Waste Sites."

Since 1992, EPA has distributed between \$2 million and \$3.5 million in grant funding per year, for a total of over \$68 million supporting more than 3,600 grant projects. This highly competitive grants program supports environmental education projects that increase public awareness about environmental issues and provide participants with the skills to take responsible actions to protect the environment. The program provides financial support for projects that design, demonstrate or disseminate environmental education practices, methods or techniques.

Corned Beef & Cabbage

This traditional Irish favorite is a one-pot, complete meal that is so easy to prepare, you won't want to save it for just the wearing o' green.

Prep Time: 15m Cook Time: 2 Hrs. 45m Calories: 393 Ingredients:


- 1 corned beef brisket, trimmed (3 pounds)
- 1 small onion, quartered


