On April 6, 2017, The Buffalo History Museum will premiere its new World War I exhibit, For Home and Country, marking the 100th anniversary of American involvement in World War I. During the war, our nation lost nearly 117,000 of its bravest men and wom-

en. The exhibit will commemorate the sac- HISTORY MUSEUM April

of rifice 968 lives from Western New York.

Guests will explore their stories and view rarely before seen artifacts from the collection including home front advertising, uniforms, and weaponry. A faux-bunker installation will honor the soldiers of the decisive Meuse-Argonne Offensive and a memorial wall within the exhibit will give remembrance to each man and woman who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

The exhibit For Home and Country will run for two years (April 2019). The coinciding WWI propaganda poster exhibit in the State Court, Paper Bullets, The Posters That Sold The Great War, will close in December 2017.

### **Reinhart Benching Draws Attention**

by George Kuhn Sam Reinhart was glued to the bench for the entire game in Tuesday night 3-1 loss to the Columbus Blue Jackets. Ostensibly for missing a team meeting, the benching appears to be a public manifestation of the conflict brewing internally between coach Dan Bylsma and some of his young

players including Jack

Eichel. "Sam Reinhart violated a team policy and the discipline was not playing in tonight's game. We're going to move forward from here. It's disappointing, but it happened, we dealt with it and we're going to move on from here. We're part of a team. We do things as a team. That's hopefully the lesson," coach Bylsma commented after the game.

As is typical of young talented forwards in their first few NHL seasons, the attention paid to defensive responsibilities is secondary to their offensive game. After all these players made it to the big leagues because of their offensive skills, not because they box out well in the defensive zone. But NHL coaches know that defense wins games so

they seek to create a balance in their young stars game.

When he coached in Pittsburgh, Bylsma was known to harp on the defensive deficiencies of his star players Sydney Crosby and Evgeni Malkin. After six seasons the players got tired of listening to the criticisms and Bylsma was dismissed following a few disappointing playoff performances. Similar conflicts with his young stars are reportedly developing here.

This is reminiscent of the conflict between Vincent Lecavalier and coach

John Tortarella in Tampa Bay. Lecavalier was the number one overall draft pick in 1998, Tampa Bays version of Jack Eichel. Torts was very hard on his young players and Lecavalier at one point demanded a trade. But management backed up their coach and told their young star to get with the program. Eventually Lecavalier made a commitment to play better defense and play more physically and Tampa won a Stanley Cup in 1994.

Lets hope the story ends the same way here.





and leadership of the Buffalo Zoo to make it one of the best zoos in the country under her guidance.

"It is my great honor and privilege to recognize and thank Donna Fernandes for her many years of service at the Buffalo Zoo. Donna has not only been the zoo's leader and public figure, but the engine that has made it go, helping to make the Buffalo Zoo one of the premier zoos in the nation and a true local treasure," said Legislator Savage.

Dr. Fernandes joined the Buffalo Zoo in 2000 to become the first female President in its entire 142 year history, and her leadership was vital in the Zoo earning accreditation from the prestigious Association of Zoos and Aquariums, being one of only 232 institutions worldwide that meet the Association's standards.

"I would like to express my gratitude to Legislator Peter Savage and the entire Erie County Legislature for honoring me in this way. I am also grateful for the incredible financial support that the County has provided to the Buffalo Zoo during my tenure," stated Dr. Fernandes.

Dr. Fernandes' tenure is distinguished by the Buffalo Zoo's undertaking of rebuilding its urban facility to create and renovate exhibits coupled with adding conservation education for visitors.
