Sabres Making Visitors Welcome to Keybank Center

With the season winding down to a disappointing conclusion, the Sabres had a light week with only a pair of home games. On Sunday April 2nd the New York Islanders dropped the Sabres 4-2 despite missing their star forward John Tavares due to injury.

Then the Sabres reached the low point of their season on Monday April 3rd against Toronto. The Sabres apperared disinterested and disorganized from the opening faceoff and the Leafs took a 3-0 lead on five shots in the games first five minutes. The three goals were scored quickly in a span of 43 seconds.

Goalie Robin Lehner was replaced by Frederik Anderson who finished strong with 39 saves on 40 shots. But it wasn't all on Lehner as the Sabres committed turnovers directly leading to scoring chances. The first period shots on goal were 18-2 in favor of the visitors with Toronto holding possession of the puck 73% of the period. That's just embarassing.

After two periods the shots were 29 to 8 and the Sabres had nine giveaways or one more than they had shots on goal. At one point in the third the shots were 42 to 14. That ratio of 3-1 was a fair reflection of the one sided game. The final shots on goal were 45 to 22 for Toronto and was flattering to Buffalo because the Leafs were by far the better team in this game.

It's hard to understand how this was possible since the Sabres just dominated the Leafs 5-2 in Buffalo just eight days earlier. The facial expressions on several Sabres players as they headed to the bench at the end of their shifts suggested a lack of interest in their performance. The players post game comments about needing to play better sounded hollow. If they knew how to play better they would already be doing it.

Jack Eichel scored a nice goal, his 24th of the season, in garbage time but it was Leafs rookie star Auston Matthews who made history when he scored his 39th goal to become the highest scoring American born rookie ever. Breaking Neal Broten's record of 38 set in the 1981-82 season.







the Founder and President of the organization, helps women understand all aspects of their disease so that they able to learn to advocate for themselves and their health. Maxian points out that '"studies show that women with ovarian cancer, who attend support groups and are educated about their disease have better survival." Maxian continues, "There is a real loss of control with a cancer diagnosis of this type, the women become patients with routines focused on scheduled appointments, surgeries and chemotherapies. With our help and encouragement whether in our Support Group setting, in our Mentoring Program or One-On-One, we focus on things they can do to begin taking back control of their lives, our services are about as patient focused as you can get."




