7,000 fans. A newcomer to the Bisons this season, Tellez, made his presence known by cracking two home runs on his first two at-bats in the second and fourth innings for an early, 2-0 Buffalo lead just as Bison fans had settled into their seats.

still playing for his manager last year in Bobby Meacham, the new Bisons manager. Meacham becomes the 20th Bison skipper in the teams' modern history after he was promoted to the Bisons by the Blue Jays early this year. Now, after three games, the team has gotten off to a great start at 4-0 w-l after weekend games and a win Monday against the Rochester Red Wings, ready to celebrate a special season on the same site as a former Governor and Buffalo Mayor once did thirty years ago. With just a couple of name changes, the diamond at One James D. Griffin Plaza still remains the same and shines the red, white and blue of the Buffalo Bisons. For the fifth year in a row, the Herd is the triple A affiliate of the nearby Toronto

Blue Jays baseball team located just across the border in Canada about 90 minutes

Projected starting pitcher Casey Lawrence was called up by the Blue Jays earlier in the day so Meacham inserted right hander Jarrett Grube to take his place on the mound. The Rail Riders feature a heralded line-up as the Triple A affiliate of the New York Yankees. Some of their players include names who have appeared in Yankee Stadium already. Second baseman Rob Refsnyder and others like Clint Frazier, Tyler Wade and Dustin Fowler are in the top of the order for future Yankees careers.

But the Bisons were ready for the task on this day, as they were 30 years ago, when Bison owners Bob and Mindy Rich welcomed former Governor Mario Cuomo and then Buffalo Mayor Jim Griffin to Pilot Field April 14th, 1988. Bison catcher Tom Prince cracked a solo home run in the third inning and pitcher Scott Patterson kept the Denver Zephers off the scoreboard for a 1-0 victory. It's been a Celebration ever since!






