Sunday is usually a day of rest for most boys and girls in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League. With two games scheduled every week, players and coaches concentrate on their field of dreams at home. But this past Sunday, under cloudy skies, local baseball legend and Bison Hall of Famer Rick Lancellotti came to Shoshone Park to meet with many volunteer coaches in the North Buffalo League to help answer their questions about managing youth baseball teams.

"I could tell by their attention, their questions and their note-taking just how important they feel my information is to them in these coaching clinics, "said Lancellotti, the founder of the Buffalo School of Baseball, located in Clarence. "The weather may have been an issue for some, but for those that were there, if they received some help in a classroom setting, then they're better for it."

Lancellotti, a former Major League Baseball player for 17 years, mostly spent with the Pittsburgh Pirates, opened the local baseball and softball school in 1993 after his retirement from the game. Since that time, he has literally taught thousands of area youth the art of pitching, hitting and fielding in two suburban locations, the latest of which is in the Sports Performance Park in the Eastern Hills Mall on Transit Road.

"I'm familiar with Shoshone Park, yes," said the affable "baseball king" when questioned afterward. "My boys used to play against North Buffalo many times while growing up in a Clarence League. Your League is very well looked upon and you take great care of this Park. It feels pretty good to be able to gauge an interest in the game by visiting other Parks and Shoshone

is right up there with the bigger Parks in the Suburbs."

In 1979, when Baseball returned to Buffalo as the Double A team for the Pirates, Lancellotti was named the Eastern League MVP, hitting 41 home runs and driving in 107 runners for a Bison team that included other former Major Leaguers like catcher Tony Pena and pitcher Dave Dravecky. Besides playing for Pittsburgh, Rick has spent time with San Diego (1982) San Francisco (1986) and Boston (1990) and in 1992, he finished his career as the alltime active minor league homerun leader with 276 homeruns.

"The passion for the game is there with your coaches," said Lancellotti, "going all the way back

to John Tripi (a former North Buffalo president) and it's my pleasure to come visit your Park."

A lot of baseball and softball to catch you up on from the past few weeks. In a Second Minor boys game from Saturday, May 13, three Braves, Nick Martin, Stewart and Charlie Easton Buchholz helped lead the team to a 2-1 win over Brewers. The team is trying to keep pace with the Pirates, who have won four in a

In First Minors, the Tigers got their first win of the season with a 4-1 victory over the Yankees. Kendrick Rosario and Joe Cheman both had two hits at the plate and on the mound, the team combined for 16 strike-

The Orioles are 3-0 led by Adam Kilminster, Derrick Gottler and Trevor Speck. Kilminster had four hits, including a triple and Speck allowed just one hit and struck out five in a win over the Royals, 13-3. The Blue Jaysdefeated the Angels, 10-6 and the Twins defeated the A's 5-1.

In Major Boys, the undefeated Dodgers were leading 5-3 over the Mets in the bottom of the sixth inning, when Ty Graczyk stepped to the plate with Mike Helfrich and Cole Linder on base and on the second pitch, sent the ball deep into right field, over the fence for a three run homerun and a 6-5 victory. It was the first homerun like this for the season and possibly the first of many. The Reds defeated the Nationals 6-5 led by Paddy Mulhern who struck out seven over three innings. Max Ilecki had three hits and four RBI's and teammate Norman Hall got his first hit of the season.

Trip to Toronto

Not that long ago we would visit Canada at least once a week to play golf, have a fish fry or a Fort Erie Chinese dinner. After experiencing some difficulties at customs the desire to cross the border lessened. Actually it has been years, so in reality I could not give an opinion on today's customs regulations and border crossing.

Last week the opportunity to again visit our neighbor to the North presented itself. My son rented a small truck to drive to Toronto to pick up a shipment. Having not been to Canada in such a long time it was a chance to again see the Canadian Metropolis. Knowing that I decided to go along. Really happy I did as it was certainly an enjoyable learning experience.

We had made arrangements to cross at the Lewiston/ Queenston bridge. By the time we left it was late Friday afternoon and we expected to be involved in heavy traffic. To add to the beginning of the weekend, the following Monday was a Canadian Holiday. So our brethren in Canada were in a hurry to get to wherever they were going.

We anticipated heavy, slow and even stopped traffic, and long lines at the bridge, both ways. That did not happen.

Going over the bridge was a non-wait. One truck in front of us. The usual custom questions from a very polite Canadian custom officer. Easy, peasy so far. The ride on the Queen E is also not a problem. Traffic travels at a normal speed (about 70) the road is smooth and flat. No hills, no mountains, no sharp curves and no pot holes. Part of the trip has

Lake Ontario on the right. Pleasant so far and enjoyable.

When we got closer to Toronto, the traffic became much heavier. The roads expand from three lanes on each side to four. The traffic did become solid and a few times slowed to almost a stop. "Here we go" we thought. Yes the traffic was bumper to bumper, but you were still traveling 70 miles an hour. It was amazing. Did not know there were that many automobiles in the world. All continuing to move like a snake through sand. I was impressed.

If you have made this trip you are aware of the beautiful clean buildings along the way. As you approach Toronto the building are taller and the architecture more original. The many, many condominium reminded me of the tall condos on the beaches of Florida. That means lots of people. Canada I believe had open borders. I will also add, they have courteous drivers. All that traffic and no road rage. Did not hear one horn beep the whole trip. Amazing.


We reached our destination in Scarborough. A huge plant and given a tour of the facility by the owner. Now hear this, the owner is a Vietnamese refugee. Escaped after the war and made his way to Canada. There he built an empire with hard work and determination. He employees 100 people and still works in the plant seven days a week.

At first we thought he was one of the Asian workers as he was working on one of the machines. I was really impressed with this slightly built fellow who barely spoke English and his business.

So now we are on the way back and it is dark. Again we anticipated long lines at the bridge and American customs. American customs! They did not disappoint. No line of trucks and just two in front of us. We had painstakingly made sure the paper work we had was adequate to make this crossing smooth. That did not happen. The custom fellow questioned the paperwork we had and made us pull over. Being new to this we were unaware of how to proceed once we were told where to park. We stopped another customs officer and asked where to go.. We were told to go into the truckers waiting room and wait, which we did.

After a short wait we were called into another room. When we went in, the customs officer simply told us to pay the toll and leave, which we quietly did. Come to find out later the paper work we had was all we needed. Now I know these fellows have a tough job and I respect them for it. But somehow I feel we were harassed. We had the proper paperwork. Not only did he pull us over but made remarks like we did not know what we were doing. He was right there, we did not, but we relied on people on our end who did. Including the customs supervi-

In spite of that it was a good trip. Toronto is a beautiful city. We could learn from them. They have surpassed us big time. And they are nice people.

working with them, he treats them like family and makes it comfortable for them to communicate with each other."


Both Community Police Officers Sikora and Billings have the same attitude towards their community. "They want to be there and it shows. They are both involved in their




