Sabres Coaching Search: And Then There Were Two

With the Florida Panthers hiring Bob Boughner as their Head Coach, that leaves Phil Housley available as a potential coach for Buffalo. The three leading candidates for the Buffalo job are reportedly Housley, an assistant coach with Stanley Cup finalist Nashville along with Rick Tocchet an assistant coach with Stanley Cup champion Pittsburgh and Todd Rearden, currently an assistant coach with the perennially contending and underachieving Washington Capitals.

Knowledgeable local sources dismiss the candidacy of Tocchet stating that the organizations newly stated commitment to character and his past gambling scandal are irreconcileable. Plus Tocchet's brief stint as a head coach with Tampa Bay did not go well with a 53-69-26 record for a 0.446 record. That leaves Housley and Reardon as the final candidates, which favors Housley the ex Sabre who is coming off a successful playoff run to the finals.

But the Pittsburgh Post Gazette reports that "word out of Buffalo" is that Tocchet and Housley are the finalists. Ron

Cook writes that "Sabres star player Jack Eichel is regarded as a horse's behind around the league. The organization wishes he were more like Edmonton's Connor McDavid and Toronto's Auston Matthews, a couple of young phenoms who get what team and stardom are all about. " Cook opines that Tocchet is strong enough to handle Eichel and that having Tocchet as a coach would be the best thing that could ever happen to Eichel.

In either case Housley is the better fit here because of the success he has had developing outstanding mobile puck mov-

ing defensemen in the music city. Buffalo's defense was the weakest in the league last season and the most essential skill missing is the ability to make quick retrievals and outlet passes to the forwards. Nashville has transitioned out star defensemen like Ryan Suter, Seth Jones and Shea Weber and hasn't missed a beat in developing an even stronger group of skilled defensemen. And Housley gets the bulk of the credit for that success.

Those were his strengths when he played and he has become a good teacher passing on his knowledge to the new generation in Nashville, including Roman Jose, Ryan Ellis, Mattias Ekhlom and the inimitable P. K. Subban.

With skilled newcomers Ryan Guhle and Victor Antipin arriving in Buffalo to upgrade the defense, Housley looks like the perfect architect to mold the new look blueline corps. We should know by the end of this week.

Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame Honors HNPYBL

At a press conference held June 1st downtown at the Key Bank Center, the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame announced its 12 member class for 2017 which included former Sabres forward Mike Peca and native Buffalo basketball player, Willie "Hutch" Jones, among others.

But amid all the pomp and circumstance for these local athletes, an announcement was made concerning its Amateur Sports Development Fund. This year, Hertel North Park will be one of seven other local organizations who will be assisted with a portion of funds directed towards fostering the pursuit of higher levels of athletic achievement. This is a first for North Buffalo Baseball and one they don't take lightly. Thanks to the work of Delaware district Council member Joel Feroleto, a strong supporter for the League, a grant was submitted to the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame and was accepted for 2017.

Then, after a beautiful Saturday in Shoshone Park last weekend, the League and president Donald Morris welcomed Dwyer Brown to Buffalo and gave the Hollywood celebrity a chance to watch local baseball and softball games. Accompanied by Buffalo Mayor Bryon Brown, Dwyer Brown was in town to sign copies of his new baseball book. His role as John Kinsella, actor Kevin Costner's father in the film Field of Dreams still reverberates today since the movie's release and helped spark an interest in a book about baseball.

In Major boys, the Nationals defeated the Reds and Giants thanks to the hitting and pitching of Collin France. Wednesday, France had four hits and got help on the mound from Justin Ball, who struck out eight and allowed just two hits. Then Saturday, France had three hits, including two doubles and had six strikeouts on the mound in the Giant victory.

The Cubs and Dodgers needed extra innings in their game last Thursday. Tied 7-7 after six, pitcher Nathaniel Gilbert continued on the mound for the Cubs in the top of the seventh. Then with teammate Ahmad Gadleyon, Gilbert stepped to the plate and delivered the game winning RBI into the dark skies under the lights. The Cubs have won seven in a row since May 20th and appear to have what it takes to clinch the division.
