Christmas in July

Just after the fourth of July holiday, exciting games are being played nightly and on the weekends in Shoshone Park, whether its in-house, travel, or tournament time in North Buffalo. Let's get you caught up on all the action before the next pitch is thrown.

Playoffs have begun in two divisions already in boys Rookie and Second Minor. Four more divisions began this past Monday night, July 10, along with a successful T-Ball Party. This coming after North Buffalo hosted a Western New York State Babe Ruth Tournament in the Park in three different age brackets, comprising of ten other teams from all over the area.

As of this writing, no team has been eliminated from the post season. Remember, every

team makes the playoffs but if they lose a second game in the competition, they get to enjoy their summer elsewhere. In Rookie boys, the Mariners defeated the Astros, 9-3 and the Orioles beat the A's, 2-0 to move into the next round of competition last Friday night. In Second Minor boys, the first place team Pirates defeated the Padres, 5-4 and the Brewers defeated the Braves in first round of their playoffs that began Monday. The Pirates lost just one game this year to the Brewers, 2-0 back on June 14, but the games have been exciting for all four teams so anything can happen for these competitive teams.

In games Saturday, the Minor Girls Reds ended their game with the Yankees on a triple play. Pitching in the bottom of

the sixth inning, the Reds', Lily Foglia caught a short fly ball near the mound and quickly fired the ball to first base Elsa Becker to tag a runner and then fired the ball to Ellie and Neala Becker at second base for the third out and a Reds victory. The win improved the teams record to 6-6 and very much in the hunt for a second championship winning season.

In Major Girls, the Dodgers defeated the Cardinals, 10-4 while the A's topped the Rockies. The Diamonds upset the Angels, 5-4 and the Shamrocks defeated the Lil Devils, 4-3 in Rookie girls. The Pirates keep rolling along in Senior girls with a 9-8 victory over the Angels on a game winning hit by Lucy Ring, knocking in teammate Al-lynn Christenson. The Bucs are now 8-0.

In the Babe Ruth tournament, three North Buffalo teams competed in 8U, 11U and 15U levels at the Park against teams from Lou Gehrig, North Tonawanda, Jamestown, Lakeview and Chautauqua. While results weren't available at this writing, visiting teams walk away from this North Buffalo Park impressed with the Leagues's play and field conditions.

1 pkg refrigerated crescent rolls

8 oz cream cheese

1/2 c mayo

1 1/2 Tbsp salsa

1/2 tsp salt (optional)

1/2 tsp Italian seasonings

1 1/2 tsp dill weed

Assorted veggies to your liking

Directions:

Set cream cheese in a small mixing bowl to soften.

Unroll crescent rolls, press onto a pizza stone to form a crust.

Pierce dough with fork.

Bake at 350* for approximately 15 minutes, until the crust is lightly browned. Set aside and

bine the softened cream cheese, the mayo, salsa, and seasonings. Mix well. Spread onto completely cooled crust.

For the toppings you can use any combo of fresh veggies you like. For example tomatoes, green pepper, shredded carrots, chopped celery, sliced black olives and green or sweet onion. Top those with shredded lettuce and shredded cheese of desired. Chill and serve.
