Meet Sabres Prospect Clifford Pu

When the Sabres drafted Cliff Pu of the Ontario Hockey Leagues London Knights in the 2016 NHL entry draft they must have liked his potential. After all Pu had put up a modest 31 points with 12 goals in his first full OHL season, hardly awe inspiring numbers.

Pu had gotten lost in a crowd of stars on London where coach Dale Hunter perennially mentors future NHL'ers where Mitch Marner, (Toronto), Christian Dvorak (Arizona) and Mathew Tkaczuk (Calgary) finished 1-2-3 in team scoring and in the top five OHL scorers with over 100 points each before graduating to the NHL in 2016-17.

With a strong playoff on London's Memorial Cup Champion team, some had Pu projected as a first round pick in 2016 but he slid into the third round where the Sabres drafted him 83rd overall at the First Niagara Center.

With the teams stars graduated to the major leagues, Pu ascended London's depth chart to become the teams leading scorer finishing eighth in the league with 86 points including 35 goals. At age 19 Pu has little to gain by returning to the OHL While he's not likely to be a scoring star in the NHL, Pu projects as a solid player on your second or third line where the Sabres really need help. Drafting Pu was a real value pick for Buffalo.

Pu's strength is anticipating the direction of play, using that anticipation to push his opponents into turning over the puck and taking those opportunities to create offensive chances for himself and his teammates. He has good hands, able to snap off crafty, creative passes or take the shot himself. He has a good head for the game, and great

vision, which is much more difficult to teach than cleaning up a shot or improving play in a specific zone. He doesn't shy away from board battles, and isn't afraid to play physically.

Pu's parents moved to Canada from China and he grew up in Toronto, where he was coached by Hall Of Famer Paul Coffey in youth hockey. Pu brings a strong commitment to defense passed on by Coffey.

And he brings something else. The London fans have taken to chanting his last name, Puuuuuuu reminiscent of how Sabres fans chanted Luuuuuue for Don Luce in the 1970's. Following some time apprenticing in Rochester, Puuuuu should become a familiar sound at the First Niagara Center.

Those were the words spoken by Ron Torgalski, the men's baseball coach for the University of Buffalo. The local baseball player and star athlete came to Shoshone Park last week to speak to North Buffalo boys about playing the game he has coached at the Collegiate level up until recently. Despite the School's decision to forgo the baseball program, Torgalski enjoys teaching others the game he has loved while growing up in North Buffalo.

Thanks to Hertel North Park board member Jim Daley, North Buffalo Baseball held their first annual Baseball and Softball camp last week in Shoshone Park. Each camper received four hours of instruction along with a hot lunch and a new t-shirt for their efforts. According to Daley, the League wishes to expand its opportunities for area youth to play Baseball or Softball beyond its commitment,

The Red Sox met the Royals, the first place team and lost, 8-7 while the Indians defeated the Rays, 1-0. Excitement is guaranteed for a good Championship.

In Rookie girls, the Diamonds have surprised everybody with a 4-2 win over the Rebels in round one. Then they defeated the Shamrocks, 10-9 in extra innings last Thursday. They play the Lil Devils next while the Shamrocks play the Angels. These ladies will have you cheering for them.

In Second Minor Boys, the Pirates faced a tough Padres team in the first round but hung on to win 5-4 on the homeruns by Joey Bueme, and Angel Rivera. The Brewers defeated the Braves in round one, setting up a Brewers/ Pirates match-up that was closer than the 10-7 final two nights later. R.J. Hadden and Nick Filice led the way for the Bucs. The Braves defeated the Padres 8-6 led by Lev Schneiderman, Easton Buchholz, Garrett Overhoff and Henry Rittling.

In Major boys, the Mets upset the Reds in their round one game, 4-2 while the Nationals defeated the Giants. The Nats moved on to face the Dodgers, winning 8-7 the next night under the lights while the Cubs gave the Mets their first loss. A strong Dodger team will make this division exciting the rest of the way.

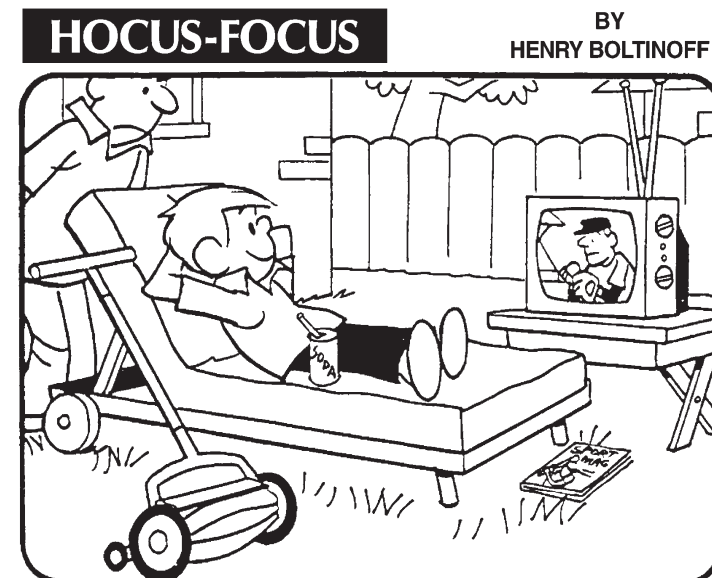

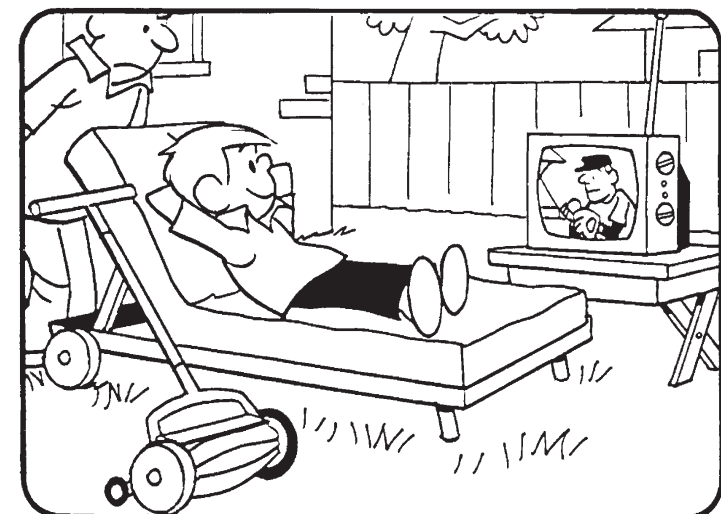

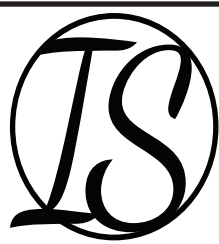
