Meet Sabres Prospect Clifford Pu

When the Sabres drafted Cliff Pu of the Ontario Hockey Leagues London Knights in the 2016 NHL entry draft they must have liked his potential. After all Pu had put up a modest 31 points with 12 goals in his first full OHL season, hardly awe inspiring numbers.

Pu had gotten lost in a crowd of stars on London where coach Dale Hunter perennially mentors future NHL'ers where Mitch Marner, (Toronto), Christian Dvorak (Arizona) and Mathew Tk-aczuk (Calgary) finished 1-2-3 in team scoring and in the top five OHL scorers with over 100 points each before graduating to the NHL in 2016-17.

With a strong playoff on London's Memorial Cup Champion team, some had Pu projected as a first round pick in 2016 but he slid into the third round where the Sabres drafted him 83rd overall at the First Niagara Center.

With the teams stars graduated to the major leagues, Pu ascended London's depth chart to become the teams leading scorer finishing eighth in the league with 86 points including 35 goals. At age 19 Pu has little to gain by returning to the OHL While he's not likely to be a scoring star in the NHL, Pu projects as a solid player on your second or third line where the Sabres really need help. Drafting Pu was a real value pick for Buffalo.

Pu's strength is anticipating the direction of play, using that anticipation to push his opponents into turning over the puck and taking those opportunities to create offensive chances for himself and his teammates. He has good hands, able to snap off crafty, creative passes or take the shot himself. He has a good head for the game, and great

vision, which is much more difficult to teach than cleaning up a shot or improving play in a specific zone. He doesn't shy away from board battles, and isn't afraid to play physically.

Pu's parents moved to Canada from China and he grew up in Toronto, where he was coached by Hall Of Famer Paul Coffey in youth hockey. Pu brings a strong commitment to defense passed on by Coffey.

And he brings something else. The London fans have taken to chanting his last name, Puuuuuuu reminiscent of how Sabres fans chanted Luuuuuce for Don Luce in the 1970's. Following some time apprenticing in Rochester, Puuuuu should become a familiar sound at the First Niagara Center.
