Hertel Receives New Trash Corrals

The first of 27 new garbage tote corrals was installed near the corner of Hertel and Commonwealth Avenues this week. These corrals will make trash disposal along the busy commercial corridor easy, while adding an artistic element. The remaining 26 corrals will be installed by the City's Department of Public Works and Streets over the next week.

"These custom-forged iron corrals are extremely attractive, as well as functional. They are a stylish solution to provid-

ing pedestrians with easy access to garbage and recycling totes. Not only do

they camouflage the totes, the corrals also keep the totes from blowing over," Mayor Brown said. "With so many new businesses on Hertel Avenue, and many existing businesses expanding and updating their facades, we wanted an eye-catching solution to offering more sidewalk totes."

The forged iron tote corrals were fabricated by Arc Iron Creations, a Buffalo company. The 27 corrals, which cost a total of \$49,410, were ordered under the city's contract with Arc Iron Creations.

United Way Day of Caring Event

More than 3,600 volunteers gathered Wednesday morning to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the United Way of Buffalo & Erie County at KeyBank Center prior to spending the day volunteering as part of the organization's annual Day of Caring volunteer event. To celebrate reaching the century milestone there was a ceremonial cake cutting and remarks by UWBEC President and CEO Michael Weiner. Day of Caring is the area's largest community service event with more than 148 organizations and labor unions participating, assisting 138 nonprofit organizations.

Reaching its own significant milestone of 25 years this year, Day of Caring pairs volunteers with local nonprofit agencies to provide extra help for projects that may include cleaning, painting, landscaping, reading to children and performing numerous other volunteer services. The extra time, talent and support allows local agencies to use their resources in service of their mission in the community. Over its 25 year history, more than 451,000 volunteer hours of service have been shared with local nonprofit agencies, saving approximately \$8.4 million.

Grid and Wegmans, Day of Caring has become an annual tradition for local organizations and labor unions, providing an opportunity for everyone to work together and contribute to local organizations that strengthen the community.

Michael Weiner commented, "From the earliest days of the United Way, the local corporate community and labor unions have been integral in helping us fulfill our mission. With 3,600 employees representing 148 companies here today, it is only fitting that we kick off the celebration of 100 years in the Western New York community at Day of Caring. I can just imagine how delighted our founders would be to see the incredible support of individuals and businesses here today to dedicate their time and talent in service to our local nonprofit community. And, we know from 25 years experience, that Day of Caring also helps to make long term connections between volunteers and nonprofit organizations that can lead to future volunteering and support."

After the kick-off rally and anniversary celebration, volunteers from companies and organizations were bused to individual project sites to work throughout the morning and then returned to the arena for lunch and entertainment. The luncheon event also included a volunteer fair where participants could learn more about nonprofit services and identify opportunities to get involved beyond Day of Caring.

In last week's edition of this paper, we printed a team photo of the Major Girls Playoff Champions, the Athletics. It was an awesome year for the green and gold. This past weekend, North Buffalo again played host in Shoshone Park to the 10th annual Buffalo Cup Tournament played every year the first weekend in August. In 2008, the nearby River Rock Baseball League and Hertel North Park sat down prior to their seasons and set up a competitive tournament against each other for "bragging rights" in City of Buffalo Leagues. By 2010, another League joined the competition from South Buffalo.

The next year, West Side Boys and Girls came on board. The winner each year would host the Tournament the following year. Boys teams were broken into four age brackets, eight years old and under, ten and under, twelve and under and fifteen and under. Girls teams were made up of twelve and under and sixteen and under.

All four Leagues have teams comprised in all age brackets. The hope is to keep baseball and softball Leagues inside the City limits strong and vital to a good way to spend a summer playing ball in neighborhood parks. River Rock plays in Riverside Park, West Side plays at LaSalle Park and South Buffalo plays their games at Okell Field off of South Park Avenue. This year's Tournament had to be played on two separate weekends due to rain on August 5th.

Many Leagues serve as the beginnings of organized ball for boys and girls in the various City High School leagues. Baseball and Softball games are great as long as the interest stays strong.






