Back to School



The majority of Buffalo schools start on Tuesday, September 5th. Please remember that it is illegal, and very dangerous, to pass a stopped school bus when the large red lights are flashing. Flashing lights indicate the bus is picking up or discharging students and many of these children need to cross the street. You must stop whether you are approaching the school bus from the front or behind, even on a divided or parkways. The first time fine for illegally passing a school bus is a \$250 to \$400 fine, 5 points on your license, and or up to 30 days in jail.

Home Schooling at the History Museum

The Buffalo History Museum introduces a new educational program throughout the months of September, October, and November. The program will take place on Mondays, from 1 - 3 pm, when the museum is usually closed to the general public. Each month examines themed topics based on the exhibits featured in the Museum.

September will feature The John R. Questions Surround Sabres in 2017-18

Three major issues will determine how successful the Buffalo Sabres will be in their quest to end a seven season playoff drought.

Leading the league with 2,813 shots against qualifies last seasons Sabres as the leagues worst defensive team. This includes all five skaters, it's not just defensemen who play defense. Every skater is a defender when the opposition has the puck. And while Buffalo's defense corps was lacking in a lot of areas, many forwards were far too concerned with their scoring totals and inattentive to their defensive responsibilities. Nashville squeaked into the playoffs with 2,472 shots against and made it to the finals. Buffalo should look at that total as the most shots a team can allow while qualifying for the playoffs and work hard to drop 400 shots against this season.

The Sabres penalty killing was among the leagues worst in 2016-17, ranking 25th at 77.6% This was largely a reflection of some penalty killers lack of commitment. More specifically there was a by too many players to sacrifice

their bodies by blocking shots. The PK must improve substantially for the Sabres to reach the playoffs. The Sabres had the leagues number one power play last season at 24.5 percent but where did it get them? They need a better balance between attack and defense. With

a big improvement on the PK the Sabres could ride their special teams into the post season.

No team hung their goalie out to dry as much as Buffalo did last year. And Robin Lehner excelled with a save percentage of .920 tied for 17th in the league. He was Buffalo's true MVP. But is Lehner the teams franchise goalie? The incoming administration led by new GM Jason Botterill signed Lehner to a one year contract, hardly a ringing endorsement of his future on Lake Erie. Lehner has a full season to prove last year wasn't a fluke.

he could throw out the first pitch to the Yankees catcher before the game started. Charlie nodded his head really fast. The doors of the elevator opened then and Debbie told Charlie and his family to wait here briefly while she had to "take care of some things." "We were going to go out to Monument Park and see the statues," said Charlie during a phone interview Sunday evening. "My dad wanted to see them."

Soon Debbie returned and led Charlie and his family to other elevators that took them to lower levels of Yankee Stadium. "It was like walking through a basement," said Charlie. "There were a lot of boxes around and was kinda dark but soon we walked through these two doors and then up some steps and we were outside and behind home plate." Charlie quickly saw the different colored uniforms and knew they were Mariners. He and his family went over to the Yankee Dugout and Joe Girardi and another Yankees coach shook his hand and and said welcome. "There were people walking all around and some of them were taking pictures of us," said Charlie. "They were taking pictures of Darth Vader and Chewbacca and C-3PO. People were booing the Mariners players and calling them the Dark Side."

Then they played the National Anthem and everyone grew quiet. "After the music, Darth Vader came over and motioned me to follow him to the mound. He was big but not mean at all." Charlie went right to the pitcher's mound of Yankee Stadium and quickly thought of all that he had learned from his coaches in North Buffalo. "I knew that I had to stick to the mechanics of throwing a good pitch. I wanted it

to be perfect. They let me stand anywhere I wanted but I wanted to be on the mound."

Charlie then heard a loud voice over a loud speaker telling fans that he was Charlie Stewart, from Buffalo, New York and this

was his first visit to Yankee Stadium. "Everyone was watching me so I took a deep breath, and fired the ball right down the middle." The ball landed just a little short of home plate but Yankee catcher Gary Sanchez was quick to catch it on a bounce and scoop it into his glove. Then Charlie raced off the hill toward Sanchez and met him halfway where the big catcher handed the ball back to Charlie.


