

Back to School



The majority of Buffalo schools start on Tuesday, September 5th. Please remember that it is illegal, and very dangerous, to pass a stopped school bus when the large red lights are

flashing. Flashing lights indicate the bus is picking up or discharging students and many of these children need to cross the street. You must stop whether you are approaching the school bus

from the front or behind, even on a divided or parkways. The first time fine for illegally passing a school bus is a \$250 to \$400 fine, 5 points on your license, and or up to 30 days in jail.

Home Schooling at the History Museum

The Buffalo History Museum introduces a new educational program throughout the months of September, October, and November. The program will take place on Mondays, from 1 - 3 pm, when the museum is usually closed to the general public. Each month examines themed topics based on the exhibits featured in the Museum.

September will feature The John R. Oishei Native American Gallery, this permanent installa-

tion traces the region's history through its first inhabitants, while focusing on the formation and evolution of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy. Highlights of the exhibit include a walk-in longhouse, a dazzling gus-toweh (headdress) display, and Seneca Orator Red Jacket's cherished peace medal. Topics to be covered include Native Americans in Western New York, Haudenosaunee Stories and Traditions, Daily Life of

the Haudenosaunee and Haudenosaunee Then and Now.

October will focus on Early American Life, Pioneer Stories in Literature, Pioneer Surveying and Maps, Pioneer Skills and Local Pioneers. This will take place in The John R. Oishei Pioneer Gallery. Pioneer life in Buffalo Creek Village transports visitors back in time and features a wall mural depicting rural life, as well as the beloved and icon-

The elevator doors closed and eight year old Charlie Stewart of North Buffalo stood with his family in Yankee Stadium, waiting to get to their seats for a Major League Baseball game, his first one ever. The Yankees were playing the Mariners, but Charlie didn't care. It was Star Wars Night in the Bronx and he couldn't wait for the game to start. He wore his Yankees cap and brought his baseball mitt, the one he used for games in Shoshone Park all summer, playing for the Blaze travel team. His father, Ryan, was the teams' assistant coach.

Suddenly, a woman holding a notebook with the

letters MLB on it, looked down at Charlie and asked him if he played baseball? Charlie looked at his family before he quickly answered "yes." Then this lady, introduced herself as Debbie Tymon and asked him another question about whether he could help the New York Yankees out that night before the game? "I got a little nervous but I looked up at my Dad and he was smiling at me," said the Second Minor Brave. "My whole family was smiling at me." His whole family included his Mother, Megan and his two sisters Maya, age 10 and Lily, age 2, who was clutching his Mom.

he could throw out the first pitch to the Yankees catcher before the game started. Charlie nodded his head really fast. The doors of the elevator opened then and Debbie told Charlie and his family to wait here briefly while she had to “take care of some things.” “We were going to go out to Monument Park and see the statues,” said Charlie during a phone interview Sunday evening. “My dad wanted to see them.”

Soon Debbie returned and led Charlie and his family to other elevators that took them to lower levels of Yankee Stadium. “It was like walking through a basement,” said Charlie. “There were a lot of boxes around and was kinda dark but soon we walked through these two doors and then up some steps and we were outside and behind home plate.” Charlie quickly saw the different colored uniforms and knew they were Mariners. He and his family went over to the Yankee Dugout and Joe Girardi and another Yankees coach shook his hand and said welcome. “There were people walking all around and some of them were taking pictures of us,” said Charlie. “They were taking pictures of Darth Vader and Chewbacca and C-3PO. People were booing the Mariners players

and calling them the Dark Side.”

Then they played the National Anthem and everyone grew quiet. “After the music, Darth Vader came over and motioned me to follow him to the mound. He was big but not mean at all.” Charlie went right to the pitcher’s mound of Yankee Stadium and quickly thought of all that he had learned from his coaches in North Buffalo. “I knew that I had to stick to the mechanics of throwing a good pitch. I wanted it to be perfect. They let me stand anywhere I wanted but I wanted to be on the mound.”

Charlie then heard a loud voice over a loud speaker telling fans that he was Charlie Stewart, from Buffalo, New York and this

was his first visit to Yankee Stadium. “Everyone was watching me so I took a deep breath, and fired the ball right down the middle.” The ball landed just a little short of home plate but Yankee catcher Gary Sanchez was quick to catch it on a bounce and scoop it into his glove. Then Charlie raced off the hill toward Sanchez and met him halfway where the big catcher handed the ball back to Charlie.

“Everyone was cheering and clapping for me. Everyone was standing and yelling my name. The Yankee third baseman yelled something to me but I couldn’t understand. Then I looked up and saw C.C. Sabathia standing right next to me and I knew it was time to go.”

Charlie and the crowd of over 42,000 fans stayed the whole game but the Yankees ended up losing in extra innings. “I didn’t care that they lost,” said Charlie. “The Yankees are winners to me.”

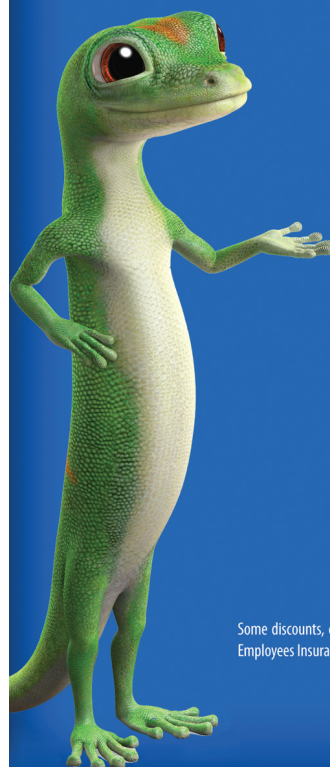

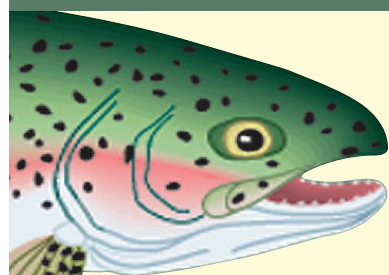
