Buffalo Sabres Playoff Potential

The new regime at One Seymour Knox Plaza brings a pedigree of playoff success. GM Jason Botterill enjoyed back to back Stanley Cup championships with the Pittsburgh Penguins in 2016 and 2017 while new coach Phil Housley is fresh off last seasons finals appearance against Botterill's Pen's as an assistant coach with the Nashville Predators. But the success off the Buffalo Sabres in 2017-18 will largely depend on the players on the ice.

The defense needed a major upgrade after allowing the most shots on goal of any team in the NHL last season. New D-Men Marco Scandella, Nathan Beaulieu, and Victor Antipin represent a significant upgrade over last seasons regulars like Cody Franson, Justin Falk and Taylor Fedun. The influx of talent has been significant enough to assign the organization's young prodigy Brendan Guhle to the development team in Rochester where he will no doubt receive a great deal of playing time to prepare him for promotion to the NHL.

The question is how much will the team improve with these new players in the lineup. The acquisition of Scandella is seen as a significant move. Scandella was the number five D-Man with the Minnesota Wild but is slotted in on the number one pair in Buffalo with Rasmus Ristolainen.

Minnesota is a good team that has made the playoffs for five consecutive seasons from 2013-2017. They won one round each in 2014 and 2015 and were eliminated in the opening round in 2013, 2016 and 2017. They are a good team that doesn't make any noise in the post season. Scandella is a good player but has been unable to break into the top four on a defense corps that is pretty good. After two consecutive first round exits, the Wild has determined that they can move forward without him. The move is a way to clear some salary cap space so the Wild can re sign pending restricted free agents Nino Niederreiter and Mikael Granlund. Scandella had four goals and nine assist for 13 pointslast season in a mostly defensive role.

Nathan Beaulieu was paired with Shea Weber on the first unit for Montreal when the 2016-17 season opened. But his season was





'A Musical Feast' Opens New Season

On Friday, October 20th at 8 pm, 'A Musical Feast', the cutting-edge presenter of traditional classical and contemporary classical music in Western New York will open its season in the group's home in the Tower Auditorium of the Burchfield Penny Art Center, located on Elmwood Avenue, on the Buffalo State Campus.

Ann Colley, a recently retired Distinguished Teaching professor of English at Buffalo State College debuts her multi-media work, A Cantata for Coleridge, based on her recent research on Samuel Taylor Coleridge's descriptions of landscape. Colley says "As a young man, this eminent early nineteenth-century British writer took rough, difficult walks, sometimes traveling more than thirty miles a day. Oppressed by personal problems as well as his addiction to opium, Coleridge found sustenance in the topography of rivers, meadows, mountains, and the skies. Often, he also hurriedly sketched line drawings to capture the contours of the landscape. My Cantata for Coleridge celebrates Coleridge's beautiful way with words as well as his sensitivity to the nuances of light and movement in the natural world. Using passages from Coleridge's notebooks, the piece combines a narrator (Anthony Chase) and a singer (Tiffany DuMouchelle) who will voice passages from the notebooks. Images of Coleridge's line drawings will be projected on a screen behind the performers".

Tiffany will also sing Edgar Varese's early work, Un grand sommeil noir, with a text by Paul Verlaine, accompanied by Ann Kissel, piano. She will also offer her interpretation of Zahra Partovi's translation of the poem Seek Water, by the 13th century mystic Rumi. Zahra Partovi also collaborated with Chris Villars to produce the short but very rare film Feldman Sings, featuring the only known example of the composer Morton Feldman, who was perhaps in some ways the touchstone of the Creative Associates, caught in the act of singing fragments from the score of his opera Neither, to illustrate points

Violinist Hannah Hurwitz will offer selections from the long-running, episodic composition Signs, Games and Messages, by the leading contemporary Hungarian composer György Kurtág. Varying widely in character, many of these miniatures have been inspired by, or dedicated to an individual, and they are often in turn thoughtful or joyful, melancholic or sad, but never outstaying their welcome.

The more traditional part of the program will feature Natasha Farny, the internationally touring virtuoso cellist who is an Associate Professor of Cello performance at the Fredonia School of Music, in transcriptions, arranged by her, of selections both from Schumann's radiant song cycle Frauenliebe und Leben, op. 42, and of Schubert's lied 'Hark, hark the Lark' from Ständchen D 889, accompanied by her Fredonia colleague, pianist Anne Kissel.






