Halloween Safety



Keep everyone safe at Halloween by following the advice from the Erie County Department of Health.

Without the right precautions, Halloween can truly become spooky and scary. Follow these tips, provided by the Erie County Department of

Health, to keep you, your family and your costumed visitors safe.

Make Your Halloween Decorations Safe: Decorations in your home and

yard can pose a risk to your family and to trick-or-treaters who come to your door. Create a well-lit path. Check the lighting for your front entryway and replace any nonworking bulbs. Remove or highlight potential tripping hazards. Wet leaves should be swept from sidewalks and steps. Restrain pets so they do not inadvertently jump on or bite a trick-or-treater. Exuberant or nervous pets may bolt out doors opened for trick-or-treat candy handouts.

Halloween Traditions Date Back Centuries

Many Halloween traditions may have originated with the ancient Celts and their priests, the druids. Other civilizations adopted and changed the ancient rituals, such as bobbing for apples or donning disguises.

“Our Halloween celebrations are the remnants of the pre-Christian Celtic celebrations,” said Fred Suppe, a Ball State history professor and an expert in Celtic folklore.

“The Celts can be traced back to 800 B.C. to what is now southern Germany and include the ancestors of the Scottish, Irish, Manx, Welsh, Cornish and Bretons. Particular motifs of modern-day Halloween such as the date and time it is celebrated, children trick-or-treating, the jack-o-lantern and bobbing for apples are related to Celtic traditions.”

When Christianity was introduced to the Celts, church leaders tried to

persuade them to abandon their pagan celebrations and adopt the Christian calendar. Because these traditions were culturally ingrained, the church provided alternative holy days such as All Saints’ Day on Nov. 1.

“The evening before All Saints’ Day became ‘All Hallows’ Day,’ then ‘Hallow’s Eve,’ with the word ‘hallow’ meaning holy or saint and ‘eve’ meaning the night before,” Suppe says. “Hallow’s Eve evolved to Halloween.”

Another origin for trick-or-treating comes from Scotland, where young men in their late teens donned disguises after the harvest.

“The Celts called them ‘guisers,’ which is where we get the word ‘geezer,” he said, “The guisers would march around a house and demand hospitality, which evolved into small children asking for treats.”

Sabres Start To Pull Out Of Early Season Funk

The Sabres finally won their first home game of the season Tuesday night with a 1-0 sleeper against the Detroit Red Wings. While some in the local media deride the Wings as a “bad” team, the fact is with their 4-4-1 .500 record Detroit had a superior record to Buffalo at 2-5-2 and .333 heading into the game.

It looked like fans were voicing their displeasure with the gloomy season so far by staying home as evidenced by an estimated 30% of the seats at First Niagara Center being empty, especially in the upper bowl. Those fans picked a good game to miss, even though the Sabres won.

The Sabres and Wings engaged in a defense first game of low entertainment value, remarkable for the fact that no shooter was able to shoot the puck past the opposing goalie. Benoit Pouliot gave Buffalo the only goal it needed by circling behind the net then sending the puck into the crease which Detroit goaltender Jimmy Howard kicked into his own net. Sabres goalie Robin Lehner was the first star stopping 29 shots for his first shut-out of the season as his save percentage rose from .894 to .913 after his nights work.

The Sabres season started to show signs of life earli-

er during Saturday's game at Boston when they roared back from a 4-1 deficit to dominate the Bruins with three goals in a ten minute stretch to tie the score 4-4 and force overtime. The Sabres played with fear-some determination in the OT period, overwhelming the Bruins and winning on Ryan O'Rielly's backhand shot. The Sabres should play with absolute desperation in every OT period to avoid shootouts as the forwards are unable to score a shootout goal and Lehner cannot make a shootout save.

The team appears to have corrected their early season tendency to make poor decisions pinching at the offensive blueline with no support from the forwards which resulted in

multiple two on one breaks. New coach Phil Housley promised offensive fireworks but in reality defense wins in the NHL along with effort and the teams recent success reflects that.

The Sabres power play is on a record setting pace and not in a good way. The power play has surrendered six shorthanded goals in ten games, on pace for 48 shorties for the season. That projected total would be more than double the NHL record for most shorthanded goals allowed in one season held by the 1984-85 Pittsburgh Penguins who gave up 22 goals while playing with a man advantage. How last seasons number one power play has been deconstructed is an example of new coach messing with success. One of the keys to last seasons top ranked powerplay was having Sam Rhinehart positioned in front of the net, screening goalies, tipping shots and gathering in rebounds. Of course opposing defenses will punish you physically for this. Rhinehart has recently returned to this role the power play has looked better but still is not producing anywhere near last years pace.

Avoid open flames. Opt for battery-operated candles or LED lights instead. Do not overload extension cords. All Dressed Up: Plan costumes that are bright and reflective.

Make sure shoes fit well and that costumes are short enough to prevent tripping, entanglement or contact with flame. Because masks can limit or block eyesight, consider non-toxic make-up and decorative hats as safer alternatives. When shopping for costumes, wigs and accessories look for and purchase flame resistant products.

Review with children how to call 9-1-1 if they ever have an emergency or become lost. Ensure they are wearing up-to-date proper identification

in case they become lost. About Those Treats: A good meal prior to parties and trick-or-treating will discourage youngsters from filling up on Halloween treats.

Consider purchasing non-food treats for those who visit your home, such as coloring books or pens and pencils.

Wait until children are home to sort and check treats. "By following this common sense recommendations, we hope all of our trick-or-treaters can have a safe and fun Halloween," said Dr. Gale Burstein, Commissioner, Erie County Department of Health. "Don't forget to have all ghosts and goblins brush their teeth well after eating their hard earned treats."
