Priest to be Honored for WWII Service

If anyone can say that he has served God and his country it is Msgr. Dino J. Lorenzetti. The 96 year old priest will be inducted to the Wall of Honor at the Buffalo & Erie County Naval & Military Park on Friday, November 10 at 10 am. The event falls almost 75 years to the day that Msgr. Lorenzetti enlisted to the United States Army during World War II.

"You don't have to take a bullet to be a hero," said John Vecchio, the Advisory Chair at the Naval Park, who decided to nominate Msgr. Lorenzetti for the honor. "There's a lot of courage just in living. What I love about Dino is the spirit if the man; his authentic enduring love for humanity, his deep unshakeable faith and his perennial enthusiasm make him a beloved priest and good friend."

Lorenzetti proudly served as Staff Sergeant of the US Army's 312th Depot Repair Squadron

Supply Unit. He enlisted on November 13, 1942, served in northern Africa and Italy before being honorably discharged on December 2, 1945. He also served as Associate Editor of the base's newsletter and yearbook. Each year, Msgr. Lorenzetti still gathers with the families of the men he served with and offers a Mass.

The Wall of Honor is a permanent tribute and remembrance to those courageous Western New York men and women in all branches of the armed forces who served and sacrificed in U.S. wars and military actions.

The Evander Kane Quandry

His two goals in the Sabres 3-1 home ice victory over the Washington Capitals on Tuesday November 7th, gave Evander Kane nine for the season in 15 games (projected to 47 goals over the full season) to rank sixth in the NHL. He has scored 31 even strength goals in his last 73 games trailing only Auston Matthews of the Toronto Maple Leafs who has 32. Kane leads the league with three shorthanded goals and gives a consistent effort every game. He works hard using his speed to be an effective forechecker, plays a physical game and can drop the gloves and take care of business if provoked.

He is an unrestricted free agent (UFA) at the end of this season. Currently being paid \$6,000,000 annually, he may command a salary of 7- \$8 million in free agency. He has been living in a hotel since arriving in Buffalo over two years ago which is rather unusual and not the sign of someone who is planting their roots in the community. He has a history of trouble that the organization is reportedly unhappy with that but he has kept his name out of the news for the past year. It's questionable whether his free agent payday will take place in Buffalo.

With a 5-8-2 record, the Sabres on ice product is in disarray. The team ranks

27th in the league standings. Their goal differential of -16 is the second from the bottom. Their power play has surrendered seven shorthanded goals while scoring seven times, essentially making it powerless. Last season this was the leagues number one unit. The new attack style from the defense touted by new coach Phil Housley has produced exactly zero goals from the defensemen.

As such, only franchise player Jack Eichel is untouchable. Only Eichel, Kane and Jason Pominville could fairly be described as playing at their potential. If Kane isn't signed for 2018-19, losing him as a free agent is not an option and he will be traded. With 14 pending free agents including eight UFA's, finding

cap space for Kane shouldn't be a problem.

A buyout of Matt Moulson whose \$5 million contract is an organizational millstone, would free up enough cap room to pay Kane who for now is essentially a lame duck. Fortunately his strong play enhances his trade value. As a legitimate top line player, Kane could return a first round pick in a trade which may be better in the long run for an organization that appears likely to be in rebuild mode for quite some time. But players with his skill and speed are a rare commodity and his synergy with Jack Eichel is undeniable.

With former GM Tim Murray gone, any bad blood over Kane's past transgressions is minimized. New GM Jason Botterill must weigh the pros and cons of keeping or trading Kane. Curiously the organization reportedly has not had discussions with him about a contract extension which for now makes it seem unlikely that he will finish the season wearing a Sabres jersey.

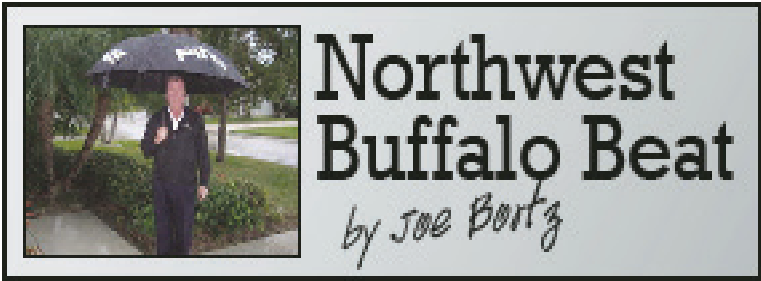

The recent accidental drowning of Officer Craig Lehner in the Niagara River stirred up some very scary childhood memories. This tragedy happened at the foot of Ferry Street. My childhood swimming hole. The street was named Ferry, as that was where the Ferry boat crossed into Canada. The foot of Ferry Street was where the Ferry would board and dispense passengers going to and from Ft. Erie. Before the Peace Bridge was built it was the only way the public could cross the river. Long ago, there were three Ferries, one docked on each side and one in the middle.

They continually rotated as it being the only means of crossing, business was good. It is understandable that with the construction of the Peace Bridge the demise of the Ferry boat was eminent. I happened to work on the last Ferry boat the last year it ran. Those familiar with the

turbulent water at the "foot", as it is called by our beloved fishermen, know how vicious and powerful the current can be. What we used to call Hell's mile, is the stretch between the Peace Bridge and the International Bridge. The flow is about 15 miles an hour with undertows, eddies and small whirlpools. We used to swim in those hauntingly cool waves and dangerous currents. If an undertow caught you, we were told to just go with it, as it will surface again. Yeah right. If you felt something pulling you underwater, you panicked and fought like hell.

The "break wall" the wall that separates the river from the Erie Canal, was nothing but large boulders with concrete poured over the middle to make a path for people to be able to walk out on it. No fence, no rails, nothing but water slapping against the sides of these huge rocks on both side. The river side was

rough and loud, the canal side was docile and calm. When the water would rise it would go over this break wall and if you happened to be out past the Peace Bridge, you had no way of getting back. What I am trying to convey here is the danger of that area at that time, and even now. We used to swim in this not so safe river without any thought of how we could end up dead. Some did. It was much too often that someone would be pulled out from anywhere along that mile stretch from bridge to bridge or further as in the case mentioned.

No need to suggest here that in order to fish, swim and hang out at the "foot" back then, you had to be able to swim at least a mile. For example, years ago, mules towed barges down the canal. The road alongside the canal was called the "tow path". Along this "tow path" homes were built and families lived there. (That has since been replaced by the 190 Highway.) Back then I dated a girl that lived in one of those homes. I mention this to explain how important it was to learn to swim at an early age. Thirty feet from your front door was over twenty

feet of water. The people in that area claimed that as soon as they felt their children were ready, they tied a rope around their waist and threw them in the canal. Did that until they were able to swim good enough to make shore on their own. Needless to say, everybody down there became excellent swimmers and never had a fear of water, deep water.

So the "foot" became my childhood hangout. Used to fish and catch Yellow Pike 'til they were too many to carry home. Swam in the River, even saved a kid's life

once pulling him ashore. Fished, had a girlfriend and even got a job on the Ferry boat just because I was always there. Went down there with who was to be my future wife to park and, hang out. Have our initials carved in a tree, if it is still there.

Now when I travel to the "foot" to visit my son who still fishes there, I actually get frightened to think I once found this to be a fun spot. If there is any place in the world more dangerous to swim then the "foot" I can't imagine where it would be. Now, I'd take a heated pool any day.

tack squadrons based in Whidbey Island, Washington.

As an aircrew survival equipmentman, Wood is responsible for maintaining and upkeeping the aircrew survival equipment.

"My job is important because I am the last person that ensures the safety of the aircrew member in case of a mishap," said Wood.

Taking off from and landing on Navy aircraft carriers, as well as supporting expeditionary land-based operations around the world, Growler crewmembers engage in electronic warfare, one of the most important components of modern

air combat, according to Navy sources.

The EA-18G Growler is the fourth major variant of the F/A-18 family of aircraft that combines the proven F/A-18F Super Hornet platform with a sophisticated electronic warfare suite, complete with advanced receivers, jamming pods and satellite communications. The electronic warfare mission involves jamming enemy radar and communications systems to render air defenses ineffective.

"Overall this command is an amazing squadron to work for," said Wood. "The people that make up this command makes me want to come to work every day and enjoy it."

As a member of one of the Navy's squadrons with the newest aircraft platforms, Wood and other VAQ 135 sailors are proud to be part of a warfighting team that readily defends America at all times.

"We're in the warfighting business, and we're here to win," said Capt. Tabb Stringer, Commander, Elec-

tronic Attack Wing, U.S. Pacific Fleet. "We operate the most advanced and capable electronic attack aircraft in the world and our sailors are the most highly trained, innovative, and critical thinking teammates I have ever worked with."

Sailors' jobs are highly varied at VAQ 135, according to Navy officials. Approximately 65 officers, 400 enlisted men and women, and 110 civilian contractors make up and keep all parts of the squadron running smoothly -- this includes everything from maintaining airframes and engines, to processing paperwork, handling weaponry, and flying the aircraft.

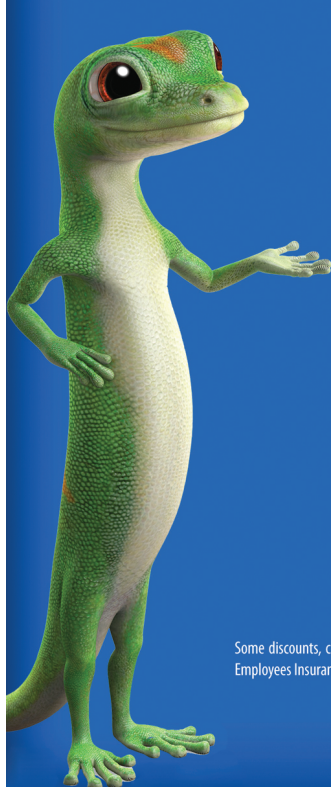
Serving in the Navy, Wood is learning about being a more responsible leader, sailor and citizen through handling numerous responsibilities.

are struggling through difficult times, they are not alone in their circumstances; their community cares," said Stuart Harper, Executive Director of the Buffalo City Mission.

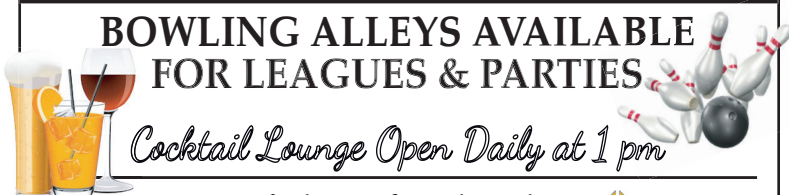
