Five Thoughts About The Sabres

1. Keep Sam Rhinehart on a line with Jack Eichel. Coach Phil Housley started the season using Rhinehart at center, his natural position, on a third line. The results were underwhelming with only five points in 17 games. In one game back with Eichel a 5-4 loss to Pittsburgh on Tuesday Nov. 15th he had one goal and two assists. In reality Rhinehart is not a top six NHL forward. He would be a third line player on any good team. He plays a good game technically but doesn't score very often and his skating speed is sub standard. As a winger his lack of high end speed is less of an issue with Eichel assuming most of the puck carrying chores and he can provide some scoring support for Eichels playmaking.

2. Eichel may have had his strongest game of the season in the loss to Pittsburgh with his Gordie Howe hattrick a goal, assist and a fight.. The goal was his first after going scoreless in eight games with only three assists. His primary assist to setup Evander Kane's goal was typical of Eichel's playmaking skills. When Pittsburgh's Ian Cole leveled Rhinehart with a legal open ice hit, Eichel immediately dropped his gloves and went after Cole. While you don't want

to see him break a finger fighting, Eichel showed a team spirit in defending his teammate which has been missing since the trade of Marcus Foligno.

3. It was good to see the Sabres offense come alive with four goals after scoring only once in five of their last eight games. But their inability to hold leads at 3-1 and 4-3 is typical especially against Pittsburgh. After taking leads, the team has a tendency to sit back and let the opposition attack, rather than continue to attack themselves in the manner that allowed them to get the lead.

The Penguins overtime winner resulted from Buffalo's poor defensive zone play. Evander Kane failed to hold Sydney Crosby on the backboards, and Eichel was caught between covering two players when Nathan Beaulieu failed to hustle and pickup the eventual goal scorer Connor Sheary. Crosby centered the puck to Sheary and the game was over.

4. Other than the first period this was a game

where the Penguins dominated the Sabres the rest of the night and held an 81-45 edge in shot attempts. The lucky bounces went Buffalo's way for once and were a primary reason the Sabres were competitive on the scoreboard.

5. The Sabres made line changes an emphasis in a recent practice, especially second period changes. When teams switch ends after the first period, your goaltender is at the far end of the ice. So when you're killing penalties or get pinned in your own end for extended periods, it's more difficult to get players to the bench to change than during the first and second periods when the bench is at your own end. The Sabres have been outscored 23-15 in second periods this sea-

Interestingly Josh Gorges commented that players need to increase the urgency with which they come to the bench. In other words, hustle when you are getting off the ice so your replacement can get out there. Really? This was a problem last year with Coach Dan Bylsma. Bylsma was fired and 50% of the roster has been replaced and this is still a problem? Maybe the players can work on this over the summer so they are ready to start the season with good changes next vear.


