Five Thoughts About The Sabres

1. Well the broom is out and Sabres GM has set about to clean his new house. Reports state the Sabres have sent word to the league that every player other than Jack Eichel is available. Shortly thereafter the team waived Matt Moulson who was assigned to the American Hockey League's Ontario Reign a farm team of the Los Angeles Kings who play in Ontario, California. He was not assigned to the Sabres farm team in Rochester because the Sabres want to develop their young players there and didn't want to use a roster spot on a veteran player.

2. The team has also set the bar high for the inevitable upcoming trade of Evander Kane. Looking at past deadline deals of Alan Ladd and Martin Hanzal, the Sabres have let it be known they consider Kane to be a better player than either example and thus expect a bigger return.

Ladd was a deadline trade in 2016 acquired by Chicago from Winnipeg along with Jay Harrison (a 3rd pair defenseman now out of hockey) and Matt Fraser (a marginal player now playing in Europe) for prospect Markko Dano, a 1st round pick and a conditional 3rd rounder.

Hanzal was a deadline deal last season going from Arizona to Minnesota in a

package including Ryan White (a marginal minor league player) and a 4th rounder for a prospect, a 1st and 2nd rounder and a conditional 4th round pick.

So the Sabres will expect a 1st round pick plus additional assets for Kane such as a prospect and/ or a 2nd or 3rd rounder. Other players could be involved in a package deal.

3. Botterill then acquired Scott Wilson from the Detroit Red Wings for a fifth round draft pick. Like Botterill, Wilson is an alumnus of the Pittsburgh Penguins 2017 Stanley Cup championship team. While he is scoreless with no points this season, he contributed three goals and six points in 20 playoff games for last year's champs.

His real value to the team is that he has the fresh face of a champion inserted into a locker room of a team with three wins in it's last 16 games. Along with the recently promoted Hudson Fasching and Evan Rodriguez back from injury, this is a 17% turnover in skaters on a team that needs to find a new direction. Many more changes are needed but these are steps in the right direction.

4. With seven wins and 24 losses in a season already in shambles lets enjoy a rare victory like Tuesday nights 4-2 win against the Colorado Avalanche. It took 28 games but Jake McCabe's second goal was the first goal by a Buffalo defenseman this season. The play was the result of some good old fashioned hustle by Buffalo's Benoit Poulliot and Hudson Fasching who were still in the zone when a clearing pass in the neutral zone was tapped back across the blue line by Johan Larsson. Both players skated hard to clear the zone and curled at the blue line just before Larsson crossed the line in pursuit of his intercepted pass. Even the slightest delay by either player would have resulted in an off sides call. Larsson gained possession in the zone resulting in McCabes goal. Hustle is a word not often associated with this year's Sabres. Was it just me or did there seem to be a noticeable increase in the effort from many players? Maybe those new players are bringing a new energy and spirit and it's infecting their teammates.

5. Jack Eichel had one goal and an assist for two points. Even though his goal was into an empty net, Eichel did play well offensively and was denied on a dramatic rush through three players to the goalmouth. It's encouraging to see him contribute offensively and his two point outing lifted him from 73rd to 57th in NHL scoring, an improvement but not exactly rarefied air for the so called generational player. Perhaps the new energy has infected him too.






