Five Thoughts About The Sabres

1. Jack Eichel's hat trick during last weeks 5-4 OT loss to the Carolina Hurricanes last Friday December 15th, was the highlight of his NHL career so far. It wasn't just that he scored three goals but consider that he had 11 shots on goal on 13 attempted shots. In today's defensive oriented NHL, blocking shots has become an essential skill as important as skating, passing and shooting. In every game shot attempts repeatedly clang off opponents shin pads like raindrops of a cars windshield. The likelihood of any player getting 11 shots through to the goaltender is seemingly impossible. Yet Jack kept driving wide trying to outflank the defenders and find that open shot lane. It was truly a transcendent effort of offensive zone brilliance. It reflected of an attitude that he was going to get the job done that night and nothing was going to stop him.

It is unfortunate that his teammates didn't chip in a bit more to help avoid another loss. It's also unfortunate that Eichel appeared to be screening goalie Chad Johnson on the OT winner by Carolina's Jacob Slavin. While his defensive game is still evolving it seems clear that with the proper mindset Eichel still has the tools to be a dominant player in the league. He has now climbed into 46th place in individual scoring with 28 points in 33

games on 11 goals and 17 assists.

2. The Sabres had some good scoring chances against the Boston Bruins at Keybank Center Tuesday night but Boston's Jake Debrusk with his eighth was the only player to put the puck past a goaltender as the Bruins won 3-0 with a pair of empty net goals. This was the fifth time the Sabres have been shutout in their last 12 games with a pair of one goal games during that streak.

Buffalo's water pistol offense has scored more than once only five times in their last 12 games. But fans erupted on social media after the game blaming Robin Lehner for being beat by a sizzling shot under the crossbar. Lehner stopped 30 of 31 shots in the game for a 0.968 save % and a 1.03 GAA but that's still not good enough for a large number of disgruntled fans.

3. Here is some perspective for you on the Carolina Hurricanes team that Buffalo couldn't handle despite Jack Eichel's three goal game. The Canes were 4-5 in December heading into Tuesday night's 8-1 drubbing by the Toronto Maple Leafs at the Air Canada Center. The Leafs had been 3-4 for December with only eight goals in their previous five games before lighting it up against a well rested Carolina team that hadn't played since Saturday. Boston ranking seventh in GAPG at 2.69 obviously presented a more difficult challenge for Buffalo's attack than Carolina which ranks 20th with a 3.12 GAPG.

4. The Bruins were a tired team having beaten the Columbus Blue Jackets 7-2 on Monday then traveling overnight to Buffalo for Tuesday's game. With those heavy legs and backup goalie Anton Khudobin in the nets Boston was ripe for an upset loss. But Buffalo has shown a penchant for making backup goalies look like Vezina Trophy winners and that trend continued with Khudobin stopping all 33 shots he faced.

5. The highlight of the week was not Eichel's hat trick though. It was Nia Hollaway's rendition of the National Anthem last Friday before the Sabres played Ottawa. Holloway is in town as a cast member of the national touring production of The Lion King. Hollaway at age 22 is the youngest member ever to play the female lead as Nala. She was cast at age 17 as a high school junior. Her singing voice would fairly be described as world class and her performance drew a thunderous applause from the crowd. This may go down as the highlight of the season.



It was allowed to be put in the stand in the house the day before. However, Santa decorated the tree when he came on Christmas Eve. That way, when the kiddies came down the stairs on Christmas morning, the room was lit with multi colored lights shinning softly upon their new gifts. It was somewhat magical. It was a major chore for poor Santa who had his hands full that night. Especially trying to find the one bulb that did not work as the whole string would not light. Ask Clark Griswold. Santa had to trim the tree, assemble the toys, and sort the distribution of toys and was lucky to get to bed before the little children were standing at the top of the stairs, waiting.

Now raising eight children is a chore enough but Christmas is so special. There must be toys and they must be evenly distributed so each child got a fair share. They ranged in age from one and a half to 14. Five boys and three girls. Thanks to Barbie and Chatty Kathy, the girls were easier, or easier to please. Games were popular such as Operation, Twister, Parcheesi, Chutes and Ladders. Just to name a few. Slot cars for the boys, plus lots of fake guns that shot ping pong balls.

Each section under the tree was sectioned off according to each child and if there were some that overlapped, they were set in between. Fortunately we had a large second parlor so there was plenty of room and it was filled wall to wall. It was quite a sight when the children came down the stairways after waiting first for the lights to be lit and the last minute fixing. Finally, it was time for the eight to come flying into this toy filled musical room. You could see the happiness on the faces as they saw the things that they asked for. Yes there were times that someone did not get the expensive gift they asked for. That soon passed as there was so much joy in the ten people there.

Ten stocking hanging on the fireplace. This was such an experience that one year, TV Channel Four sent a camera-



man to our house to video the scene for the evening news. He was there for quite a while and spent his Christmas morning at our house. Had to be good and not so good for him as he had to work.

Now you might ask how did we afford to buy toys for all these kids as it was hard enough just to feed and clothe them. Well, besides working more than one job, I did something different at Christmas. I did toy parties. Like Tupperware and the different parties that women have, they had toy parties. I became a demonstrator of toys in front of a gathering of women at a party. Here I was a shy, quiet, young father trying to raise enough money to make sure my children had a great Christmas. Playing with toys in front of a bevy of young and older mothers. The sacrifice was overwhelming. Some of the women thought I was one of the toys that they could bring home. In any case it was worth it as I did end up with a lot of great toys for under the tree.

Another one of the biggest part of Christmas was going out for dinner at Casa Da Pizza. With that many kids we seldom or never went out for dinner. So it was special for us all to be able to spend time together in a real restaurant. My kids were always well behaved so it was no problem taking them out in public. Not like what I see today.

I miss those days and am so happy that I lived through them as it was so amazing. Not may can say that. Kids are all grown and have their own grown kids. Isn't it great to have memories like these? Merry Christmas!

Designated Drivers of Buffalo has launched its DDNY App just in time for the holiday season. The app


will allow customers to order professional drivers to drive both them and their vehicle wherever they need to go.
