# **Pet Safety Tips**



#### Keep your pet safe from the harsh bitter cold.

Cold weather is once again upon us so please take every precaution in ensuring you dogs and cats are only outdoors for very short periods of time with your supervision! Other basic cold weather tips include: Keep a  $tight \, leash \, and \, never \, let \, your$ dog off the leash on snow or

ice, especially during a snowstorm. Pets frequently lose their scent on snow and ice, especially if snow is falling at a fast rate, and your pet can easily lose his sense of direction. Pets may also panic during a snowstorm and run away; many pets are lost during the winter months.

Remember to keep current identification on your pet at all times! Never leave your pet alone in a car during cold weather. A car can act as a refrigerator in the winter, holding in the cold. Your pet could literally freeze to death. Leave your pet at Continued on page six.

## Remembering **Mike Locurto**

Michael LoCurto, a lifelong Buffalo resident who represented the Delaware District on the common council from 2006 to 2015, passed away in the care of Hospice, according to his family. He was 46 years-old. He had a kidney transplant in 2009.

A graduate of P.S. #66, City Honors and the University at Buffalo, LoCurto received his master's in urban planning from U.B. in 2002.

He worked as an adjunct assistant professor and research fellow at the university and for former Assemblyman Sam Hoyt before being elected to his post with the city.

LoCurto resigned his seat in the summer of 2015 to become deputy commissioner of Environment and Planning for Erie County.

Erie County Executive Mark Poloncarz released a statement on his passing:

"I am deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Michael LoCurto. Mike served honorably and with great skill and integrity as deputy commissioner of Erie County's Department of Environment and Planning until he could no longer do so due to

his illness. An urban planner by training, Mike brought to the position the eye of a highly educated professional, but also the understanding of the public's needs due to his decade of service on the Buffalo Common Council representing the city's Delaware District.

Mike was passionate about public service and brought that passion to work every day he served in my administration. However, Mike LoCurto was more than a member of my administration, he was also a friend. While he could be very serious and cared deep-Continued on page five.

## **Five Thoughts**

The New Year sees a lot of positive trends in Buffalo sports. The Bills are in the playoffs for the first time in 18 years. Hopefully the Sabres drought won't extend that long.

1. The next one appears to be ready for an NHL career. Casey Mittledstadt led the IIHF U20 World Junior Championship in scoring with 10 points through the round robin play. He was the first player drafted by the new GM Jason Botterill, 8th overall in the 2017 entry draft. Mittlestadt has dazzled the crowds with his skill and hard work. He earned three primary assists in the showdown between USA and Canada in the outdoor game at New Era Field on December 29th. His sensational goal against Slovakia is one of the best goals ever seen at Keybank Center or anywhere. His potential at the NHL level along with his entry level contract of about \$1,000,000 is a major reason why the Sabres have declined to negotiate a new \$8,000,000 contract with Evander Kane, thus freeing up about \$7,000,000 in cap space for next season.

2. The Sabres appear to have recovered from their early season dysfunction. With a 4-4-4 record in their last 12 games the Sabres have 12 points in those games for a .500 record. Of course a .500 record in today's NHL is a sub .500 when 1/3 of those games include loser points for overtime losses. So if you're an optimist things are looking up at the Keybank Center. Or you can look at the record literally as 4-8 with eight losses in those 12 games. It's your choice.

3. Jack Eichel has been on a hot streak recently, climbing to 30th in NHL scoring leaders with 35 points in 39 games. Just a few weeks ago he was outside of the top 60 in individual scoring. Eichel was on a four game point streak with four goals and three assists going into Monday's winter classic. He began the season with only seven goals in his first 25 games but had a strong December with eight goals and 16 points in 13 games.

4. The World Junior Championship outdoor game at New Era Field was certainly a success financially with just under 45,000 in attendance. As noted above Sabres prospect Casey Mittlestadt stole the show with primary assists on all three regulation goals for Team USA. What's interesting is that USA played their backup goalie Jake Oettinger rather than starter. Speculation was USA was preparing for a playoff round rematch with Canada and wanted their backup to have the experience. If Canada had won the game and beaten the backup goalie, USA would gain a psychological edge by putting the starter in for a playoff matchup. Now they have confidence that they have two goalies who can beat Canada.

Attendance was 44, 952 more than double the previous record set in 2009 when Canada beat Sweden in the Gold Medal game in Ottawa. The crowd appeared to be evenly split between Canadian and American fans. Snow fell steadily throughout the game and ice became brittle in the cold frequently requiring extra attention including one ten minute repair session during the third period. The snow adversely affected play as Canada scored to take a 3-1 lead off a USA clearing pass that got held up in the snow.

With the constant shoveling and ice repairs, a game that normally would be over in two and one half hours took four hours to complete.

5. The USA defeated Russia 4-2 Tuesday night to earn a spot in the semi finals where they will play Sweden at 4 pm on Thursday. Canada plays the Czech Republic at 8 pm. The finals will be Friday night at 8 pm. All games are at the Keybank Center.





ly for our community, he had a great sense of humor and could put any person at ease. It is that seriousness mixed with humor that made him the great leader he was for Buffalo and Erie County.


My thoughts and deepest



Thoroughly wipe off your pet's legs and stomach when she comes in and out of the rain, snow or ice. Check her sensitive foot pads, which may be bleeding from snow or ice encrusted in them. Your pet may also pick up salt and other chemicals on her feet accidentally. These chemicals could hurt her if she swallows them while licking her feet. Check cars for cats during the winter, stray or neglected cats outdoors sometimes sleep under the hood of the car where it's warm and comfortable. If you start the motor, cats could get caught in or flung about by the fan belt, causing serious injury or death. To prevent this, bang loud-
