### Five Thoughts as the Buffalo Sabres Show Signs of Life

1. The Sabres west coast trip was the highlight of their season so far, beginning with a 3-1 win at Calgary on Monday January 22nd followed by back to back shutouts in Edmonton 5-0 Tuesday the 23rd and 4-0 against Vancouver on Thursday the 25th. Buffalo showed an ability to play strong defense surrendering only one goal and did not surrender an even strength goal on the road trip. While the streak was encouraging it is noteworthy that every team in the league had already had a three game winning streak this season, except Buffalo.

2. Jack Eichel led the way with two goals and five points against Calgary and Edmonton with 12 shots on goal before going scoreless in Vancouver with two shots. His five points led the league for the week as Eichel settled into 19th place in individual scoring after dropping to 63rd just a few weeks ago. Robin Lehner picked up both shutouts on the road trip. Eichel then dazzled in the 3 on 3 all star competition in Tampa on Saturday January 27th with three points for the Atlantic Division against the Metropolitan Division. For their outstanding play, Eichel was named the NHL's second star of the week and Lehner was named the 3rd star.

3. Unfortunately the Sabres couldn't keep up that momentum when their season resumed following the all star break. The New Jersey Devils took a 3-1 decision on Tuesday January 30th. The speedy Devils controlled the game by sending the puck deep into the Sabres zone forcing Buffalo to skate 200 feet to generate an attack. With numerous takeaways in the neutral zone the Devils counter attacks proved too much for the Sabres to han-

4. Much attention has been focused on the celebration following a Jack Eichel goal in Vancouver where Ryan O'Reilly passed up his opportunity to exchange a high five with him. Talk has ensued of an apparent rift between the two teammates. O'Reilly was brought here and made captain to become a centerpiece of the Sabres rebuild. He became the highest paid player in franchise history. He frequently laments that his play is substandard. His captaincy is tainted by the underachieving team he represents.

Eichel is maturing (remember that he's only 21 years old) and his recent strong play has established him as the team leader. Some are speculating that this transition of leadership to Eichel is not going well for O'Reilly. While he has been a good player for Buffalo, O'Reilly has fallen short of expectations and he is certainly overpaid at \$7.5 million. His salary makes it virtually impossible to trade him unless the Sabres are willing to pay a portion of his salary for a new team. Locker room unity is an overrated quality in professional sports. These players are professionals and many championship teams have had star players who did get along with each other.

5. Kyle Okposo has found his game. Since being placed on a line with Jack Eichel, Okposo has scored ten points in his last seven games and has 18 points in his last 21 games. Okposo said that Eichel is "turning into the player that he is and I know how bad he wants to be a dynamic player and to be a superstar in this league and he's worked extremely hard at the defensive aspects of his game, but he demands a lot and I think at a young age, that's a pretty special

What was it like growing up during world war

Even though this country never had to experience living through daily or even occasional bombing by an enemy, we did do some suffering during WWII. Our "suffering" small; compared was to what was lost to the people in European and Asian countries. However, I do recall living during those four years here in America, and the things we learned to do without. I was a young boy, so it was not uncommon to think this is the way it is and will be.

We start out with the fact that my two eldest brothers were both in the service during the war. Air Force and Navy. The eldest serving in Europe in a B-24 bomber and the other on a ship in the Atlantic. Never to know if we would ever see them again. Most young men were in the service, either as a volunteer or drafted. It was customary, to hang little banners in your window with blue stars, each star indicating how many members of the

family were serving in the war effort. Our window banner had two stars and some homes had as many as five. If the blue star changed to gold, that meant the person serving was killed in action. Sad but true and there were too many of those gold star houses, just in our neighborhood. That was the ultimate sacrifice. Hence the term gold star parents. Even if you did not want to join the service you still had to go. Men were subject to the draft and were classified. 1A and as long as you were healthy, your number was up. My dad was 45 years old and had eight kids. He reached 1A when the war ended. He would have had to go, it was that bad.

Nothing could be worst than losing a son or husband or father but there are other things I remember. We had some heavy-duty defense factories in and around Buffalo. Bell Aero systems Elmwood, (where Home Depot is located) and Curtiss Wright at Kenmore and Ontario. Plus, many more too nu-

merous to mention. So, with these huge factories, Buffalo would be a strategic target to bomb. So, we had constant air raid drills.

The air raid siren would blast, I am sure you have heard them in the movies, and we had to go through the ritual. Daytime into the basements, nighttime all lights must be turned off for complete darkness. Volunteer air raid wardens walked the streets, making sure all abided by the rules. My dad was told by one of these wardens to put out his cigarette as an enemy plane can spot it thousands of feet into the air. Guess he was just doing his job.

Rationing became a part of life those four years. Food stamps did not mean free food. It meant you had to present a ration food stamp just to buy meats and some canned foods. And you were limited. Cigarettes were like gold, hard to come by. Coffee was rationed, and you were only allowed so much a week. Gas of course was rationed, and you could only get enough to get you to work and back. If this was the case, you had a "A" sticker on your windshield. You were important to the war effort. Speaking of work, women were no longer housewives. The factories were manned by women as the men were serving overseas. Yes, women made the planes and tanks and bullets used by the men in the war effort. No demonstrations, just doing a great job helping

to increase the day their men would return home. Everyone did their part. If it meant doing without, we did it. Everyone went the extra mile.

Scrap metal drives were held to recycle and use to build weapons. School playgrounds were used to bring whatever scrap metal you could find. I recall my school, School 18 on Hampshire, with a huge pile of metal piled 20 feet high in the yard. If you found a piece of any kind of metal, you brought it to the pile. Every so often the government would come and pick it up. Part of our contribution to the war effort. Sometimes there were even old cars in the pile. Which by the way they did not make during the war. The automobile factories now turned to making jeeps, trucks and tanks. No cars were manufactured 1942-1945.

I owned a 1941 Chevy and a 1946 Ford. Guess you can say a before and

No one came onto our shores. And it is with fond memories the day the war ended. VJ Day! Everyone was out in the streets celebrating. The joy was overwhelming. Knowing my brothers were coming home. Knowing we could return to normal life with our homes still intact. Knowing the sacrifices, we all made during those years, it bothers me to see the flag, a symbol of what we fought for, in any way, dis-honored.

My hope is that the protests have ended. God Bless America!
