Chamber Orchestra To Perform Music From Aloft



The Forgotter NHL All Star Game, Buffalo NY 1959

In hockey history, February 17th 1959 an NHL All-Star Game was played to benefit Bill Dobbyn, a highly-regarded 23-year-old NHL Rangers prospect defenseman who was getting experience with the Rangers farm team, the AHL Buffalo Bisons. Dobbyn had lost an eye after he was accidentally clipped by a stick during an American Hockey League game. 9,368 fans packed a sold-out Memorial Auditorium to see the NHL's finest play their hometown Herd.

Future NHL Hall-of-Famers; Johnny Bower, Glen Hall, Pierre Pilote, Bill Gadsby, Ted Lindsay, Johnny Bucyk, Bobby Hull, Donnie Marshall, Brian Cullen, Forbes Kennedy and Ian Cushenan were just some of the bright stars on the NHL squad that night.

They were coached by the unlikely duo of New York Rangers head coach Phil Watson and Black Hawks bench boss Rudy Pilous. Sworn enemies since their junior amateur coaching days, they managed to put aside their differences for this charity event. The Bisons were managed by Fred Hunt and Frank Eddolls.

Master of Ceremonies Ralph Hubbell started the night off with an emotional introduction of Bill Dobbyn. The roof was almost blown off the top of the Aud when the crowd rocked the building with a two-minute standing ovation. "It was a thrill to meet all those players." Dobbyn said. "I remember them all shaking hands with me, telling me I had a bright future." Dobbyn received various cash awards and gifts from a host of different charities. The event raised more

than \$25,000 for Dobbyn to start his life over with, though he would eventually lace up his skates again a few years later and played with several teams in various minor leagues. He finally retired after playing with the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League in 1968.

As for the game, "Terrible Ted" Lindsay scored twice to lead the All-Stars to a 6-2 win. Bill Dineen bagged the two Bisons goals during the third period to make the score a little more respectable. Dobbyn said afterward "I shall be grateful to them. Words simply cannot express my gratitude or that of my parents."



Now that, remember was November 2017. January 2018 they both came back to me "no such address. return to sender". I called him to verify the address and it was in his words, 100%, correct. So, I mailed them back. Finally, he receives them. Christmas 2017, I send him a card, with money in it no less. It comes back to me, AGAIN, no such address at the end January 2018. I take it to the Post Office and tell the teller that this address is correct. He blacks out the printed stuff on the envelope, puts another stamp on it (no I did not pay for the new stamp) and mails

When I asked what was wrong, the mailman had no idea. Joe gets his Christmas card finally. Now wait this is not the end...I mail a card to a friend on Hertel Avenue and 2 weeks later it comes back to ME. No reason just comes back with the rest of my mail. So, I mail it again...finally she gets it. So, when I inquired about all this, I was told that they were probably computer errors...Oh, well...looks like we must live with this kind of @\$#*&^%. Joyce,

Did a little research with the Post Office and if you think there is something wrong, you are right. No one would admit to deliberately holding the mail but not treating it with the respect it deserves.

There are two things. One, congress passed some law that says mail does not have to be delivered in a timely manner. Whatever it was, and I did not go into it with the carrier, they do not have to step it up to make sure it is done properly and they sure are abiding. It surprises me that there is not more said about it in the news. Probably because most people don't mail letters anymore. We all use email whenever possible. The carrier's response was "if you do not like it contact your congressman".

Second, I received a birthday card two weeks after it was sent out. In Joyce Gugino's and my case, cards are addressed by hand. Another problem with the Post Office. 



party has increased in popularity, drawing as many as 70 people. The Parkinson's community is welcomed to attend for free along with family and friends.

Parkinson's disease is a movement disorder that makes some of the most common and essential physical activities difficult. Winter's cold temperatures along with the obstacles of snow and ice make it a very difficult time for Parkinsonians to get out and to socialize. The disease also steals the opportunity to partake in some long-enjoyed pastimes, like ice skating. Buffalo's ice bikes give this population and their families

a safe means for accessing the rink and for relishing in one of the joys of winter at one of Buffalo's most popular locations.

The Parkinson's Foundation, WNY's executive director, Chris Jamele, says there is a great deal of excitement surrounding the evening. "People are not only anxious to get out on the ice, but they are thrilled to get a chance to try the ice bikes. It becomes an emotional experience for some families as they get the whole family together for a skate again." Bicycling is an activity that has proven to be very beneficial for battling Parkinson's symptoms, so the combined effect

of exercise and socialization is wonderful for anyone who has received a diagnosis. As the ice bikes do not tip over, they are the perfect vehicle for many in this audience. "The ice bikes may not be for everyone, but we have had people arrive in wheelchairs who get on a bike and take off across the ice. It's amazing," Jamele added.

Refreshments will be served in the warming hut on site. Access to the ice, skate rentals and the ice bikes will all be free for the Parkinson's community, all of whom are welcome to come out and enjoy this very special evening. Reservations are not required.


