Kane Trade Returns Underwhelming

n the aftermath of the long awaited and anticipated trade of Evander Kane fans and local media are left scratching their heads over the meager return. The initial reports indicated that the San Jose Sharks were sending a first round pick, fourth rounder and a prospect. As the details emerged later, it became clear that the first rounder is actually a second round pick in next years' draft which only becomes a first rounder if Kane signs with San Jose for next season or if the Sharks win the Stanley Cup this season.

Neither of these scenarios are likely as Kane's stated desire is to sign with his hometown Vancouver Canucks for next season and San Jose is not even a lock to make the playoffs. The Sabres also acquired a fourth round pick in 2019. These picks are not likely to produce an NHL prospect. In fact there is only an 18.8% chance a player chosen in that spot plays 100 NHL games.

The returns for Kane are well below the expected return including a real guaranteed first round pick plus other pieces. General Manager Jason Botterill has taken some criticism for getting fleeced but the real culprit here is former GM Tim Murray. Murray took a chance acquiring the talented Kane

who had a questionable history as a valuable teammate and further damaged his value here with several off ice incidents. San Jose made the only offer so Botterill had little choice. He could either trade Kane to the Sharks or lose him to free agency.

The Sabres were not interested in signing Kane to a new contract stating that Kane's salary demands would not fit under the salary cap. Botterill denied that ownership has no say in the decision to move Kane out.

But it has been reported around the league that ownership lost interest in Kane after his Chippewa Street antics during the 2016 NHL draft in Buffalo.

Clearly Kane's reputation took away a substantial amount of his hockey value in this trade. Other players on expiring contracts (rental players) like Paul Stastnty and Rick Nash were traded and returned packages including first round picks and multiple pieces including NHL roster players, picks and prospects.

The Sabres also acquired forward Dan O'Regan who has been a good minor league player for the Sharks AHL farm team with 30 goals and 83 points in 93 games played over the last two seasons. O'Regan has one goal and five points in 22 NHL games with San Jose. O'Regan is a former Boston University teammate of Jack Eichel.

The attitude of people today really has changed since I was a young man. Maybe the fact that I am now older has made me see the world differently. Maybe it has always been this way, hard to tell. I know back in the day we were taught to treat our elders with the utmost respect. It was not an option but a must. Almost never did you enter the room containing your grandparents, aunts and uncles or just friends without acknowledging their presence and saying hello. As I mentioned, his wife and he are still pretty much independent. Recently, they went shopping together. His wife, who has trouble walking, uses one of those little scooters provided to help her to be more mobile. At this location the ones in the store were all taken. My neighbor spotted one across the way in the parking lot. So, he hurried to try to snatch it before someone else got there first. As he crossed the street, I want to say that 95% of the people give the pedestrian the right of way, a man in a convertible almost ran him over. As the car passed in front of him he makes a simple remark "you couldn't wait"? Keep in mind that my neighbor is almost 90. This fellow screeches his brakes, gets out of the car and confronts my friend. In his face he says, "You're not in the crosswalk, I do not have to stop". My friend was shaken. Wonder if he would have reacted the same way with a much younger man.

The other thing that bothers me is the handicapped parking abuse. My wife has problems walking so we have a handicap sticker. If she is not with me I never use it. Even when she is I will leave the handicap area clear if there is a spot nearby. Someone who is more disabled may need it. What does bother me is non-handicapped vehicles parked in these areas. It is not really enforced, and \$250 fine is not enough. If they are full, and usually here in Florida most are, I drop my wife at the door and find a spot. Sometimes a long way from the entrance. What happens when both are handicapped and some bozo is illegally parked? Must be there and done that and most of the younger people just do not realize or do not care.

There is no disrespect with showing respect. Respect, "A feeling of deep admiration for someone or something elicited by their abilities, qualities, or achievements." Growing old is an achievement. Show your respect by just saying "hello".
