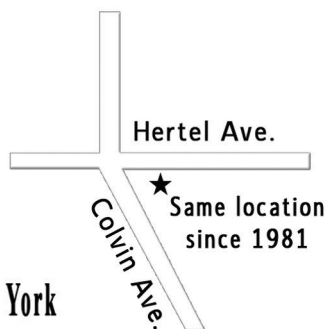

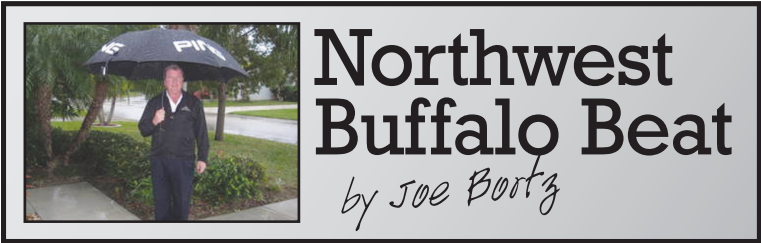

How The Rocket Started: Part Two

Last week in the Buffalo Rocket we kind of went into how the weekly newspaper began as a single page flyer. Hope to continue each week with the progress it made through the last 49 years as we celebrate our 50th coming up. If you missed last week it is on the web under Buffalo Rocket.

What began as a flyer to advertise my printing business on obscure Tacoma Avenue soon become a monthly with more and more advertisers jumping on board. My only press was a 10x14 multigraph and that was the largest size I could print. Even went to two sides and there still wasn't enough space. Eventually I had to have it printed elsewhere on a 11x17 sheet two sides. With the increase in circulation and the popularity it was receiving it became an eight-page tabloid. Not just a flyer but a full-fledged newspaper with pictures and articles. Now without any knowledge of publications, or the newspaper business, my question was what we fill an eight pages tabloid with.

The answer was given to me by a former employee of the Amherst Bee, Paul Beers. Fill it with pictures, he said, whatever size you need to fill the space. And that we did. In the beginning I took all the pictures in black and white. Shoshone football and baseball, events on the Avenue and just snapshots. I still have most of those photographs saved but with moving a few times and all the years, they are in no order.

Having no skills at writ-

ing, photography, printing, or business I had to hire people to help me in my quest. George Campos took all the photos in the early 70's and soon had his own photography business, Campos Photography. Art Hurlson was an older man who ran the counter. Many thought he was the owner and I was the employee as he was much more mature acting than I was. Vicky Jenkins was hired as my right-hand person to sell and write. She was followed by Georgia Mullen and Sharon Carr in later years and were even called "editors". With people now qualified to fill the inside pages with interesting news and photos of the area, that freed me to go and sell ads and acquire information for the articles. Really got to meet the merchants, politicians, and residents who made up the neighborhood.

Many of the merchants in the area and on Hertel back in the 70s were Jewish. Great people to work with and willing to help an aspiring publisher. I recall meeting Louis Bunis, the founder of the Sample shop on Hertel. Distinguished looking, well dressed and soft-spoken man. He was told by his advertising man at the time, Bill Melrod that I was publishing a weekly newspaper in the area. He patted the top of my head as I was sitting down and said. "Good luck young man, you will need it." That I did, luck and lots of hard work and long hours. Mr. Bunis, his wonderful wife and his two boys Maer and David were

the staples of the area. Being a large retailer, they mostly advertised in the News. Occasionally they did shoot me a small ad.

Joe Sunshine and his two boys Mel and Seymore has Sunshine's Market on Hertel and Parkside. They were my early anchor ad. Took the full back page every week. Oscar Smuckler, Jill Alt, Carl Feinstein were my every week attorney ads. Ben Glaser automotive on Hertel and Commonwealth. Bill Barr, optometrist. Dr. Fischman, foot doctor, Mastman's deli on Hertel and Colvin. Just to name a few. And I thank them for having faith in me. Got my feet wet so to speak with these exceptional business people.

Next week: The transition era. The Italian-Americans move in.

Social Security Matters

Ask Rusty – Should my wife wait until age 66 to claim benefits?

Dear Rusty: I will be at my full retirement age of 66 in June. I now work part time and plan to continue for the foreseeable future. My wife will be 63 in June. She now works full time but plans to shift to part time in the near future. I prefer to delay applying for Social Security as long as possible. Should my wife wait until she is 66 to claim her benefits? Signed: Planning Ahead

Dear Planning: Whether or not your

wife should wait until age 66 depends on a lot of factors, including how healthy she is, what her family longevity history is, and if she needs the money sooner. If she takes her Social Security at age 63, she'll get 20.9% less than she would get at her full retirement age, or "FRA", which for her is 66 years plus 2 months. And if she claims her benefits early and continues to work, she'll also be subject to Social Security's "earnings limit" (\$17,040 for 2018) which, if she exceeds it, will cause Social Security to withhold future

benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit that she earns (that limit goes away when she reaches her FRA). The earnings limit is something that you do not need to worry about because you are nearing your FRA; the limit goes way up (to \$45,360 for 2018) in the year you reach your full retirement age and goes away completely once you've attained it.

If you plan to delay applying for your own benefits, you may already know that after June you will start accumulating "delayed retirement credits" at a rate of 2/3rds of 1% per month you delay (8% per year). Age 70 is when you'll reach the maximum benefit available to you, but you can actually apply at any time after your FRA and get all the delayed retirement credits you've earn up to that point.
