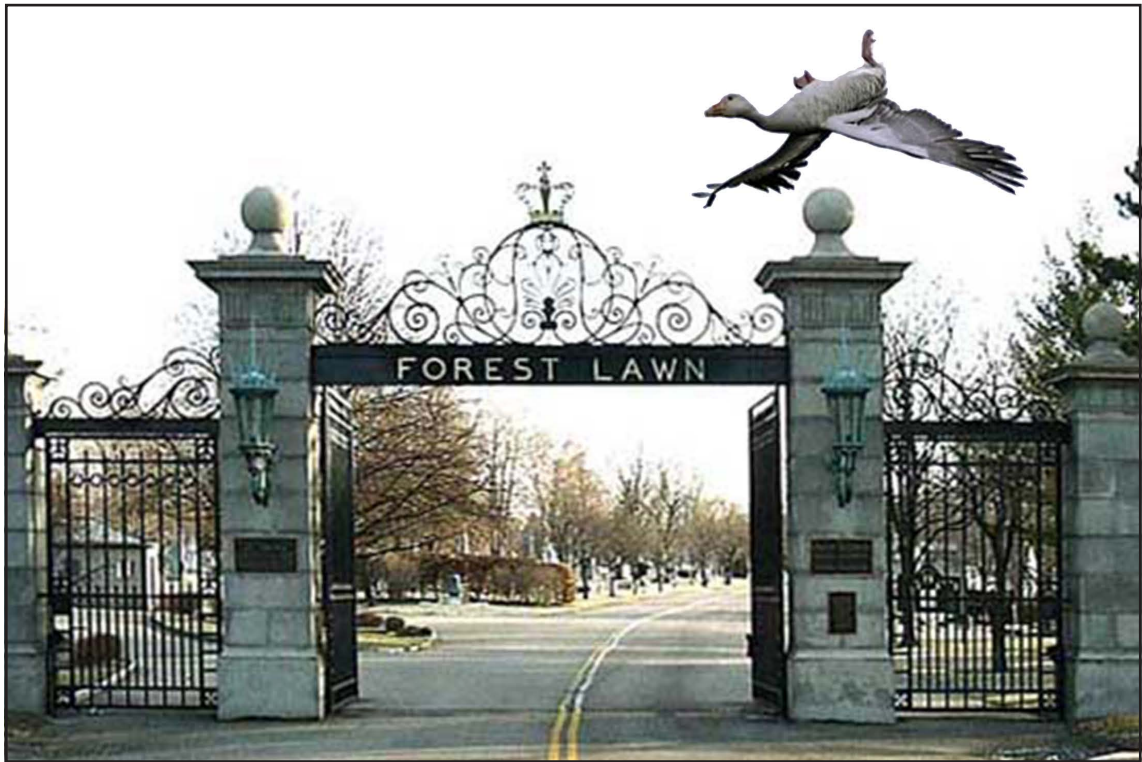


# What The...?

## Ice Boom To Be Opened After April 1st



The latest ice boom opening was on 3 May 1971. Due to a relatively ice free winter, last year's boom opening began on 6 March.

Based on the present heavy ice cover remaining on eastern Lake Erie, removal of the Lake Erie-Niagara River ice boom has not started. The International Joint Com-

mission's International Niagara Board of Control has determined that the Lake Erie-Niagara River ice boom will not likely be open before April 1st.

Representatives for

the International Niagara Board of Control will continue to monitor the ice cover closely over the coming days, as warmer weather is in the forecast.

Imagery and ice measurements from March 25 showed that the eastern basin of Lake Erie, the portion of the lake east of a line between Long Point, Ontario and Erie, Pennsylvania, covered an area of about 976 square miles (2,527 square kilometres) of ice.

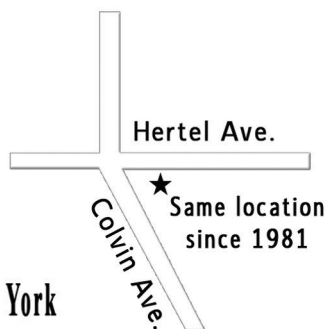

## Five Thoughts About The Buffalo Sabres

1. The Sabres signed Casey Mittlestadt to a three year entry level contract. Mittlestadt was the teams first round pick in 2017 drafted eighth overall and is hailed as the young speedy skilled forward the Sabres need to add scoring for the NHL's lowest scoring team. He was the MVP for team USA during the 2018 World Junior Championships held here where his offensive talents were on display with several spectacular goals. Mittlestadt leaves the University of Minnesota where the freshman tallied 11 goals and 30 points in 34 games.

Meanwhile the Boston Bruins signed Ryan Donato from Harvard, their second round pick and 56th overall in 2014. Donato played three seasons at Harvard and scored 26 goals in 29 games this season. He scored three points in his first game as a Bruin. The point is that the Sabres aren't the only team adding players to improve their team. In order to climb the standings the Sabres need to add three players like Mittlestadt who can score at the NHL level.

2. If Mittlestadt eventually fulfills his potential as a scoring center that would

move Ryan O'Reilly to the third line. For now, Jordan Nolan would be the player most likely to be scratched from the lineup to make room.

3. Jack Eichel scored two goals against Toronto on Monday night to reach 24 for the season, a new career high. Meanwhile Connor MacDavid had 24 goals in a 27 game stretch to reach 100 points on the season for the second time in two years.

4. Old friend Thomas Vanek scored three goals for Columbus Tuesday night. Since being traded from Vancouver, he has played 14 games with the Blue Jackets scoring seven goals and adding six assists for 13 points and a plus 12. On the season

he has 24 goals and 30 assists for 54 points. In spite of being a slow player in a speed based league, Vanek continues to play at a high level and score goals. He just has the knack for being around the net and putting the puck in. Vanek would have been a better fit here than Jason Pominville whose career appears to be at an end. Playing on a line with Jack Eichel it's not hard to imagine a 30+ goal outing from Vanek in Buffalo.

5. Former Sabre Evander Kane has been hotter than dog's breath since being traded to San Jose. In 14 games, he has scored nine goals with five assists for 14 points and a plus eight. Kane is an unrestricted free agent at the end of this season. His expressed desire is to play for his hometown Vancouver Canucks in 2019-20. But if he carries this type of production into the playoffs the Sharks should be very much interested in retaining his services. The Sabres will receive a first round pick if Kane stays in San Jose next season, they get a second rounder.

# Northwest Buffalo Beat

## How The Rocket Started: Part Three

This is the third in a series of articles on how the Buffalo Rocket came into existence almost 50 years ago. What began as a single sheet flyer in 1969 became a strong weekly in North Buffalo and expanded into the West Side and Riverside. Previous columns can be found on the Buffalo Rocket website previous issues.

So now as we enter the 70's and have become a tabloid newspaper with at least eight pages to fill, it is time to go out and beat the bushes. One of the first endeavors was to meet and greet the business people and the politicians. Like I mentioned in a previous statement, many of the area merchants were Jewish as North Park, as it was known then. Before the 50's and 60's the demographics in Buffalo was, South Buffalo, Irish descendants. East Buffalo, Polish-German descendants, West Side, Italian descendants, William Street and the upper East Side was Afro-American and of course North Park was mostly Jewish and where most synagogues were located.

But this was changing as more and more of the Jewish population moved out to Amherst, the Italian-Americans from the West Side moved into North Park or North Buffalo. The transition was beginning and so was the Rocket. Being a product of the West Side, (mother was Italian) North Buffalo was a whole new ballpark to me. I got to know most of the merchants personally as I went door to door to sell advertisement for the paper and got to know so many good people. Pounded the pavement at least part of every day.

Hertel was the Main business strip but was lacking an active Business Association, so I resurrected the one that had not met in many years. Mike Molfese from the Sample shop became the first President. Good choice as he was articulate, well dressed, and part of the largest retail merchant on the strip. It was a needed organization and is still active. I later became the Association's president for six years. Also founded the North Buffalo Kiwanis club. My son, Dennis was instrumental in the forming of the North Buffalo Jaycees. Became a board member of the Delaware YMCA and the North Buffalo Community Center. Worked with such stalwarts in the community as Bob Ryan and his wife Jeanne, Phyllis Rodgers, Jo Shamrock, Ed Heins, too many to mention, people who helped build the area into what it is now.

How about the politicians? Since it had become the newspaper of North Buffalo it also had a certain political clout. The Councilman at the time was Bill Buyers, a Republican and in the previous election had defeated his opponent by a three to one margin. One day a young fellow, who was a star basketball player at Canisius College, came into my office all excited. He had just been nominated to run on the democratic ticket against Bill Buyers. His name was Anthony Masiello. I wished him well but knew he had a snowballs chance in hell of beating Buyers, at the time. I say at the time as Bill Buyer proceeded to change affiliations and then campaigned for Tony against the Republican candidate, a Funeral Di-

rector from Riverside, Don Siwek. Back then it was a nice clean race, no name calling, nothing negative and turned out to be a very close race. Like maybe 100 votes. Tony won, and the rest is history. He eventually became Mayor of Buf-falo.

A further example of the change in the neighborhood. The councilmen to follow him, Al Coppola, Vince LoVallo, Mark Coppola, LoCurto, Feroletto. Need further proof of the transition? In the area, Sammy's Italian market. Passanisi's market, Tom Passanisi and his family. Caruso's, Mr. Tony's, Barone Furniture, Martino's Appliances, Perello foot doctor. Joe Frandina, Sam Farina, Tony Leone, CPA, Perna funeral home and of course further proof, the Italian Festival came from the West Side to find a home on Hertel Avenue for many years. Hertel became "Little Italy"!

So, what was foreign territory when I first came to North Buffalo soon became home to me as many of my West Side friends were now neighbors. And now I had hundreds of new “friends”. It was fun.

Next week the 80's. Jimmy Griffin, West Side Times, expansion to 24 pages. Life was good.

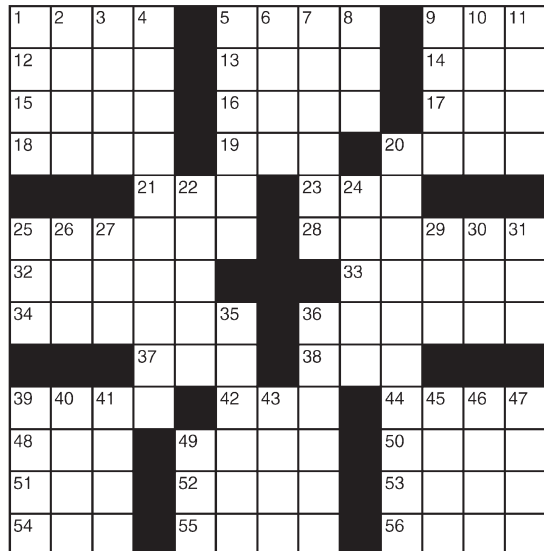

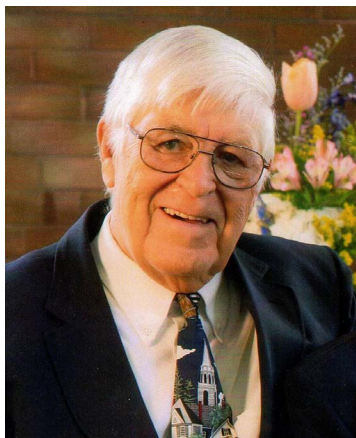

der of Approval governing operation of the ice boom requires that all floating sections of the boom be opened by the first day of April, unless there is more than 250 square miles (650 square kilometres) of ice on eastern Lake Erie. Other factors such as the quality of ice, ice build-up in the river above/below the Falls, in the lower Niagara River or prediction of un-

favorable weather are also considered.

Daily ice coverage analysis, satellite imagery, along with reconnaissance flights as necessary, will be used to monitor ice conditions, to determine when boom opening should commence.

A media advisory will be issued to inform the public when this year's boom opening begins.
