Five Thoughts About The Buffalo Sabres

1. Sam Rhinehart's career was shaping up as a major disappointment. The 2014 number two overall pick had put up some decent numbers in his past two seasons but had almost completely vanished from the score sheet throughout the first half of this season scoring only five goals in the first 38 games.

This slump was the result of several factors. First, Rhinehart was switched to center by coach Phil Houslev. He had been drafted as a center but with below average foot speed he was more suited to play on the wing in the NHL

Housley put Rhinehart back on the wing in mid November but still went scoreless for 16 straight games with only a single assist. He had become a perimeter player and was rarely seen in front of the net where his forte had been screening goalies and scoring on deflections and rebounds.

So Rhinehart decided to get back to his net front game and the results have been dramatic. Starting with a goal in the new year's game against the New York Rangers, he has played 41 games and scoring 15 goals and adding 22 assists for 37 points. His scoring has come without having Jack Eichel at center, dispelling the belief that he could only perform with Jack on his line.

2. The Sabres recall Alex Nylander from Rochester. For most of his professional career, the highly touted prospect has looked lost at the AHL level. In 2016-17 he scored only 10 goals and 28 points with a whopping

-24. For this season he has played 48 games with seven goals and 19 assists but has eight points in his last eight games with two goals and six assists. Of note is his +2 rating up from his terrible – 24 last season.

While Nylander had 75 points in 57 junior games, at age 18 he was not ready for professional hockey and struggled In the AHL for almost two full seasons. Over the last month his play for Rochester has improved and the call up gives him a chance to show whether he is ready to play at the NHL pace. If not, another season or so in the American league will give him more time to develop his game and raise his value as an NHL prospect.

3. With the Sabres on target to finish in last place in the NHL for the third time in five seasons. Fans by the thousands stay away from the games and can't even give away their tickets as evidenced by swathes of empty seats. There is pressure on the organization to become a

playoff calibre team next season. The Colorado Avalanche finished in last place in 2016-17 with a worse record than Buffalo and one season later are contending for a playoff spot.

4. The Sabres need to make an impact in the 2018 entry draft. If they land the number one pick they will no doubt select franchise potential defenseman Rasmus Dahlin. If they fail to land that top pick they simply must acquire a player who can make an impact at the NHL level. This team needs an infusion of talent. They need to turnover at least half of the roster of a team that looks uninspired on most nights. It will be near impossible to trade away most of these players who because of their poor play have little to no trade value. The best way to improve this team is by drafting and developing young players who can dislodge incumbents from the roster. Brendan Guhle, Casey Nelson and Casey Mittlestadt represent the vanguard of this wave.

5. former Sabre Christian Ehroff retired from professional hockey after playing for Germany's silver medal winning team in the 2018 Olympics. The Sabres still owe him \$8.57 million and are paying him \$857,143 per year until 2018. Fortunately this buyout does not count against their salary cap.

How The Buffalo Rocket Began: Part Four

This is the fourth in a series of articles on how the Buffalo Rocket came into existence almost 50 years ago. What began as a single sheet flyer in 1969

became a strong weekly in North Buffalo and expanded into the West Side and Riverside. Previous articles could be found on our Buffalo Rocket website.

As our little single page advertising flyer became a full fledge tabloid over the years, it was accepted as a legitimate newspaper, and the popularity grew. The purchase of the West Side Times in 1980 and the demise of the Courier Express in 1982 added to the strength of weekly publications in Buffalo. Many columnists from the Courier joined the already existing writers found on the pages of the Rocket. We had Brian Meyers, Clip Smith, Brian Blessing and many contributing columnists. The Rocket was expanded to 24 pages with 15,000 circulations. The West Side Times was up to 10,000 circulations. Pretty strong combined 25,000, distributed door to door by a professional delivery service, City News Distributors.

As I mentioned earlier my children were the first delivery service. As the paper grew we established routes and had to hire dozens of young people and some adults to do the

door to door circulating. We had many families that passed the delivery routes down to their younger siblings. We had the families, Shamrocks, Ostrowski. Mattars, Zengers to mention a few who had multiple members as paperboys/ girls. Most were great kids to work with and I looked forward to Thursday afternoons when they lined up at the door to get paid, cash. Got to know them all and had fun kidding with them. That was in the 70's as with the purchase of the West Side Times came the professional delivery service. Ed Jetter, previous publisher of the WST, preferred to not deal with circulation. We then switched to City News Distributors to deliver the Rocket, so sadly dozens of our delivery people were out of a job.

Having a circulation of 25,000 delivered door to door in North and West Buffalo, the Rocket became part of the recognized local "media". Our first official "editor" was Georgia Mullens, followed by Sharon Carr, Paul Likodis, Linda Foley, Dave Rook and others. With the addition of former Courier writers like Doug Smith, Jim Baker, Ray Herman, and Ralph Hubbell, our readership grew. We even became a member of the National Newspaper Association. Even went to the National publishers' conventions. I was now a legitimate publisher! Did not realize how many doors open for the spoiled Media. Press passes to everything. Free shows, free food, offers to speak, it was overwhelming, but I managed.


As would be expected, politicians looked for endorsements. Hey, what do I know so I never endorsed anyone. Let the voters decide. However, for some reason which I do not know, the mayor, Jimmy Griffin, had a personal feud with the only daily newspaper, the Buffalo News. There was no twitter, so he used

the weekly papers to express his views. So, he and I became friends. He had a phone next to his desk that he personally answered. I had the number but never used it. If I wanted I could call and he would just say hello. Try that with any mayor nowadays. We got along great and I even sat with him at three of the four super bowls the Buffalo Bills played in. He received a certain amount of tickets and I was fortunate enough to get two of them. Not free but as you know they were hard to attain.

Being a newspaper tycoon was something I never expected. I wondered if I was equal to the task. I had to speak as a speaker. I was asked to be on many boards, asked to be on panels, had to rub elbows with smart educated people. Could a shy high school dropout who knew nothing about the newspaper business fake it? I managed. Ask the people whose elbows I rubbed. Ask the Politicians, businessmen, residents and local leaders how I did. Would hope the answers would be positive? Worked hard with long hours and it was not as profitable as one would think. It was fun meeting all those people and the certain amount of respect that comes with owning a newspaper. Really enjoyed the press passes and free food that came with it. We even had a field pass to the Buffalo Bills and Sabres games. Free hotels in Toronto. I liked being part of the spoiled press. I liked being a "big shot".

Next week we move into a bigger building and purchase a web press to print our own newspapers.




