O'Reilly's Comments Raise Eyebrows

Locker clean out day in professional sports is usually a predictable series of conversations with players the day after their final game. The players typically utter bland comments that are about as exciting as a bowl of unflavored oatmeal. That is until Ryan O'Reilly spoke to the assembled media on Monday

O'Reilly has provided a steady supply of post game commentary all season long about how he needs to play better. Which has made this observer wonder If he wants to play better why doesn't he just so so? With the Sabres last place season mercifully at an end, he provided a big clue to the source of his shortcomings. "I've lost my love for hockey," O'Reilly confided to the media.

O'Reilly expressed that the losing has been hard on himself and his teammates, "I feel throughout the year I've lost my love for the game multiple times...it's just eating myself up...and eats the other guys too... there's times when I've found my game and just enjoy it and it's fun, but when you lose consistently like this it's tough...that's how I kind of fell out of love with it, and I miss that."

O'Reilly was then asked directly if he felt that it

was time to move on. An extended pause before responding could only hint at his true feelings, "I really want to be part of the solution here. I love this city. I love it here. I call it home... there's some big changes I need to make mentally.... if something happens and I'm moved then obviously that's a change they (Sabres GM Jason Botterill) decided to make. But I want to be here. I want to win here because I feel it would be special. It's a great city and they deserve a winning team."

These comments have created controversy. Some ex-players have spoken up saying that O'Reilly should have kept his feelings private or shared them only with the players and team management. Fans have tweeted that they are pleased to see a player speak honestly instead of spouting tired cliches. But the cat's out of the bag now and the consequences are the subject of speculation.


O'Reilly came to Buffalo because he wanted more responsibility, the ice time and the money that comes from being a number one center. In Colorado he was slotted as the number two center behind Matt Duchesne. And young Nathan McKinnon was rising up the depth chart to become a strong MVP candidate

this season. The Colorado Avalanche responded to O'Reilly's demands by trading him to Buffalo.

The Sabres made him the highest paid player in franchise history with a \$7.5 million annual salary and handed him the veteran leadership role on a young rebuilding team. Three years into the contract O'Reilly has produced three 20 goal seasons but the team and the franchise wallow at the bottom of the league. Perhaps now it becomes clear why the Avalanche made their decision, that they saw O'Reilly as being near his ceiling.

O'Reilly is a good hockey player who would draw interest from most of the leagues teams in a trade. The big story this summer will be the destination of Islanders free agent star John Tavares. There will be one team winning the Tavares sweepstakes and 20 disappointed GM's who would see O'Reilly as a desirable consolation prize.

The Sabres are in such a deep hole and need to add talent to become a playoff caliber team. Trading players like O'Reilly and Rasmus Ristolanien for draft picks and prospects would bring an infusion of young talent into the organization.

That's because April 15 falls on a Sunday this year, and Emancipation Day-a legal holiday in Washington, D.C.—will be observed the next day, which pushes the nation's filing deadline to April 17th. Under the tax law, legal holidays in the District of Columbia affect the filing deadline across the nation.



How The Buffalo Rocket Began: Part Five

This is the fifth and final in a series of articles on how the Buffalo Rocket came into existence almost 50 years ago. What began as a single sheet flyer in 1969 became a strong weekly in North Buffalo and expanded into the West Side and Riverside. Previous articles could be found on our Buffalo Rocket website.

If you have been following these articles about the very beginning of the Buffalo Rocket you are aware of the sudden impact on our staff. We started as a single page flyer and over the years grew to a legitimate weekly tabloid. Ours being a free publication as opposed to paid subscriptions. Still with a circula-


tion of 25,000 being a voice to be considered. The advertisers pay the bill, so it was important that we had readership to bolster sales for our customers. We added columnist of who I mentioned in last weeks contribution. We had a professional photographer. We had an editor and a full-time salesperson. We were as legitimate as we can be. With it came the perks of the media. Had no idea what comes with the territory. Back then television advertising was too expensive, so advertisers had to rely on radio and newsprint. So being an inexpensive way to reach the public our little publication continued to grow through the eighties. So did the free perks. The media is spoiled so it is understandable for them to become arrogant. So many doors are opened to so many things. The best thing I can remember was free hotel in Toronto with free show passes for my wife and I. One time it was the family.

The rise to fame was so unexpected and happened so quickly it took some doing to handle it. We concluded that we had reason to investigate getting our own web printing press. Most people do not know what a web press is. There must have been a movie where you saw a newspaper coming off a speedy large press. That is a web press used to print newspapers exclusively. So, we went out and bought one in Fredonia. We now were able to print our own newspapers and other publications. So, we started a new newspaper into Riverside. Giving us a total circulation of 35,000. At our peak we were printing 30 newspapers a month on our press.

This was at the peak. It continues for some years but as we all know, television has made the newspaper industry suffer a great loss. Even the dailies and radio are finding it difficult to compete. It is a different era. There is still a need for the print media but on much of a lesser scale. It was a great ride to the top. Had such good people work for me. Some continued to be good friends. Many are friends on Facebook. We are still here. It is a struggle but if there is some need, we will continue to serve.

Advance care planning involves making future healthcare decisions that include much more than deciding what care you would or would not want; it starts with expressing care preferences, clarifying values and beliefs and selecting an agent (healthcare proxy) to voice healthcare decisions if you are unable to do so.

Advance care planning starts with talking with your loved ones and your healthcare providers. These conversations will relieve loved ones and healthcare professionals of the need to guess what you would want if faced with a medical crisis. Participating organizations will be providing information and tools for the public to talk about their wishes with family, friends and healthcare providers, and execute written advance directives (Healthcare Proxy) in accordance with New York State laws. 
