Officer Lehner Honored

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15th as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. Currently, tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, DC to participate in a number of planned events which honor those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund released the roll call of names of 360 U.S. law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty. These names will be engraved this month and formally dedicated at the 30th annual Candlelight Vigil held on the National Mall, between 4th and 7th streets on Sunday, May 13, at 8:00 pm.

Included in this list are the names of 129 officers who were killed in the line of duty

in 2017, including Buffalo Police Officer Craig Lehner.

When the addition of these names is completed, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial will bear the names of 21,541 officers representing all 50 states, the District of Columbia, U.S. territories, federal law enforcement, and military police agencies—all who have made the ultimate sacrifice in our nation's history.

Each May 13th, an estimated 30,000 people assemble for the annual Candlelight Vigil, a signature event of National Police Week when the names of these fallen officers are formally dedicated. Thanks to a partnership with Officer.com, the Vigil is streamed live online so that people across the country can witness this annual tribute to America's law enforcement officers. 

"For the third year in a row, we will come together on the National Mall for an important occasion: to honor the brave lives we lost in the line of duty," said Craig W. Floyd, Chief Executive Officer of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund. "A ceremony will never relieve the loss felt by these families, but we gather to show them that they are not alone. The 900,000 officers currently wearing the badge will carry on their responsibility and dedication of protecting our communi-

It's time to Play Ball for the North Buffalo Baseball and Softball League in Shoshone Park. The Hertel North Park program opens its 62nd season this Saturday Morning, May 5th with its annual parade up Hertel Avenue near Colvin, at 11:30 am, hopefully under bright sunshine and warmer temperatures.

Close to a 1,000 boys and girls have signed up to play this season, surpassing last years' numbers and showing positive proof that the game still lives in the hearts of many young children growing up in North Buffalo. The tiny Park, located near the corner of Hertel Avenue and Main Street, has been the

home for the League since its inception in 1957. Thousands of men and women working in various fields in life today have all played and learned the game not far from home.

Under a Buffalo Police and Fire escort, hundreds of children, league officials and some parents will gather alongside the new Cornelius building at Saranac by 11 o' clock to march east on Hertel and through its business district. Many people have been known to come out and watch the teams go by as they make their way to North Buffalo's "field of dreams." The disappointment on Tim Murray's face reflected the mood of WNY sports fans. Always a bridesmmaid. Never a bride. Consecutive NHL draft lottery's, back to back second place finishes. No goal. Four Super Bowl appearances, Four losses. Murray's look as the Edmonton Oliers won the 2014 draft lottery said so much. Even Connor MacDavid looked disappointed.

In spite of mountains of hype and fan enthusiasm, the Sabres drafted second in 2014 and 2015. While one can only ponder the idea of MacDavid in Sabres colors, the sad reality is Buffalo again occupies the NHL cellar. All the draft picks and ten new players meant nothing as the new culture at Keybank Center is

a culture of losing. So when the Sabres qualified for this years draft lottery, the sounds of silence replaced the earlier excitement of previous lottery draws. Sabres fans don't cheer losing any-

more. They just stay home.
And then, against 81.5% odds, good fortune finally smiled on new GM Jason Botterill and the fans when Buffalo finally wins the lottery and is awarded the first pick in the draft. It's just luck really. Tim Murray must have been sitting at home wondering why he couldn't have been this lucky in 2015.

And this was the year to get lucky as the Sabres are in position to draft a prospect said to be the best defenseman to enter the league since Denis Potvin in 1973. That is heady praise indeed as Potvin is a three time winner of the Noriss Trophy as best defenseman, four time Stanley Cup champion and member of the Hockey Hall Of Fame.

Rasmus Dahlin is the prospect and he has the ability to

change the direction of the franchise and make Buffalo hockey fans feel great about coming the games again. His skating ability and offensive skills are said to be unparalelled. He even plays a robust defensive game and hits like a pile driver. Fellow Swede Nicklas Lidstrom is a seven time Noriss Trophy winner and probably the second best defenseman of all time after Bobby Orr said that Dahlin is farther along than he was at the same age.

Buffalo missed out on Connor MacDavid, but Dahlin has been called "The Connor MacDavid of defensemen.'

Dahlin was named the best defenseman at the World Junior championships in Buffalo. He has been playing professional hockey in the very fast paced Swedish Elite League since he was 16 years old. With 20 points in 41 games in the Sweden it's not likely that he will dominated statically as a rookie. But his skating ability and play making should help Jack Eichel use his elite wrist shot and become more of a finisher. Dahlin should supplant Eichel as the teams best player within one or two seasons as he gets acclimated to the NHL and the long 82 game schedule.

And Dahlin is just the first of a wave of Swedish prospects crossing the pond to Buffalo. The Sabres added another Swedish player Lawrence Pilut who won the Borje Salming Trophy as the best defenseman in the Sweidsh Elite League. Pilut played for HV71 and led his team and all league defenseman in scoring with 37 points. He is 22 and has played 182 games over four seasons with an impressive +47. Pilut is an offensive minded finesse player, a good but not elite skater, not physical. He projects as a potential second pair defenseman if he can adapt to the smaller NHL

rinks and longer schedule.
Victor Olafsson was the
Sabres 7th round pick 181st
overall in 2014. Playing for
Modo, he led the Swedish
League with 27 goals at age 22 and added 16 assists for 43 points in 50 games. At 5'11' and 172 pounds he is a very small player by NHL standards. He is a natural goal scorer and has primarily been a power play specialist in the SHL. He and Pilut will likely need development time in Rochester to evaluate their aptitude for the NHL.

Rasmus Asplund was the Sabres 2nd pick 33rd overall in 2016. While Buffalo has not announced his signing, he has already told his Swedish team that he will not be returning in 2018-19. with only 8 goals and 28 points in 50 game and only 20 goals in 170 career SHL game for Färjestad BK, Asplund will need to prove himself in Rochester before he can be an NHL player.

Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: reached my full retirement age and I plan to file for my benefits to start in June 2018. My wife doesn't have enough credits to qualify for benefits on her own lifetime income, but she reached her Social Security full retirement age in December 2017. Since my wife will only be eligible for a spousal benefit, are there any particular nuances of filing that I need to be aware of? Signed: Wanting to Make the Right Deci-

Dear Wanting: Since your wife is only eligible for spousal benefits, she cannot collect those until you start collecting your benefits. If you file in June 2018, your wife should simultaneously file for spousal benefits. You can file online at www. ssa.gov, by phone, or in person at your local Social Security office (find it at www.ssa.gov/locator).

While there are various considerations when filing for spousal benefits, since your wife doesn't qualify for Social Security on her own work record and she's already reached her full retirement age (FRA), she really only has one option – to file for her benefits when

you file for yours. Your wife's spousal benefit will be 50% of the benefit vou were entitled to at your FRA (plus any cost of living adjustments, or COLA, given since then) because she has already reached her full retirement age.

Finally, if you predecease your wife, she will get 100% of the amount you were receiving at your death (including any increase from delayed retirement credits) instead of the smaller spousal benefit she was receiving.
