New York State Senator Chris Jacobs presented 103 year-old Army veteran Sydney Cole, longtime resident of Blantyre Road in North Buffalo, with the 2018 New York State Senate Veterans Hall of Fame

Capt. Sydney Cole was discharged from the U.S. Army on December 27, 1945. During his military career, he was awarded the

Bronze Star medal, Purple Heart, Air Medal, POW Medal, American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with two bronze star service stars, World War II Victory Medal and, with the assistance of the Canadian Consulate, a Canadian War Medal for his service in the RCAF.

Senate Veterans' Hall of Fame was created to honor and recognize outstanding veterans from the Empire State who have distinguished themselves both in military and civilian life. Their meritorious service to our nation deserves the special recognition that only a Hall of Fame can provide, as a fitting expression of our gratitude and admiration.

Peak Months for Grilling Fires percent grill on Father's

Grilling season is upon us and grill gurus everywhere are preparing for many family parties and barbecues. The National Fire Protection Association encourages grillers to pay attention to safety during the spring and summer months when home fires involving grilling incidents occur most often.

In 2011 – 2015, fire departments responded to an average of 9,600 home fires involving grills, hibachis or barbecues each year.

July is the peak month for grilling fires followed



by May, June and August. According to the Hearth, Patio & Barbecue Association, 73 percent of consumers grill on the Fourth of July, 60 percent do so on Memorial Day, 58 percent grill on Labor Day, and 45

Remember that all types of grills pose a risk for fires and burn injuries. Place the grill well away from siding and deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches, per manufacturer's instructions.

Failing to properly clean the grill or having the grill too close to something that could burn are the leading causes of fires. Good practice dictates that home chefs check for damage be-Continued on page three.

Sabres Winning Offseason Championship of NHL

It was high comedy on June 15th 2016 when former Bill's coach Rex Ryan declared that his team had "Won the off-season." Well it looks like the Sabres have accomplished enough since their season ended that it is safe to declare that they have an insurmountable lead in the race for the off-season championship. And this is no joke, the team has made significant strides toward improving. Most significantly winning the draft lottery for the number one pick in next month's entry draft where they will select Swedish defenseman Rasmus Dahlin.

The latest success involves departed forward Evander Kane. Multiple media outlets are reporting that Kane will sign a new seven year \$39 million contract with the San Jose Sharks. The Sabres will now receive a first round pick from the Sharks in the 2019 NHL Entry Draft. The pick is lottery protected however, meaning that if it falls within the draft lottery it becomes a 2020 first rounder.

When GM Jason Botterill swapped Kane to San Jose 2019 on February 26th for a conditional 1st round pick in 2019 plus minor leaguer Daniel O'Regan and a 2020 4th round pick, he was criti-

cized because the conditional pick was actually a second rounder which become a first rounder only if the Sharks won the 2018 Stanley Cup or signed Kane to a new contract. Now Botterill can smile broadly as he has extracted a good return on that exchange.

Rasmus Dahlin is expected to become a franchise caliber defenseman NHL and will be the first player selected in the NHL draft when the Sabres take the stage on June 22nd in

Dallas. Dahlin will join fellow Swede Lawrence Pilut who was the top defenseman in the Swedish league in 2017-18. These are both offensively gifted players who will add some scoring to the Sabres attack and fit in with coach Phil Housley who likes an attacking style from his defensemen.

They will join fellow Swede Victor Olofsson in Buffalo. Olofsson led the Swedish Hockey League with 27 goals in 50 games last season and the Sabres wisely signed the 22 year old to a two year contract. He had been drafted in the seventh round in 2014. Olofsson is on the small side at 5'11' and 173 pounds but is described as an elite goal scorer and power play specialist. He may require some seasoning in Rochester but sounds like an ideal fit in Buffalo, which was the lowest scoring team in the league last season.





Ask Rusty – SSA Misinformation leads to Lost benefits

Dear Rustv: I am 64, a widow and I'm hopping mad! I lost my husband a while ago and went to Social Security to apply for widow's benefits. That all went okay and I'm getting my benefit, but I just found out that I could have avoided a cut to my widow's benefit and maybe applied only for my own retirement benefit and let the widow's benefit grow until I reached 66 when it wouldn't be cut. To make matters worse, they never explained that I'd be applying for both my own Social Security and my widow's benefit, so my Social Security payment now is made up of both and they're both reduced because I took them early. If I had waited until I was 70 to take my own benefit, it would have been more than my widow's benefit. I feel that because they never told me my options, especially when I was grieving the loss of my husband, that it's their fault that I'm losing money. What can I do? Signed: Hopping Mad

Dear Hopping Mad: It looks as though you were caught in the same miscommunication web that Social Security's Office of the Inspector General (OIG) recently investigated and found that Social Security Administration (SSA) staff had often misinformed or failed to explain all available options to those applying for survivor's benefits. In your case, you could have simply waited to apply for your widow's benefit until it reached maximum at your full retirement age (FRA); or, if you needed the money, applied for your own reduced retirement benefit first and allowed your survivor's benefit to grow to its maximum at your FRA and get that for the rest of your life; or you could have taken the reduced survivor's benefit only and allowed your own retirement benefit to grow until it reached its maximum at age 70. In other words, you could

have restricted your application to either one of those benefits and allowed the other to grow to its maximum amount (Social Security's "deemed filing" rule doesn't apply to survivor's).

I believe you have a strong case to challenge the SSA on your application choice due to them not informing you of the alternatives available to you. You can initiate this challenge by writing them a letter explaining that you would have made a different choice had you been told the alternatives available to you and request a hearing to resolve this issue.






