Great Race Begins In Buffalo

On June 23rd “The Great Race” will be starting in Buffalo with a group of over 120 rare collector cars competing in an endurance road rally.

The Race kicks off in Buffalo, New York and makes its way on a 9-day trek through Vermont, New Hampshire, Maine and into New Brunswick, Canada until it reaches its resting stop of Halifax, Nova Scotia in Canada. This year is bringing together 120 of the world’s finest collector cars, exclusive to the model year 1972 and older, competing on teams from all around the world. One of the unique stories this year is that two teenage girls (15 and 17 years old) are taking on the event in a classic Dodge Dart.

With no technology and just the open road, each

team consists of a driver and navigator completing precise course instructions. Each day, the race will be stopping in local towns along the way for fun, food, and festivities.



The community is invited to join the fun and experience these moving pieces of history up close and personal.

The Great Race is open to cars built prior to 1972 and this year there are several entries that were manufactured before World War II. Some of these pre-war cars include a chain-driven 1918 American LaFrance Speedster, a 1917 Peerless Speedster, a 1916 Hudson and the oldest vehicle to compete in this year’s race – a 1909 American Simplex. The winner of the Great Race will receive \$50,000 of the \$150,000 total purse.


Veterans Symposium

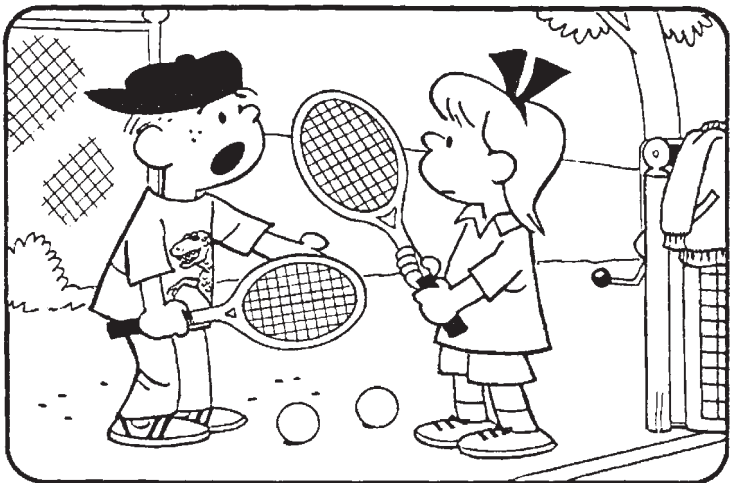
PRAYER TO

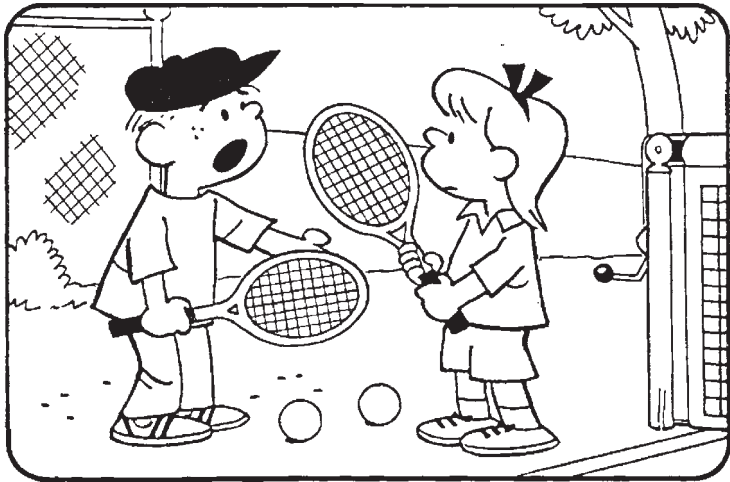

Two North Buffalo teams won Championships in a Tournament held this past weekend in Shoshone Park for boys in two separate divisions in honor of Hall of Fame Buffalo native Jimmy Collins. In a first ever tournament hosted by Hertel North Park, the league chose the Boston Beaneater third baseman to represent this Cities heritage of Baseball in a Memorial Day competition against twelve other leagues, May 27-29 inside the city.

The North Buffalo Blaze travel team won the Championship in an eleven and under division with a 13-7 victory over the Tonawanda Tomahawks Saturday afternoon. The game was the second of two scheduled in the tournament for North Buffalo after having completed a 5-0 shutout no-hitter by two Blaze pitchers against the Cheektowaga Knights earlier.

A Blaze nine and under team won that division's championship against four other leagues, 16-11, over the WNY Muckdogs early Sunday afternoon, making North Buffalo proud to be wearing the green and gold colors.

Another North Buffalo team competed in the same division and played well against the Muckdogs, the North Town Nationals, North Tonawanda and Jamestown. A North Buffalo Blaze eight and under team compete against five other leagues and lost to a Muckdogs team in the Championship, also played Sunday.

Two North Buffalo pitchers combined to pitch a no-hitter in the Semi-Final game of the

11u division, the 5-0 victory over the Knights. Eamon Langdon started and threw four innings, striking out six batters before teammate Gio Amodeo kept the Knights off the basepaths for two more. Offensively, the Blaze stole bases a whopping 14 times, led by Dominic DeGesere's 4 baggers and the team scored early to preserve the victory. In the championship, Joe Cheman and Sammy Gullivan tossed three innings apiece on the mound and the offense combined for 12 hits in the 13-7 final.

"The boys all played great and got the job done," said coach Mike Cheman afterward. "Good things will happen if you do what you need to. They all brought their A game to the Park today."

Other players on the team included Keir Bishop, Adam Kilminster, Noah McDuffie, Maurice

Ponce, Nick Perdie and Vito Joseph Verni.

The nine year old Blaze team, winners over the Muckdogs, 16-11 included Milo Armstrong, Joe Bueme, Easton Buchholz, Gavin DiGuiseppe, Camden Grabowski, Angel Hernandez, Anthony Johnson, Bryce Parker,

Henry Rittling, Charlie Stewart and Riley Wales. Eleven other boys consisted of the second North Buffalo team. They were: Robert Barker, Justin Bond, Michael Burke, Nick Filice, Dylan Galligan, RJ Hadden, Garrett Overholt, Joey Platt, Angel Rivera, Jonathan, Rodriguez and Eliot Scott.

The League picked up its season again after the Memorial Day weekend. Two more divisions, a combined ten teams, began play Tuesday and Wednesday, making a total of 59 house teams competing nightly and on the weekends. Their season will conclude in late August now that the high schools are almost out for the Summer. Get ready for more baseball and softball in North Buffalo because it's sure to be a hit.

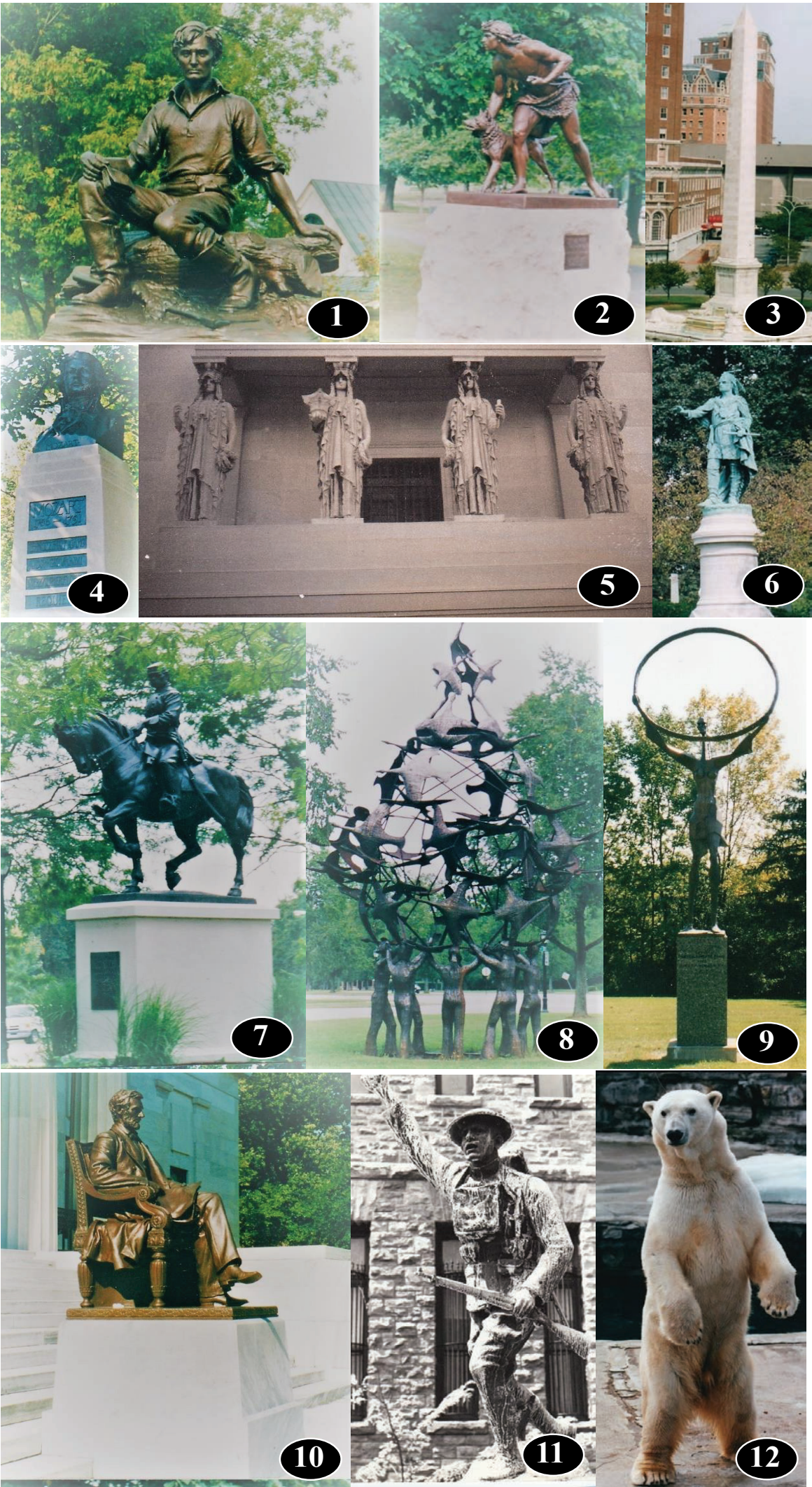
