

Remember this song, "We love our flag, our beautiful flag, of red and white and blue!"

Back when I was in grammar school 18 we would sing that song, America (My Country 'Tis of Thee), and say the pledge of Allegiance to the flag, every day. No one protested, no one took a knee, we all stood proudly with our hand over our hearts. We all loved our country immensely. Then again, at the time, we were in the middle of World War II and united as we have ever been. We knew that we needed to be as strong as we could be, to stay one country, under one flag. The other half the other. We would count flags on our side as we passed them. There were so many we would lose count. Everyone had a flag waving on their residence. It was a beautiful sight. There were so many we had to change to counting cows.

As my kids grew we did the same thing only in reverse. Cows until there too many and then flags as they were fewer. The flag kind of went into hiding for a while until 9/11. Again we banded together and the flag again waved in all its glory to show we were one again in the fight. Flags everywhere, big ones small ones, every size and shape. The flag was again our symbol of unity as one country.

This weekend my wife and I took a ride in the country on Sunday as we still do. You hardly see a flag. They are there but you really have to look for them. It is kind of sad. It still represents our country. It still had the same power it had 200 years ago. We love our flag, our beautiful flag of red and white and blue. Display it with the dignity it deserves as our symbol as a nation. Hope to see thousands on Flag Day. Why not?




