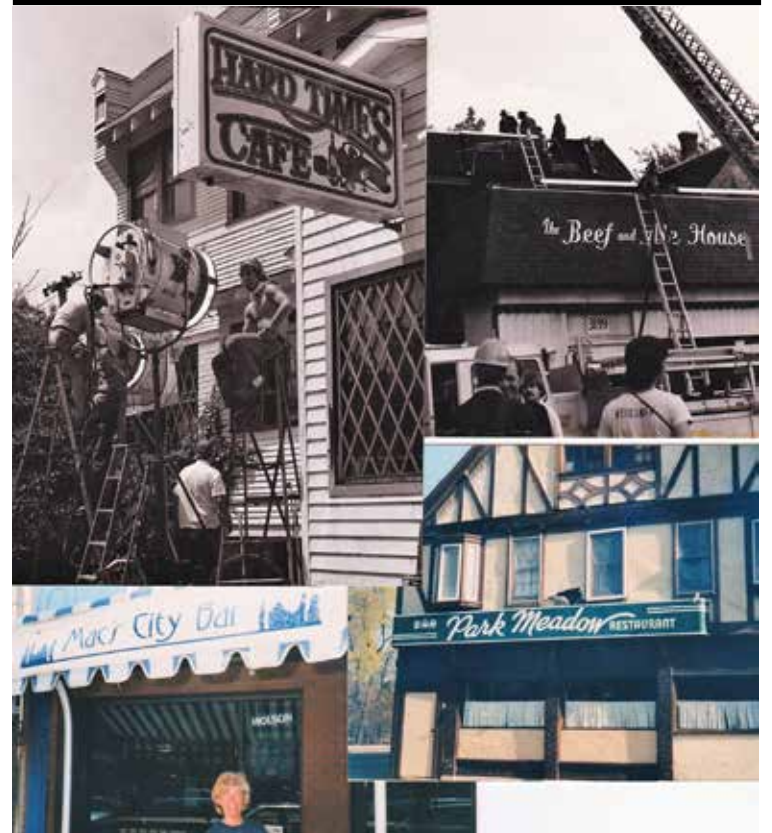
Park will be on hand to help attendees build a better resume and discuss open positions for nurses, laboratory technicians, center associates, hospital clinical assistants and more.

## I Pledge Allegiance...

Sarah Hinson was born and raised in Buffalo and in 1864 she began a 30-year teaching career at school 31 on Emslie Street, then served 20 years as the school’s principal. Hinson wanted students to know about the American flag and what it stands for. She taught them how to pay respect to the flag by reciting the pledge of allegiance.

On June 14th, 1891, she began the tradition of a formal ceremony of saluting and honoring the flag on the anniversary of the day that the Continental Congress accepted the design of the American flag.

Other teachers and schools began the tradition in following years and finally it caught on across the country. Flag Day became

an official observance under President Woodrow Wilson in 1916.

Sarah Hinson died in 1926 – she’s buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery and her grave is marked by a flag pole flying the American flag. On her gravestone are the words – “Sarah Hinson – dedicated teacher who with others gave us Flag Day.”

### Flag Day

Remember this song, "We love our flag, our beautiful flag, of red and white and blue!"

Back when I was in grammar school 18 we would sing that song, America (My Country 'Tis of Thee), and say the pledge of Allegiance to the flag, every day. The other half the other. We would count flags on our side as we passed them. There were so many we would lose count. Everyone had a flag waving on their residence. It was a beautiful sight. There were so many we had to change to counting cows.

As my kids grew we did the same thing only in reverse. Cows until there too many and then flags as they were fewer. The flag kind of went into hiding for a while until 9/11. Again we banded together and the flag again waved in all its glory to show we were one again in the fight. Flags everywhere, big ones small ones, every size and shape. The flag was again our symbol of unity as one country.

This weekend my wife and I took a ride in the country on Sunday as we still do. You hardly see a flag. They are there but you really have to look for them. It is kind of sad. It still represents our country. It still had the same power it had 200 years ago. We love our flag, our beautiful flag of red and white and blue. Display it with the dignity it deserves as our symbol as a nation. Hope to see thousands on Flag Day. Why not?

In Hertel North Park Youth Baseball and Softball action from Shoshone Park, eleven more teams began their season Tuesday, May 29 for older boys and girls, ages 13 to 16 years old. Called Senior Divisions, seven boys teams including the two time defending Champion Dodgers will play the Mets, Orioles, Tigers, Mariners, Pirates and Diamondbacks. Four girls teams led by the Champion Pirates will face the Angels, Athletics and Yankees while displaying some of the finest talent on the diamonds of WNY with their high school teams.

This is the creme de la creme of Hertel North Park Youth Baseball or Softball where most boys and girls showcase everything they've learned in the lower divisions from t-ball or Rookie all the way up to a 90 foot diamond. With new players added to the mix every year, both divisions serve as a last hurrah for area youths in organized league play in Shoshone Park. By seasons end, it's often bittersweet to see young adults end their Shoshone Park experience.

The Senior Girls Yan-

kees' defeated the Athletics, 8-6 last Tuesday to start the season. Two nights later, the Pirates defeated the Angels, 14-9, under the lights of Diamond two. This season, the Angels are being led from the dugout by three young ladies who have all played in Shoshone Park as kids, growing up in North Buffalo. They are Julia Panepinto, Caitlin Mudra, and Jenna Balducci. All three bring an excitement back into the Park, to serve as teachers for the next generation of softball players North Buffalo has to offer.

Over on the boys side, 13-15 year olds play on Mike Murphy Diamond five. This field is a special place for long-time league coaches who have helped area boys prepare for their high school baseball season much like Mike Murphy did before an untimely death several years ago. If you look hard enough, on a bright, clear day, you're able to see the top floor of the Lewis J. Bennett High School building on Main Street if you're up at bat at homeplate of diamond 5.

In Senior Boys, the Mariners defeated the Orioles, the Mets got by

the Dbacks, 6-5 and the Dodgers outlasted the Pirates, 8-2. Both Senior divisions will see their seasons end possibly just before Labor Day, proving that baseball is the Summer Game.

In a 14 and under Girls travel league game played last Wednesday, Jordan Flynn pitched a complete seven inning game on the mound for the Wildcats in a 3-1 victory over Sandlot. She struck out 10 batters and got super support from an offense that included the speed of Emylia Perez on the basepaths.

In Park games, in Major Boys, the Cubs defeated the Cardinals, the Giants upset the Mets, 10-5, and the Dodgers defeated the Braves, 12-4. In First Minors, the White Sox kept their season undefeated with a victory over the Blue Jays. The Twins beat the Royals and the Yankees topped the Orioles. In Second Minor, the Dodgers won over the Brewers. The Pirates got the better of the Marlins and the Padres beat the Braves.

It was Picture Day in the Park this past Saturday as several teams smiled for a camera, hoping that this season ends in victory. Old friends reconnect with stories to tell of a long winter while new friends are made just by running around a base path. Win or lose, a hot dog or an ice cream cone never disappoints and the season is just getting started.


