For the last 43 years, audiences all over Western New York have gathered on the Hill behind the Rose Garden in Delaware Park to attend free performances of the Bard’s classics. Picnic baskets, wine, snacks, and Shakespeare, have become a tradition in Buffalo during the summer months, and rightfully so. Shakespeare in Delaware Park has delivered profes-

sional productions, free of charge, to the community and continues this season with two productions, “King Lear” and “Much Ado About Nothing.” “It’s pretty incredible to see that we are now in our 43rd season,” says Lisa Ludwig, Managing Director of Shakespeare in Delaware Park, “this year we have two directors who have assembled wonder-

urb designed by Olmsted in 1870, for the 21st Annual Parkside Garden and Architecture Tour on

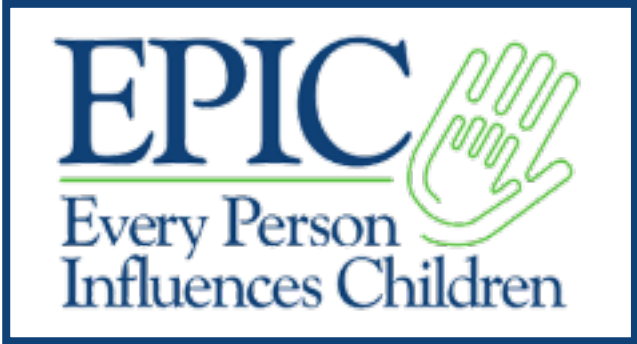

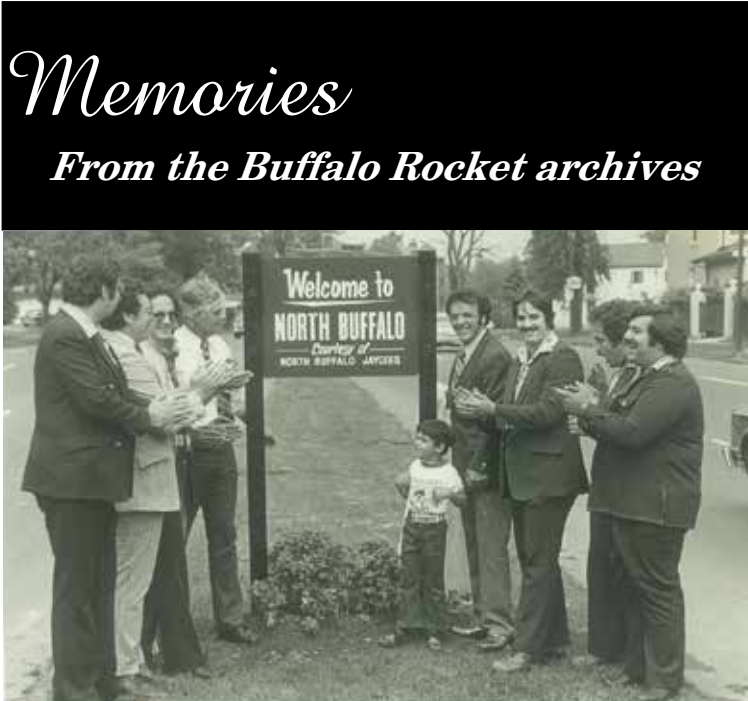

Sabres Battled Dallas for the Stanley Cup in 1999

In the opening game on June 8th in Dallas, the Sabres took a 1-0 series lead with a 3-2 win on Jason Wooley's overtime goal. Brett Hull opened the scoring on the power play. The Sabres scored two quick goals within 5:04 by Stu Barnes and Wayne Primeau in the third period for a 2-1 lead. But Jere Lehtinen tied the score for Dallas in the last minute of play to send the game into overtime. Dallas out shot Buffalo 37 to 24 but Dominik Hasek was dominant stopping 35 shots while Ed Belfour blocked 21 of 24 for Dallas.

In game two on June 10th, Dallas evened the series at 1-1 with a 4-2 win. The Dallas game plan was to get physical with Sabres goalie Dominik Hasek who dominated the opener. Brian Skrudland was assessed a charging minor after he hit Hasek and Mike Modano was called for tripping Hasek.

As the horn sounded to end the first period several scuffles broke out with Joe Nieuwendyk fighting Brian Holzinger to avenge an earlier hit into the boards. These were the first fighting majors in three years in the final round, and it was also Nieuwendyk's first fighting major in five years.

Michael Peca opened

the scoring with a second period power play goal. Jamie Langenbrunner scored a late goal and the period ended tied 1-1. Dallas took the lead in the third on Craig Ludwig's first playoff goal in 102 games. Alexei Zhitnik scored 1:11 later to tie the game at 2-2.

Brett Hull put Dallas ahead on a one timer slap shot from the top of the circle to Hasek's left with 2:50 remaining in the game. Buffalo had a power play just 19 seconds later and pulled Hasek for a 6 on 4 manpower advantage. Dallas killed the penalty and Derian Hatcher scored an empty net goal for a 4-2 victory. Hasek stopped 27 of 30 shots while Belfour has 19 saves on 21 shots.

On June 12th the Sabres lost 2-1 on home ice in game three of the Stanley Cup finals and trailed 2-1 in the series. Stu Barnes opened the scoring at 7:50 of the second period to give Buffalo a 1-0 lead. But Joe Nieuwendyk scored twice to give Dallas the win. His sixth game winning goal of that post season tied Joe Sakic's record for the most game winning goals in one playoff season. Dallas dominated play as Buffalo only challenged Ed Belfour 12 times while Dominik Hasek faced 29 shots.

In game four on June 15th, Dominik Hasek kept the Sabres from falling into a 3-1 series hole by stopping 30 of 31 shots for a 2-1 Sabres victory. Geoff Sanderson gave the Sabres a 1-0 lead at 8:09 of the first period but Jere Lehtinen tied it quickly with a power play goal at 10:14. Dixon Ward scored the winning goal at 7:37 of the second period and Hasek shut the door on Dallas for the rest of the game. Ed Belfour had 16 saves as the Sabres were outshot 31-18.

Old Fort Niagara will host its largest annual re-enactment, the French and Indian War Encampment. The three-day event

will occur Friday through Sunday, June 29th to July 1st, and will be packed with French, British and Native re-enactors from the U.S. and Canada, living-history camps and exhibits, large-scale battle re-enactments, hands-on activities, special tours and demonstrations, and food and historical goods for sale.

The fort recreates this event annually to commemorate an important development in the French and Indian War, which was happening simultaneously with the Seven Years War in Europe. Fort Niagara was the first of three key French posts to fall to the British in the summer of 1759.

Visitors will also see demonstrations of British trench engineering, British artillery firing on the French and French firing on the British, Natives and French trading furs for European goods, British and French pre-

that attend annually. "This year we are using a new stage configuration, which we call "The Globe" look, which uses a flat proscenium, similar to that of the London's Globe Theatre," says Ludwig. "Two years ago we completed a capital campaign for a brand new stage, and for the last two years, we have used the same set up, just to break it in."

With weather being a deterring factor, Ludwig says that they will not call a show off until the last possible minute because weather changes so rapidly in Western New York. "If we can dry off the stage and do the show we will. Our audiences will sit on the hill with their umbrellas and wait for the rain to pass and the stage to dry—they are a very loyal group."

Ludwig adds that audiences should bring some type of bug spray or repellent because bugs like to attend the performances as well.

Shakespeare is not always a person's cup of tea. "Shakespeare can be so

daunting for people, because what they remember is being forced to read it in high school," says Ludwig. "What people don't realize is that Shakespeare is meant to be seen and heard, not read."

If you are still reluctant to try SDP on for size because you aren't a fan of The Bard, Ludwig says that you should give it a try. "Pack a picnic, bring your blanket and favorite beverage and your favorite people, and take in the beautiful Olmsted park! I guarantee you will fall in love with it, and you will make it a new yearly tradition!"

King Lear opens June 21st and runs through July 15th. Much Ado About Nothing opens July 26th and runs through Aug 19th. Shows are Tuesday through Sunday at 7:30 pm (there IS a show on July 4th).

Northwest Buffalo Beat

Father's Day 2018

This will be the 51st Father's Day that I have not had a dad to show how much he meant to me. I lived more of my life without my father than the years that he was here. I was only 32 years old when he passed. He was 67. Not real young then but not old now. You realize how much your life is influenced by what your dad says and does. I still think of things he said and did that always followed me. His little sayings that I still use. When I did a paint job he would say, "It's so good, a blind man would be glad to see it". Or missed a missed spot would be "holidays". He was Irish and my mother was Italian. Steak and potatoes for him and spaghetti for us. He did not like spaghetti.

He raised eight of us during the great depression. I saw on TV some personality praying for a recession. He has no idea what that is, the suffering that people went through. We had to cut a lot of corners and I think I was in my teens before I was able

to buy clothes for me and not hand me downs from my brothers. My mother stayed home and raised us kids so he was the bread winner. No matter what the circumstances, we always had food on the table and a roof over our head. We did not have much but we had each other and that was all that mattered.

I became a father at age 19. My wife and I lived with my parents for the first two years of our marriage. I would work as much as I could and often got laid off as jobs were scarce. Had trouble finding full time employment and we cried whenever I got laid off. Unemployment Insurance was difficult to get so money was tight. My dad was always there to help us out in whatever we needed. Bought decorations for our first Christmas tree. It was great having him to guide me through the ups and downs of fatherhood. He had the experience and knowledge of raising kids and what to do and how to do it. I thank him for that.

He was a different fa-

ther than I was. He was laid back and seldom got into lengthy discussions. Seldom angry. As long as he had a beer to drink and a cigarette to smoke he was a happy camper. Although he liked his beer at home, I never saw him drunk. He was not the family enforcer by any means. My mother was the one with the quick hands. She could have been a boxer as they came at you out of nowhere. I speak from experience. My dad never hit any of us as I remember.

On the other hand, I was the disciplinarian. My wife had an over-sized balloon soft plastic baseball bat but all the kids did was laugh when she tried to hit them with it. Her way of instilling fear into the bad ones was to say, "Wait 'til your father comes home". Naturally, as soon as I walk in the door, I am automatically feared. I didn't do anything, yet. Then the list comes, this one did this

and that one did that. We also had eight children. So here I am, not mad at anyone but having to do some sort of punishment. The girls, (3 of them), I never had to do anything but ground them. The boys, another story. Especially two of them. Had to use some of my mother's tactics. The slap on the back of the head. Even in spite of that, they would run to the corner and wait to see my station wagon coming. Never knew if they were happy to see me or they were hungry. All in all though, I think I was a good father as they all turned out well. So did my brothers and sisters. So my dad and I did OK.

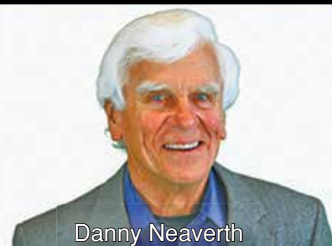
