
# **Annual Chalk Contest**

# Too Slow, Too Old, Too Expensive

The much talked about and inevitable trade of Ryan O'Reilly yielded five assets for the Buffalo Sabres late Sunday night. In addition to a 2019 first round pick draft pick, the Sabres acquired three players, all centers, and a 2021 second round pick. The Sabres also retain no salary and the Blues will be paying O'Reilly's \$7.5 million bonus. Considering the impending midnight deadline for O'Reilly's signing bonus and the challenge of trading a productive but overpaid player, Botterill did a credible job in removing the last major trade acquisition of the Tim Murray regime.

Botterill has shipped out Evander Kane who had off ice issues and opted not to re-sign. Robin Lehner who had some locker room issues. And now O'Reilly is gone and he certainly has had no shortage of issues going all the way back to his drunken driving arrest crashing into a Tim

Horton's restaurant. Patrik Berglund joins the influx of new Swedish players including Rasmus Dahlin, Lawrence Pilut and Victor Olafsson. He is a 30 year old veteran with

size at 6'4" and 219 pounds with 10 years of NHL experience with St. Louis. Berglund has scored 168 goals and 322 points in 694 NHL games. He has scored 20+ goals three times and has never scored less than 10 goals in a season.

Vladimir Sobotka is a nine year veteran who scored 11 goals and 31 points last season. He has scored 47 goals and 155 points in 463 games in his NHL career. His trade by the Blues looks like a salary dump which the Sabres might need to get to the salary cap floor. He is rumored to be leaning towards playing in the KHL next year. If he stays in the NHL he likely fits on the fourth line in Buffalo.

Tage Thompson at 6'5" he is a towering presence who models his game after the abrasive Corey Per-ry of the Anaheim Ducks. He comes from a hockey family, his father Brent Thompson was drafted by the Los Angeles Kings in 1989 in the second round. He split the 2018-19 season between the NHL and AHL, playing 41 games for St Louis with three goals nine points and was a -12. At age 20 he is a pros-

pect and will likely play in Rochester to start the 2018-19 season.

So this trade looks like O'Reilly for Berglund and a prospect and a first rounder. Some are criticizing the trade for not producing a significant player in return while some say getting a first rounder is remarkable. Jason Botterill said the trade was in the works for months so it precedes O'Reilly's season ending comments about how losing has caused him to fall out of love with hockey.

Outside the Sabres organization no one knows for sure why O'Reilly was traded. He is slow, expensive and aged above the teams young corps of 18-23 year old players. He is known to have some issues with Jack Eichel, perhaps because he is uncomfortable playing in Eichel's shadow. This was apparent when he would exclude Eichel from goal celebrations during games. O'Reilly may have orchestrated his comments as a play to get out of Buffalo, he and his agent used similar tactics to push for a trade from Colorado.

With this trade Jason Botterill has made a statement that this is Jack's team now and all of the rumored malcontents are gone. The most important goal of the organization is to create a positive environment for the incoming projected superstar Rasmus Dahlin. Hopefully Jack will be comfortable when the Sabres soon become Dahlin's team and Eichel becomes the second banana.

## **Church on Sunday**

I do not recall my parents going to church on Sunday. My father-in-law was an Atheist. Therefore, my wife's parents did not attend church as long as I knew them. In spite of this, my wife and I were both raised Catholics. When we were attending Grammar school, if you registered as a Catholic, you were allowed to go to what we called catechism. If I remember correctly on Monday afternoon, Catholics were allowed to leave their school and attend religious classes at their church. Usually within walking distance. Although back then walking distance was sometimes a mile and sometimes more. So, religion was made a part of our lives, like it or not.

Unless I am mistaken, catechism is a book and the classes we attended every Monday afternoon was to introduce the teachings in the book. In any case, we were indoctrinated into the

Catholic faith by nuns and sometimes priests on those Monday afternoons. So, we as young children, lean toward the religion that our parents were but did not really participate in. Both my wife and I received all the Sacraments, First Communion, Confirmation, and of course Marriage. So even though both our parents were non-participating, we became church-goers. So, did some of my brothers and sisters. Not all.

Maybe because we were married so young, religion became a big part of our lives. All our children attended Catholic grammar school. Taught by tough nuns, overseen by tougher nuns. We became host at pre-canna conferences which were Catholic pre-marriage teachings. Back then the only accepted birth control was to not "spill the seed". We were told to use the "rhythm system". Not going to get into that but we used it and had

eight children. Must have been out of tune. Not only did we all attend church on Sunday, I became a lectern on the altar. Did all the readings, except the gospel, and led the singing, without any instrumental help. The nuns in attendance and the kids were my only singing support. It was nine o'clock kids mass. My sons became altar boys. We were a solid Catholic family. My three daughters all attended Catholic High schools, Mt, St Joes, Bishop McMahon, Holy Angels. As a father I did not want them to attend a school with boys. Ugh! They all turned out all right, and I know at least one still attends church every Sunday.

As far as the boys, even with all that intense teaching as youngsters, not sure if any attend church on Sunday. Things are so different now than it was back then. Sunday was mass day and it was almost a given. Churches were full and there was a mass every hour. 7.8.9.10,11, and high mass at 12. Christmas and Easter, forget about it, you had to sometimes stand outside it was so full. Holy days were also a must. You would go to confession on Saturday. It was not unusual for there to be long lines at the confessional. Religion was a big thing and in a lot of families, it still is.

It had been years since I attended a wedding, held in a church, with a mass. Used to be that was the way it was. They were long and admittedly sometimes boring, unless you had a fiery priest. Held in what was called God's house, a church. For us old timers, seeing churches close, turned into other venues, or torn down, means an end of a good era. All religions here, got along with each

other, no one felt theirs was better than the other. Sunday was set aside as a day of Worship, was then, is now, and always should be. I think we need to bring back a little more religion in our lives.

# Ask Rusty – **Spousal Benefits?**

Dear Rusty: We have gone to the Social Security office because we were told that my husband might be eligible to receive Social Security benefits, but they told him he had not worked enough quarters and that he could not collect benefits. My husband is from England and holds a green card, and we have been married for 8 years living in the United States. I am 71 and started receiving my Social Security a few months after I retired at age 69. My husband is also 71 but according to Social Security he can't get benefits. Is it because he is not a citizen? Signed: Feeling Cheated



categories are eligible to receive Social Security benefits provided they are otherwise eligible and have resided in the U.S. for at least 5 years. Although your husband may not qualify to receive Social Security retirement benefits from his own U.S. work record, with legal permanent resident status he should be entitled to receive Social Security spousal benefits on your record. Your husband should now apply for spousal benefits based upon your work record and be prepared to show them the necessary documentation to prove his legal non-citizen status as well as your marital status. You may want to try to make a case that So-

cial Security made a mistake when they originally denied his request, because he was eligible for spousal benefits and they did not accept his application. In that case, if you can prove it was their mistake, they should pay your husband spousal benefits back to the day of your original meeting with them.

(Post-script: This couple returned to the Social Security office as recommended armed with the above information. The husband was ultimately awarded spousal benefits on the wife's record, and received benefits retroactive to the date he first applied.)
