Sabres New Goaltender looks like an Upgrade

The Sabres decided to walk away from incumbent starter Robin Lehner when his contract expired at seasons end. That left the goaltending chores in the hands of 24 year old Linus Ullmark who has been developing in Rochester for the past three seasons. Ullmrak is ready for promotion to the NHL as shown by his 2.44 GAA, 21-12-4 record and .922 save percentage with the Amerks last season. He also appeared in five games as a Sabre with an excellent 2.00 GAA and .935 save percentage. But a weak playoff performance reinforced the need to provide him and the team with support in the nets. And the Sabres certainly met those needs by signing free agent goalie Carter Hutton to a three year contract.

Hutton is coming off a career year with the St. Louis Blues, leading the league with a 2.09 GAA and a .931 save percentage. And he stopped all four shootout attempts he faced. With that performance Hutton established himself as the best backup goalie in the league. He was generally regarded as the better goalie with the Blues last season outperforming starter Jake

Allen. So his acquisition is a real coup for Sabres GM Jason Botterill.

The key to bringing Hutton to Buffalo was his familiarity with the Sabres coaching staff. Phil Housley was an assistant with Nashville. Jerry Forton, Buffalo's director of college scouting, was an assistant coach with U-Mass Lowell when Hutton played there. And the Sabres goalie coach Andrew Allen was also Hutton's goalie coach for Rockford in the AHL where he played in 2011-12 and 2012-13.

Hutton and Ullmark will likely split the goaltending duties in Buffalo this season. He has played 138 NHL games primarily as a backup although he was the starter for the Nashville Predators in 2013-14 when Pekka Rhinne was injured. His career stats line reads 2.42 GAA with a 915 save percentage and a 63-39-17 record.

The 32 year old Hutton was undrafted after playing four seasons at U-Mass Lowell. He signed as a free agent with the Philadelphia Flyers in March of 2010, the San Jose Sharks in June of 2010 and the Rockford Icehogs of the AHL in August of 2011 before signing with the Chicago Blackhawks in February of 2012. He played on Chicago's Stanley Cup winning team and received a championship ring. However he didn't play enough games to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup and he was not included in the team picture.

The presence of Hutton gives the Sabres a solid pair of netminders. Hutton can mentor young Ullmark as he acclimates to playing full time in the NHL. The two goalies will likely split the schedule so that Ullmark isn't overwhelmed by playing 55 or 60 games.



Television and computers are the way to go for advertisers and people who want to know what's happening. We can only talk from experiences before TV and PCs took over the spotlight.

We had two weekly newspapers, North Buffalo Rocket, West Side Times, circulation 25,000. So we were considered part of the major media and all the perks that went with it. And there are plenty. Front row seats at live shows, free hotel rooms in Toronto to see the shows, all kinds of free dinners and the best was the free visit to Disney World in 1986.

It was WDW 15th anniversary and what they

wanted to do was show the world what they had accomplished in the middle of Florida. So they invited media from all over the world to participate in the most spectacular birthday party. 10,000 of them! They flew journalist and publishers from all these different countries to showcase what they felt they had created, the place to be on this planet. All expenses paid, flight, hotel room, dinners, and of course all that Disney World had to offer. And there was plenty.

The event took place in October, still a very hot month, especially inland in Florida. So the hotel pool was should I say the "hot spot" or "cool spot". Met people from all over the country in our pool. It was a great time. One night they actually closed the park to the public so they could entertain the guests who they knew had the power to bring in millions of people with a stroke of the pen. 
would figure the chances of winning were slim and none.

After going underwater a few times and surfacing next to me he asked with his Kentucky twang, "Aren't you with the North Buffalo Rocket?" My response was that he knew I was and why was he asking. "You won the boat, motor and trailer in the raffle." Yippee, what a great way to end this fabulous weekend. Then he continued, "you did not respond so they drew another name." Turned out it was Jim Worral who owned the Riverside Review at the time. He also was not there, so it went to the next name drawn.

What a bummer. I went to the people who were in charge of the event to see what I can do, and their response was kind of what the heck do you want us to do for you? Go out and buy another boat? Are we not showing you a good time to have to complain about not winning the boat? My bad. Talk about being unappreciative. I sheepishly walked away saying thank you a couple of times. Alzheimer's Disease

A cure for Alzheimer's disease does not exist and treatments are hit and miss. However, researchers are working overtime to find new ways to deal with the menace of dementia, according to senior advocate Dan Weber.

Dementia, most notably Alzheimer's, is a leading cause of death among the elderly. According to the Alzheimer's Association it kills one out of three seniors. In fact, the Alzheimer's Association says that between 2000 and 2015, deaths from heart disease decreased 11% while deaths from Alzheimer's disease increased 123%.

Weber, who is president of the Association of Mature American Citizens, says that the statistics paint a bleak picture. But, he says, researchers are making progress in finding ways of dealing with the illness. He cites recent news that Temple University scientists successfully

used a 22-year-old asthma drug to reverse some of the most damaging effects of dementia in mice.

Dr. Domenico Praticò, Director of the Alzheimer's Center at Temple and the study's lead investigator, told the Philadelphia Inquirer "for the first time, we are showing that we can do something after the disease is established."

It will take some time determine whether such a treatment could be effective in humans, says Weber. "But, it provides a modicum of hope as do other such research reports, including work being done by researchers at Colorado University's Anschutz Medical Campus in Denver. Researchers there have been testing two drugs that hold promise— Aducanumab and Leuk-

"While we might worry about the prospect of a loved one falling victim to the disease, we need to accept the fact that any of

us might need to assume the role of principal caregiver to a mother, father or other relative or friend in their later years. And so, it is important to remember that you are not alone. It is comforting to know that there are people who understand your plight. They may not have all the answers, but they can let you know what to expect and provide ways of dealing with day-to-day situations," concludes Weber.


