Petty Officer 3rd Class Shaun Johnson is a logistics specialist with the Sidewinders of VFA 86, which operates out of Naval Air Station Lemoore. A Navy logistics specialist is responsible for ordering all parts for jets, flight clothing for the squadron, and general supplies needed on a daily basis.

"I grew up being taught to be friendly to people as much as you can," Johnson said. "In the Navy, my job requires me to deal

with a lot of different people. When you are friendly, it makes the day go by easier."

Members of VFA 86 work with the F/A 18 Super Hornet, one of the

most advanced aircraft in the world. The Super Hornet takes off from and lands on Navy aircraft carriers at sea and is capable of conducting air-

Dahlin Slated to Become Sabres First Franchise Defenseman

The franchise defenseman is a key element in building a championship caliber team. He is the perennial candidate for the post season all star team and the Norris Trophy. Recent Stanley Cup champions the Chicago Blackhawks fit the mold with Duncan Keith, the Los Angeles Kings had Drew Doughty, the Detroit Red Wings had Nicklas Lidstrom and the Boston Bruins had Zdeno Chara. The Sabres have never had a true franchise defenseman in their history. The three best D-men to wear the blue and gold were Mike Ramsey, Jim Schoenfeld and Phil Housley. None of the three ever won a Norris trophy.

Schoenfeld finished third in Norris Trophy voting in 1979-80 when he was selected to the NHL's second all star team finishing fourth in all star voting behind Larry Robinson, rookie Ray Bourque and Borje Salming. He finished 10th in voting the next season. In other seasons he finished 9th, 11th and 13th in all star voting. Ten years later, Phil Housley had his highest scoring season for Buffalo with 21 goals and 81 points. He finished fifth in voting for the all star

team and Norris Trophy. As a sophomore he scored 31 goals and 77 points in 1983-84 also finishing fifth in all star and Norris voting.

Those two seasons were franchise defenseman seasons for sure. But Housley was not a consistent contender for these honors and was never regarded as highly as a true franchise defenseman such as Ray

Bourque who was a post season all star and a top four Norris Trophy candidate for 17 straight seasons during which he won the Norris five times.

Mike Ramsey who many consider to be Buffalo's all time best defenseman never finished higher than sixth for the post season all star team which he did in 1983-84 when he also finished tenth in Norris voting. His strongest season for Norris contention was 1989-90 when he was seventh in voting.

Dahlin has been described as the best defenseman prospect since Dennis Potvin who was a seven time post season all star and top four candidate for the Norris Trophy. If Dahlin develops as expected he should become this type of dominant player and become the best defenseman in franchise history.

Ask Rusty – Spousal and Survivor Benefits

Dear Rusty: I worked in my career, but I now get Social Security disability. My husband retired in 2015 at age 66 and took his Social Security at that time. When he is 70 can I get spousal benefits from his Social Security? And if I can't get them when he turns 70, can I get them if he dies before me? I am 5 years younger than my husband, but my health is up and down, so if I die before him can he get spousal benefits from my Social Security? Signed: Kentucky Woman

Dear Kentucky Woman: Since your husband is already receiving his Social Security retirement benefits, you are eligible to collect spousal benefits at any time after you reach age 62, even though you are collecting Social Security Disability benefits (you don't have to wait until he's 70); however, if you start those spousal

benefits before you reach your full retirement age they will be reduced. If you claim at or after your full retirement age (66+2 months) your spousal benefit would be 50% of your husband's full retirement age benefit; but if you start earlier it would be less.

Please note too that your Social Security Disability Insurance benefits will automatically convert to regular Social Security benefits when you reach your full retirement age but will continue at the same amount you were receiving on disability (including the spousal portion). If your husband predeceases you, and you have already reached your full retirement age, you will get 100% of whatever Social Security benefit he was receiving, instead of any disability benefit or spousal benefit you may be re-

ceiving. If he passes and you claim survivor's benefits before you reach your full retirement age, those benefits will be reduced to something less than 100% of the benefit he was receiving. How much of a reduction depends upon how many months before your FRA that you start the survivor's benefit. If you were to predecease your husband, he would get survivor's benefits from you only if that benefit is higher than the amount he is already receiving from his own work record.

to-air combat as well as striking targets on land. It is approximately 61 feet long, has a loaded weight of 51,000 lbs., and a max speed of 1,190 miles per hour. Operating from sea aboard aircraft carriers, the Super Hornet gives the Navy the power to protect America's interests anywhere, at any

time. The versatile jet has the ability to destroy targets located hundreds of miles inland, without the need to get another country's permission to operate within its borders. Johnson has military ties with family members who have previously served and is honored to carry on the family tradition.

As a member of one of the U.S. Navy's most relied-upon assets, Johnson and other sailors know they are part of a legacy that will last beyond their lifetimes providing the Navy the nation needs. "Serving in the Navy means that you are a part of something that helps your country be the best it can be," Johnson said.
