## On This Day In Sabres History . . .

On this day in Buffalo Sabres history, July 26th 1951, Richard "Rico" Martin was born in Verdun, Quebec. Martin was drafted by the Sabres in the 1971 NHL Amateur Draft with the fifth overall pick. Martin was the Sabres first selection in their second draft, following the selection of Gilbert Perreault, the first overall choice in the 1970 draft.

Martin scored a then NHL record 44 goals as a rookie, breaking the record of 38 set by Perreault the year before. Perreault and Martin teamed with Rene Robert to form the famous "French Connection" line which swash buckled their way in the NHL during the 1970's. Martin played


for the Sabres for 10 years, tallying 695 points in 681 games along with 53 points in 63 playoff games.

Rico suffered a career ending knee injury against

the Washington Capitals when goaltender Mike Palmateer charged him and tripped him while on a breakaway. Following surgery to repair his knee, Martin was traded along with Don Luce to the Los Angeles Kings for two draft choices. One of those picks was used to draft Tom Barrasso.. Martin played only four regular season games with the Kings over two seasons before he was forced to retire due to his injury. Martin picked up six points in those four games.



## Victory Garden

Back when I was just a young lad we were experiencing a World War that in one way or another affected every American life, young or old. Every eligible man was serving in the military and most were overseas and not on our shores. That meant those that were left on the home front, had to step it up. That we did. Not only did women, mothers and wives, take over in the factories, others were asked to contribute in other ways. Scrap metal drives, rationing, and even trying to contribute by growing food in your back yard. If you had the space, you were asked to turn as much as you could into what was called a "Victory Garden". Understand regular everyday people like my dad had never grown a dandelion on purpose. Like every other patriotic American he was willing to try.

We lived on Fargo Avenue and had a rather large back yard. In those days this part of the West Side had had mostly Italian Americans, familiar with growing vegetables. My grandfather on my mother's side came right off the boat from Sicily. We did have a pear and cherry tree so we were a little ahead of the game. Next door our neighbor had a huge grapevine covering half his yard. He had enough in his crop to make his own wine for the year. He had constructed an overhead wood frame to hold his grapes. It was

like walking into a large room of leaves and clusters of grapes. You would walk under this cover of hanging deep purple sweet tasting delicacies and eat away. I think that is were I lost my taste for grapes.

So, in order to do his part as a patriot, my dad started his first garden. Mostly tomatoes. They are really easy to grow. Peppers, lettuce, and zucchini, and anything that did not require agricultural skills. It turned out to be quite a large undertaking but was well worth it. Harvest time brought plenty of tomatoes, cucumbers, and much more. In the fall my mother would then do what was called canning. For those who do not know what canning is, I will try to explain. Items were not put in cans but into canning jars. That is a whole new topic. Naturally the item that was "canned" the most was tomatoes. That made the spaghetti sauce, pizza sauce, tomato sandwiches and much more. We actually had a part of our basement set aside for all the "canned items". I

recall she had pears, tomatoes, cucumbers, pickles, cherries, in jars and they would last all winter. I think it was called the pantry.

The point is, as I said, I was a contributor to this victory garden. I learned how to grow vegetables in a small garden. Since then I do not think that I have missed a year that I did not have a garden and always tomatoes. Not as much as our "Victory Garden" as canning is a thing of the past... Besides it was an awful lot of work. However the desire to see things grow has been passed on to some of my children. Many of my eight children have vegetable gardens. Some with things I have never been able to grow. Even potatoes which you think would be the first for an Irishman, which my father was. And of course we have one right here in our backyard with tomatoes, peppers, etc. Not only do I like to eat the veggies, I enjoy watching them grow. I think I may even be a reincarnated farmer.

# Ask Rusty – Going Back to Work after Retiring

Dear Rusty: I am 63 1/2 and I am retiring from my job on August 1st because I'm physically unable to do the work anymore. I have qualified for a pension from work and I also want to start receiving my Social Security benefits. What happens if I choose to go back to work full time or part time in the future? Do I continue to receive Social Security? Do I lose anything if this happens? Or have I just frozen my benefits at the current rate? Signed: Retiring Soon

Dear Retiring: Since your full retirement age (FRA) is 66 years of age, you should be aware that if you start your Social Security before you reach your full retirement age your benefit amount will be reduced by 5/9 of 1% for

each month early that you claim, so at 63 1/2 the reduction will be 16.7%, and that reduction is permanent. If you claim benefits early and you go back to work before you reach age 66, you will still receive your Social Security benefits, but you will be subject to Social Security's earnings limit, which for 2018 is \$17,040. If your annual earnings exceed that limit they will withhold future benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit you are, until the year you reach your full retirement age. In that year, the earnings limit goes way up (by about 2 1/2 times) and the withholding amount is less (\$1 for every \$3 over the limit). Note that the earnings limits change annually, but the 2018 limit for

those who reach their full retirement age this year is \$45,360 and \$17,040 in the year prior to the year you reach your FRA. If you exceed the earnings limit Social Security will withhold your Social Security benefits until they recover what you owe them due to exceeding the limit. Then, when you reach your full retirement age, they'll give you time credit for any months you didn't receive a benefit due to exceeding the earnings limit and will recompute your benefit amount as though you applied later than you actually did. By doing this your benefit amount at your FRA will be increased to eventually offset the loss of benefits you suffered while you were working and collecting. Note that Social Security asks that you advise them as soon as you know you will exceed the earnings limit, rather than waiting until they eventually catch up to you when you file your Federal Income Tax Return. And please also note that they don't withhold partial benefits; they withhold the entire month's benefit, and if that is more than you owe they will reimburse you any excess they withheld in the following tax year.
