Nearly 15,000 New York State women are diagnosed with breast cancer each year and approximately 2,700 of those women die from the disease. These women are our wives, mothers, sisters, and friends.

The Erie County Department of Health Cancer Services Program, in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, is raising awareness about the importance of mam-

mograms for early breast cancer detection.

The mission of program is to ensure that all women have access to life-saving

100 health care providers across Erie County, including many private practice locations. Services are available to uninsured individuals, as well as those under insured who may have a high deductible plan with un-affordable out of pocket costs.

Sabres Preview Part Two - Defense and Goal

The influx of talent into the Sabres lineup strengthens the defense corps. Rasmus Dahlin is the superstar in waiting that the team has needed. The first overall pick in 2018 is a significant NHL player eventually. But it is uncommon for an 18 year old defenseman to enter the league and provide significant offense.

In the past 34 seasons, Aaron Ekblad is the only 18 year old defenseman to score more than 35 points. Dahlin's 20 points in 41 Swedish Hockey League games last season translates to 25 points in 82 NHL games. Dahlin will start the season on the second pair as the Sabres plan is to keep him from playing significant minutes against the top NHL lines. As the season goes on he will probably be given increasing power play minutes which should result in more goals and points. Caution is advised when setting expectations for his first season. Even Bobby Orr only had 41 points in his rookie season.

The first pair will feature Rasmus Dahlin and Marco Scandella neither of whom quite frankly are top

pair caliber players. Ristolainen has been miscast as a franchise defender here. He is a good defenseman who should be slotted on the second pair with a healthy amount of minutes on the penalty kill. Scandella was a third pair defenseman on a good Minnesota team and should be a second pair D-man at best. But the Sabres lack quality on the blueline so these players will play top minutes because someone has to.

Dahlin will be protected on the second pair with Jake McCabe while he

adapts to the NHL. Eventually Dahlin will become a minute muncher and a dominant player on the top pair. The third pair will see Natahn Beaulieu and Zach Bogosian with Casey Nelson as the seventh defender. Bogosian has been injured with an unspecified lower body injury unrelated to the hip injury which ended his 2017-18 season. He should be ready for opening night on October 4th against the Boston Bruins.

In goal Carter Hutton has a hold on the number one job with a 2.64 pre-season GAA and .908 save percentage. Hutton led the NHL with a 2.09 GAA last season with the St. Louis Blues and had an outstanding .931 save percentage. With a 3.77 GAA and .888 save percentage in preseason Linus Ullmark will open the season as the backup. Ullmark has shown that he is quite capable as an NHL goalie and his numbers should reflect that as the season unfolds.

Kidnapped?

When my wife and I traveled to Italy, we were warned to look out for pick-pockets and all kinds of not so good happenings to American tourist. I planned the whole itinerary. Grand Canal (the Main waterway) with a balcony. The first night we could see and hear the gondoliers singing to their passengers. Some alone with a single couple, and others that grouped together. It was something so different, romantic, and charming. Next day we took our gondola ride, but the gondolier did not sing. He said gondolier is passed on from generation to generation and if you do not sing good, you just do not sing. After that it is on to San Marco square, the hot spot of Venice. You have seen, I am sure, pictures of people feeding the pigeons. Wife wanted to do that, so I bought a bag of feed. That lasted 30 seconds as the pigeons are big birds and to have dozens flying all over you is a bit overwhelming. She dropped the bag and let them go at it and not her.

Now comes the scary part. Like I said we had been pre-warned by our travel agent to be wary when in Italy. When we were offered a free ride in to see the Murano glass factory it seemed okay. Why not you have to travel by boat everywhere, so this was not questionable. We get into what was a speedboat expecting it to fill with passengers. That did not happen, we were the only two on board. Not to worry as how far could they go. Suddenly we were taking off at full speed headed into the open sea. At first, I was not too concerned, that is until I could no longer see shore. What is going on here? Are we being kidnapped? The two fellows in the front

seats were talking Italian and I had no clue as to what they were saying. I looked around the boat to see what I could use as a weapon if necessary, Nothing.

As we traveled at high speed further and further away from Venice, here out in the middle of the Mediterranean, I became a bit apprehensive. Had no idea where they were taking us. They are paid to bring tourist to the Murano glass factory located on an island about 45 minutes away.

It was worth the wait. This is a world renown tourist attraction as there is nothing like it. To walk in the front door and see the most outstanding display of color glass in every size, shape and form. Hard to describe as these were all original pieces of art. Far too expensive for me. We did buy some small souvenirs, glass hard candy replicas. Watched the glass blowing in action. Amazing.

Hey, now how do we get back? Does a boat come and pick us up? No! Must take a bus. A bus boat out here in the middle of nowhere? There is one bus that goes out there and if you miss it, you sleep on the grass. Made sure we were waiting long before the bus arrived. Talk about a long bus boat ride. Couldn't wait to get back and listen to the gondoliers safe and sound on solid ground. Had enough of being afloat. On to the mountains of Switzerland.

er the risk of dying from breast cancer.

Breast cancer is most commonly found in women 50 years old or older. Women ages 40–49 years old are encouraged to talk to their health care provider about when and how often they should receive a screening mammogram. Any woman who is at high risk for breast cancer may need to begin screening earlier. Any woman or man, who has symptoms or changes in their breasts, should schedule an appointment with their health care provider immediately. While very rare, it is possible for men to develop breast cancer.

Dr. Gale Burstein, Erie County Commissioner of Health, urges all women to talk to their health care provider about breast cancer screening and their personal risk for the disease. “A woman’s best chance for survival is find-

ing breast cancer early through regularly scheduled mammograms,” says Burstein. “A mammogram is a quick, safe, and painless screening exam. It can detect small masses and other forms of breast disease that may be too small or deep to be felt by even an experienced health care professional.”

Although some women have certain risk factors that may increase their chance of developing breast cancer—most do not. Recommended screening is so vitally important for all women 40 years and older. “Great advances have been made in early breast cancer detection and treatment and many women diagnosed with the disease are living long, healthy lives,” concluded Burstein.

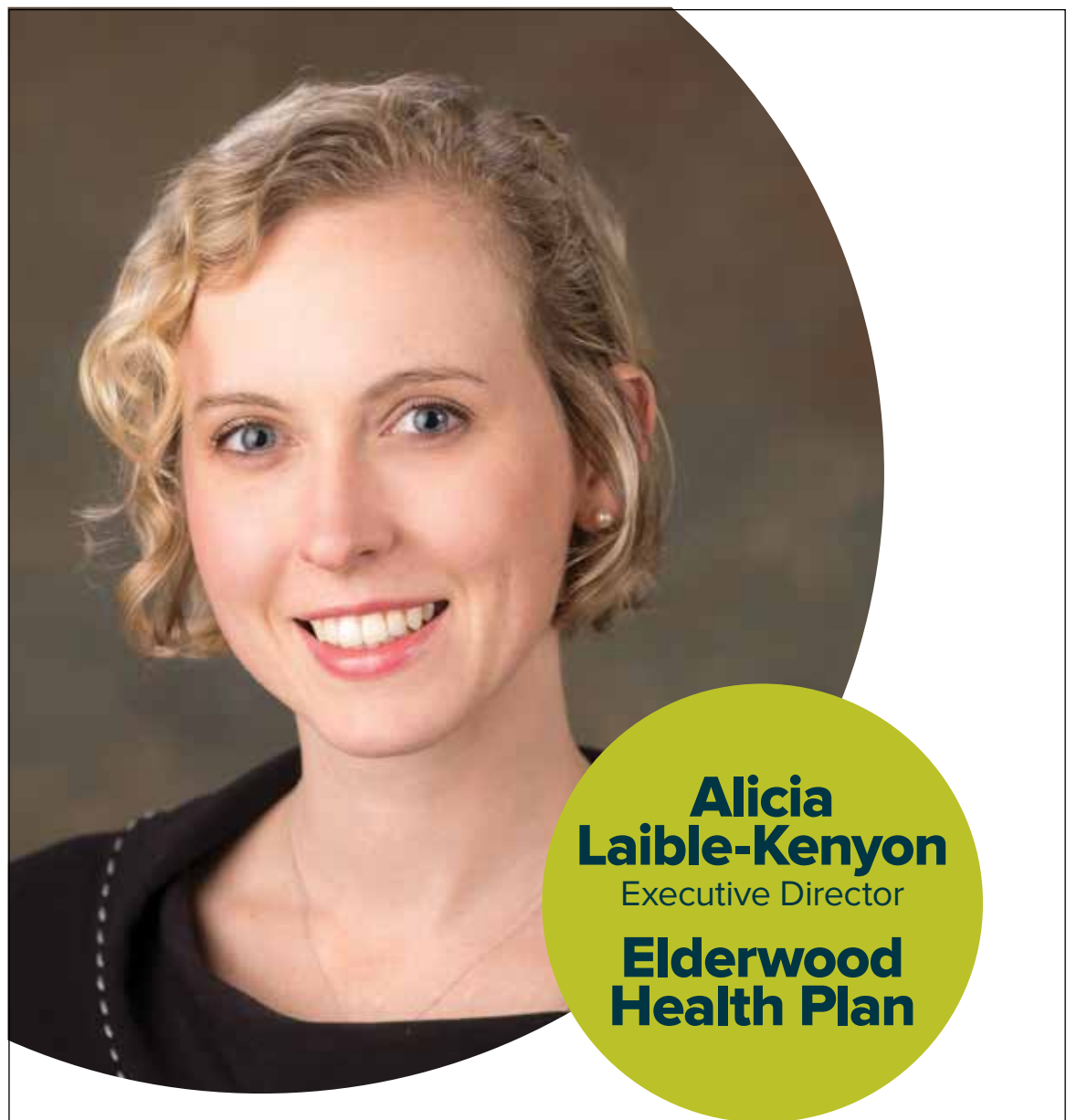



Plan and Plant this Fall for Three Months of Spring Color

It's time to think spring and get busy planning and planting for months of colorful blooms.

The key to getting a continuous parade of spring flowers is to plant bulbs that bloom at different times. Include some early, mid and late spring bloomers. You'll enjoy the burst of color and sustained beauty that spring-flowering bulbs can provide.

Enlist some help in planning your extended spring-blooming garden with Longfield Gardens' Bloom Time Guide to Spring and Summer Bulbs (longfield-gardens.com).

When you think early spring, crocus may be the first bulb that comes to mind, but there are so many colorful choices to welcome spring. Consider adding some cheery periwinkle blue and white Chionodoxa, also known as glory-of-the-snow. Each of these bulbs produces six to ten blossoms, and best of all, you can watch them grow and multiply for years to come.

Brighten wooded areas, rock gardens or any garden bed with the dainty Elwesii snowdrops. These are deer resistant and naturalize readily, so you'll enjoy more blossoms every spring.

Winter aconites add a splash of yellow, while Siberian squill and Harmony netted iris (Iris reticulata) bring a touch of blue and white. Be sure to include some early-blooming daffodils along with Early Double, Emperor, Flair, Kaufmanniana and Greigii tulips – all perfect for any garden or spring bouquet.

Add a surprising element with checkered lily (Fritillaria meleagris). The petals of these nodding, bell-shaped flowers are covered with an intricate pattern in cream, lavender, purple and burgundy.

Perfume the air with an array of white, red, purple, blue or pink hy-

acinths. And buy a few extra to force and enjoy indoors.

For mid-spring, include some mood-lifting daffodils like creamy white and yellow Cheerfulness or yellow Double Smiles along with Darwin and Triumph tulips. Mix these with lower-growing grape hyacinths or ground-hugging Grecian windflowers (Anemone blanda) for an extra layer of beauty.

Add some pizzazz with Anemone de Caen Sylphide. These hot-pink flowers with blue-black centers will attract bees, butterflies and second looks from passersby.

Continue your spring extravaganza with late-season tulips. Choose some with unusual flower styles like fringed, parrot, and lily as well as other single and double late-blooming varieties.

Don't stop there. Alliums provide a colorful bridge between spring bulbs and early summer perennials. The flowers can be as big as basketballs and stand up to four

feet tall. Incorporate a bit of unique beauty with Gravetye Giant leuciums. The blossoms of these long-lived bulbs resemble white Victorian lampshades trimmed with green dots.

Fill shady areas with sky blue, white and pink Spanish bluebells, also known as wood hyacinths. Dangling clusters of bell shaped flowers adorn these 12 to 15" tall plants.

You may also want to include one of the world's most popular cut flowers, the Dutch iris. Buy these bulbs in bulk to ensure you have plenty of blooms for arrangements.

Now is the time to plan for an extended, colorful spring display. Order your bulbs early for the best selection and plant them any time from mid to late fall. Months of spring beauty ahead!
