

Sabres Close Out **Successful Road Trip**

The Buffalo Sabres closed out a successful west coast road trip with three wins and two losses. The road trip opened on October 13th with a 3-0 win against the woeful Arizona Coyotes. Woeful meaning the 'Yotes had been shutout in three of four games. The Sabres then lost badly on October 16th in Las Vegas 4-2 and in San Jose 5-1 on October 18th to drop to a 3-4 record. Two more losses to finish the trip would put the team at 3-6 and in a crisis mode early in the season.

Then it all came together on Saturday October 20th in a 5-1 win in Los Angeles where the Sabres dominated the Kings in building a 4-0 lead through two periods on goals by Jason Pominville, Jeff Skinner (2) and Zach Bogosian. Skinner completed a hat trick in the third period. Of particular good news Jack Eichel earned the primary assists on the opening two goals and finished with three assists along with a plus three. This was a significant step for Eichel who dominated play at even strength after ranking with the sixth worst

plus minus record at minus six among the league's 500 players through the first seven games.

Eichel earned another assist in the teams 4-2 win in Anaheim on Sunday October 21st and was a plus one. The Ducks took a 2-0 lead in this game. Rather than fold the Sabres rallied for a 4-2 victory. Jeff Skinner scored to give him four goals in the two games since being moved on to the top line with Eichel. The Sabres scored two goals 1:28 apart in the second period to tie the game 2-2, and Ristolainen's power-play goal at 3:57 of the third gave them a 3-2 lead.

Berglund scored into an empty net at 19:43.

Two complete games that we just played, and I thought that was the first time all year that we got down in a game and we just never changed the way that we played. That second goal could have been a back breaker for us, but we just stuck with it. We played the exact same way and we got rewarded", said Kyle Okpo-

"When we are moving the puck quick and guys are moving back into position, we countered quickly, from that point, I think we had a shot mentality. Everything was going to the net and more guys were getting there and making it tough for (goalie Ryan) Miller and we got rewarded", said coach Phil Housley.

This game was a gut check for the Sabres and the comeback was their best performance of the season. The team host the Montreal Canadiens Thursday night at the Keybank Center.

2. Dress like a ghoul or goblin, but stay safe. Make sure costumes and candy bags or pails are reflective. Costumes shouldn't drag too far on the ground to avoid tripping, and masks, hats, and shoes should be well-fitting.


3. If you plan to be driving during trick-or-treat hours, watch for children walking on roadways, medians, and curbs. Be sure to enter and exit driveways carefully.

4. Use well-marked

routes to get to the candy. Always use the sidewalk, and do not cut across yards or use alleys. Wherever possible, cross the road at a crosswalk.

5. When in doubt, throw the candy out. Avoid candy that has loose wrappings, is completely unwrapped, has puncture holes, or is homemade and not factory-wrapped. Small children should not be allowed hard candy, which could be a choking hazard. Boo safe out there!

The Caravan

Not to be political, and I try not to be, but the caravan is the big story and it is happening right now. Just want to express my personal observations. Here in Western New York we seldom have contact with immigrants from Central America, unless you go to a Mexican restaurant. Living here all my life, that is the way I have found it. It is only on occasion that we experience people who speak only Spanish. That is not the case in Florida where I spend the winters. There it is dominated with Hispanic speaking workers who speak no English. Some are clerks and hard to communicate with when making a purchase. But that is the way it is down there. You learn to accept it.

The state would have trouble existing without the migrant workers from south of the border.

They do almost all the construction work, maid and housecleaning, picking, landscaping, and the hospitals are loaded with nurses and doctors from Central and South Amer-Hispanic doctors you could find here. It is so common down there, where I have been spending the winters for over 20 years, you think nothing of it. That is the way of life, in Florida at least.

A few years back there was a crew of Mexican immigrants working on the river bank behind our house. It was raining, and they were soaked. I invited them on to our lanai to get out of the rain. My wife made them coffee. One spoke English and was able to interpret our conversation. He expressed how happy they were to be able to work and send money back to their families. They all lived together in a trailer and shared the food to keep cost down. More money to send home. You must respect that.

Last year hurricane Irma passed over our property in Southwest Florida. Lots of damage. Almost everyone's roof on our street had to be replaced. The crews that did the work were all Hispanic. Not one non-Hispanic worker among them. If one did speak any English, he was usually elevated to boss of the crew. Realize here that the weather in Florida, and especially in the Southern part, is warm to hot. The sun shines all day almost every day in the winter. These crews would work mostly in the sun and heat without letting up, except to have lunch. Watched them go at it on dozens of roofs in our neighborhood. They got the job done. Relentless workers. You must respect that.


Another observation I made is their commitment

to their families. The Hispanic men have nothing on their minds except to take care of their wives and children. Many of these workers work just to make enough money to barely feed themselves. The rest is sent back home to their families, wherever they may be. Those that are here as citizens are also dedicated fathers. We sometimes attend a Mexican flea market near our home on Sundays. It is a church day and the women and children are dressed in their Sunday church going best. This is were you see the families as one. Happy to have found a life here in Amer-

Now for the caravan. I truly feel sorry for the people who are just looking to find a better life for themselves and their families. Wish there was an answer. Wonder why where they come from cannot provide better circumstances for them to live in. After the Mexican war in 1849 Mexico could have been part of the United States. The president at the time did not want that. Wonder as part of the US, if things would be different. Mexico is a beautiful country. Americans go there to vacation. The weather is good, and the people are hard working. What would it take to make it, so they are happy at home? That there would be no need for the hardships they are now enduring trying to make it to the promise land.

Unfortunately, the caravan will have to be in some way deterred. If successful there would only be more caravans. Only more chaos and hardships. Lets just hope that this all ends in a good way. Nobody gets hurt and those who are looking for happiness, are able to find it.

Medicare Part D

Seniors will have until December 7th to select their Medicare plans for the coming year. Traditional Medicare plans cover physician and hospital visits, among other basic health services. But for many seniors -- particularly those battling chronic conditions -- basic Medicare coverage isn't enough. That's why many beneficiaries purchase supplemental drug coverage through Medicare Part D stand-alone plans, or Medicare Advantage plans that include Part D benefits.

Part D plans aren't one-size-fits-all. In some states, seniors have as many as 30 different plans to choose from, each of which features different premiums, co-pays, and covered drugs. Plans are quite affordable. In 2019, the average Part D month-

ly premium will cost just over \$32 -- which is even cheaper than the previous year.

These low premiums are no accident. Part D forces private insurers to compete against one another for seniors' business. Indeed, insurers negotiate directly with drug companies -- and the government is prohibited from negotiating or setting prices. The end result is quality coverage at an affordable price.

Seniors who enroll in Part D coverage experience an 8 percent reduction in hospitalizations, according to a recent study by Johns Hopkins University and University of Illinois researchers. Part D has curbed senior mortality by 2.2 percent each year since its implementation, according to a study in the Journal of Health Economics.


