Supply officers in the Navy ensure sailors have the tools and equipment they need to deter any threat and maintain warfighting readiness and threat deterrence in an era of great power competition.

Ensign Bailey McGowan applied the lessons learned from Buffalo, New York, to help in developing the skills to become a naval supply officer. "Growing up in Buffalo, we're known for harsh weather, so overcoming challenges is something I was able to carry over into the military," said McGowan. Those lessons turned into an opportunity to learn leadership and the most innovative tactics of naval supply in the world at Navy Supply Corps School (NSCS), located in Newport, Rhode Island.

"I have a great interest in supply, which is why I concentrated in related fields for my bachelor's and master's degrees," said McGowan. McGowan is a 2012 University of Buffalo graduate, where she earned her bachelor's degree and a 2014 Canisius College graduate where she earned an MBA.

'Our mantra here at NSCS is 'Ready for Sea," said Capt. Nick Rapley, commanding officer, Navy Supply Corps School. "Our graduates leave this institution prepared to support the warfighter on land, at sea, in the air, and in the cyber realm. It is my honor to serve these men and women by providing them with the resources to learn their trade and perform in the fleet. Only a select few will have the privilege of serving as Navy supply corps officers. Logistics support is a critical part of mission success."

There are many sacrifices and goals one must achieve to be selected as a

supply officer. McGowan is most proud of graduating from officer candidate school. "Being able to push myself to the limit to learn new things about myself was a great feeling," said McGowan.

The future of naval warfare is rapidly changing, so the course and materials at supply school are constantly evolving to create the most dynamic, lethal, safe and professional warfighting team for the Navy our nation needs.

As McGowan and other officers continue to train, they take pride in what it means to serve their country in the United States

"I'm very proud to serve my country, and I know that my family is very proud of me," said McGowan.

Assumption Church will commemorate Veterans Day and the 100th Anniversary of the Rebirth of Poland as a Nation on Sunday, November 11th.



Hot Line Leads Sabres united on the line.


Following back to back losses in Las Vegas and San Jose on October 16th and 18th, coach Phil Housley promoted veteran Jason Pominville from the fourth line to first where he would flank Jack Eichel with Jeff Skinner on the port side. At that time Eichel had five points in seven games with only one

even strength point (an empty net goal) and his minus 6 ranked 464th out of 470 players. Skinner had one goal with two assists and a plus two rating. Pominville had one goal and no assists.

The move produced immediate results as Skinner fired a hat trick in the next game at Los Angeles with Pominville tripling his offensive output

two assists along

with a plus three and Jack Eichel producing three assists and a plus four. Pominville's veteran presence and well rounded game had a profound impact on his new line mates who have inhabited the lower echelons of the NHL's plus minus ranking in recent seasons but have been on the positive side of that ledger since the three were

plus seven for the season. Èichel has a single goal over that stretch of games but tallied 11 assists on his wingers 15 goals for 12 points and a plus five. He is now 4-13-17 with a minus two rating. Among the NHL goal leaders, Skinner ranks 11th and Pominville is 21st. Eichel ranks 88th with his four goals.

Eichel is the play mak-

er on the new line. His 11 assists are the fifth highest total in the league. In spite of possessing an outstanding wrist shot, Eichel has a minuscule 6.8 shooting % on 59 shots. Removing his empty netter from the equation shows him with only three goals for a 5.2 shooting % which is well below his career 9.7%. Now in his fourth season it seems clear that Eichel is not one of the elite goal scorers or "do it all" players like Taylor Hall or Connor Mac-David. But with a sniper on each wing his elite play making skills are now in full effect.

Some have called this new unit the NHL's best

line but after 8 games together it may be a little too soon for such accolades. While the team has lost four times over that stretch, the "loser points" from a pair of overtime losses gives them 10 points in those eight games. That is a 100 plus pace over 82 games. That sort of continued success would see playoff hockey here in April. Currently the Sabres occupy the wild card spot for the

eighth playoff berth in the Eastern Conference.

During this streak the Sabres have feasted on games against the leagues worst teams and face challenges with a stronger schedule ahead. But that is a nice change of pace from last year when the 31st place Sabres were the team the others feasted on.





Senior Fitness

Americans are living longer than ever before. The average lifespan in the U.S. has doubled over the past 100 years. In 1918, you were lucky if you made it past 40 years of age. Today we're living into our 80s and the number of people living past 100 is at an all time high.

Fitness expert Jena Walther, Exercise Physiologist at the Scripps Center for Executive Health in La Jolla, CA, says more than half of us who are over 55 don't even meet the minimum recommended guidelines for exercise. They lack confidence, are afraid they'll hurt themselves or are just plain uninterested. And, it gets worse as they get older.

"In addition to making older folks feel better, the advantages of keeping fit include the ability to prevent some of the more serious diseases associated with aging, including Type 2 Diabetes, cardiovascular disease and even Alzheimer's," according to Dan Weber, president of the Association of Mature American Citizens.

Weber encourages seniors to enter into what he calls a "Fitness Protection Program." He says, "As we get older we tend to seek ways to avoid activities that involve exertion. To quote one anonymous wag: the only exercise some people get is jumping to conclusions, running down their friends, sidestepping responsibility, and pushing their luck. We need to overcome inertia and find ways of improving our heart rates and blood sugar levels by developing good exercise habits. Of course, it is important to check with your doctor before beginning any regi-

men that involves strenuous activities."

AMAC suggests that, ideally, your own Fitness Protection Program will include formal exercise routines – even if it is going for a walk around the block. But being active doesn't have to be limited to your workout times. There are plenty of ways to become more active as you go about your day. For ex-

• When you are out stairs over the elevator, park at the far end of the parking lot when arriving at appointments and meetings, walk down every isle of the grocery store while shopping, practice balancing skills while standing in line, do neck rolls while waiting at a stoplight.

• When you are at home, do a set of wall push ups while waiting for water to boil, vigorously vacuum, tend to the garden, sweep the sidewalk, rake leaves, lift weights while watching the news, try toe-raises while talking on the phone, do knee bends after sitting for a long period of time.

Says Weber, "you will feel better if you keep active. Guaranteed!"




