Patrick Berglund Shuffling Out Of Buffalo

Patrick Berglund has apparently played his last game as a Buffalo Sabre. He was suspended by the team after he failed to report for a flight to Washington for a game against the Capitals. It appears that Bergland is unhappy with a diminished role on

the Sabres where he has been a healthy scratch for several games.

Berglund had a no trade clause with which is changed on June 30th into a limited no trade clause. Berglund

Yet here is one that really stands out as the most unusual and out of the norm of all. The year Channel 4 Television news decided they wanted to video a large family on Christmas morning. Yes, we were the chosen ones as our neighbor knew we had, at the time, seven children with a good looking father. And mother. He worked for the television station and was familiar with us and our traditions. He thought it would be a perfect fit.

We were informed well

in advance of the TV Christmas plan. The television crew would come into our house and record the whole event on Christmas morn from coming down the stairs, the excitement of our little kiddies seeing what Santa had brought them and the whole holiday atmosphere. Now how great is that? We were going to be television stars even if it was brief. We all knew it was going to happen so nothing was a surprise. Now we had to prepare for this big moment. The anticipation was overwhelming. The kids jumped up and down at the news of the upcoming experience. We were going to be on TV so we had to get ready.

We did have family tra-

ditions that were passed down from generation to generation. For some reason Santa decorated the tree when he came on Christmas Eve. The tree was in its stand but bare of any ornaments. No one was allowed downstairs before anyone else in the morning. They all came down the stairs together except of course Santa who had to turn on the tree lights and music. Knowing this was going to be seen by thousands of people on TV, preparations had to be made. Santa spent his last penny making sure the under the tree display of toys made the choice of our family as TV stars a good one. We had to prepare.

Finally, Christmas Eve arrived and we tried to get the sweet little things to bed as early as possible. That gave Santa more time to trim the tree, assemble what toys needed to be assembled and there were plenty. Had to make sure everything was perfect. Our nine stockings were hung in a row on our black marble fireplace. The Christmas chart with the marks of good and bad

for each child so Santa knew who was naughty and who was nice. Did what had to be done for the TV camera. It was about four in the morning before I went to bed. made cookies, the decorations outside of our nine snowmen. Camera crew was there for at least half an hour. What an exciting morning. Just like that it was over. All the anticipation, the waiting, the preparations and now It was done. All that is left is to see the results and watch ourselves on TV.

It was on the twelve o'clock news. It was edited down to maybe 30 seconds as there was a lot of news that day. Everything was a brief flash, the kids, me, the toys, the cookies, and the star of the show, our German Shepard dog, Duke. It was on again at six, but brief and so short, it was kind of disappointing. It did not make the eleven o'clock news. We all watched every minute of all the newscast, thinking it may be on at any moment. Oh well, we did make it on, even as brief as it was. But maybe we will still get our 15 minutes of fame that they say happens to everyone. This was just not it. Just wish I had a copy of that tape now. That would make it all well worth it.





First Night Buffalo, which draws approximately 5,000 people from the city and suburbs each year, has outlived many similar events across the country. A group of artists and civic-minded citizens founded First Night in Boston in 1976 as an alternative to traditional New Year's Eve festivities. WNY United Against Drug & Alcohol Abuse, in cooperation with Rich Products, initiated First Night in downtown Buffalo on December. 31st, 1989.

The "first" First Night featured the up-and-coming Goo Goo Dolls, the Ramrods, Outer Ćircle Orchestra, blues musician

Billy McEwen, comedy shows, dance performances, and more. The former Marine Midland Bank sponsored a "Light the Night" procession down Court Street.

In 1992, Independent Health, through its Foundation, secured the event and has proudly presented it for the past 27 years, said Carrie Meyer, executive director of the Independent Health Foundation.

"For some perspective, when the 'first' First Night debuted Dec. 31, 1989, the Bills led the AFC East heading into the playoffs, Jimmy Griffin was mayor of Buffalo, Phil Housley played for the Sabres, and a gallon of gas cost 97 cents," she


