Led by guest organist, Dr. Patrick Scott (Atlanta, GA), the service will present great hymns of faith with choirs, brass, percussion, and organ.

One of the major ways Christians have shared their faith throughout history has been through the singing of hymns. The choirs of Westminster and the Buffalo Brass will lead the congregation through favorite hymns of the liturgical year, beginning with Advent, and ending with Christ the King. Sabres Greatest Game

With the Sabres idle during the all star break, we present memories of the greatest game they ever played. On Januever played. ary 4th 1976, the Sabres became the first NHL team to defeat a Soviet team when they defeated the touring Soviet Wings team 12-6 at Buffalo's Memorial Auditorium before 16,433 fans.

The Sabres were one of the leagues strongest teams, coming off an ap-pearance in the 1975 Stanley Cup finals, and were under pressure to win because the Soviets hadn't lost in the first three games of their tour. The tour was important to the visitors so much so that the Wings team added four players from the Moscow Spartak club to bolster their lineup.

Punch Imlach challenged his team to rise to the challenge and developed a game plan to ensure victory. He instructed his players to not chase the Soviets as they wove in and out of their pattern play in their own end but to wait for them at center ice and to anticipate and pick off their passes. His plan worked to perfection.

The game was played at the Buffalo Memorial Auditorium in front of 16,433 fans who roared their approval early in the game as the Sabres defense hit Soviet players hard at every opportuni-

ty. The Sabres opened the scoring at 6:10 of the first period when Josh Guvrement scored. Gilbert Perreault made it 2-0 at 7:10 and his French Connection linemate Rick Martin made it 3-0 half way through the period. At 13:45 the Wings made it 3-1 before Martin scored again at 14:23 to make it 4-1. The Wings Sergei Kapustin scored at 19:16 against Sabres goalie Gerry Desjardins and the period ended 4-2 in favor of the Sabres who led 17-9 in shots.

The second period featured even more goals with Jim Lorentz scoring at 4:32 and Robert at $5:\overline{3}2$ making the score 6-2. Valdimir Repnev made it 6-3 at 5:59. Jerry Korab scored on the power play at 8:26. At that point the Wings changed goalies, pulling Alexander Sidelnikov for Alexsandr Kylikov. That didn't help as Danny Gare scored at 11:44 followed by Peter McNab at 13:17 who made it 9-4. The Wings then pulled Klykov from the net and put Sidelnikov back in. The Sabres led in shots 34-16 after two periods.

In the third period Kapustin scored again at 3:28. The Sabres hit double digits when Fred Stanfield scored at 9:41 to make it 10-5 Yuri Lebedev scored at 11:23 followed by Gare with his second of the game at 14:04 and Brian Spencer at 18:04 for a 12-6 final score. This was the worst defeat ever for a Soviet team in international hockey. The Sabres finished with 46 shots against 25 for the Wings.

Rick Martin was the first star with two goals and five points but for many the highlight of the game was a heavy hit Jerry Korab threw on the Soviets best player Alexander Yakushev. Asked after the game about the tremendous nature of the body check, Korab replied, "He's Russian and I'm Polish. Think about it." Martin added, "You could tell they didn't like the fact that they got outskated. They all had this dumbfounded look on their faces. They didn't expect that. When we saw that we could skate with them, we just went for it and it worked."

The Sabres earned a tremendous amount of respect around the NHL for this victory. When they traveled to Montreal for their next game, the fans at the Montreal Forum gave the Sabres a standing ovation during pregame warmups. Imlach called the victory the "all time highlight of the Sabres." It remains the greatest game and most significant victory in franchise history.

The downside involved Peter McNab's post game comments about winning the game for Canada which did not resonate well with the Sabres' American fan base who subsequently booed him during home games. This resulted in his signing with Boston as a free agent, weakening the Sabres with his departure and strengthening the Bruins where he became a 40 goal scorer.

What was it like to come into an area to start a business that you know nothing about? It was like being dropped into the middle of Zimbabwe and trying to make something out of it. Like I said in my last column I was born and raised on the West Side of Buffalo and had never even been on Hertel Avenue. Clos-est I came to North Buffalo was the Buffalo Zoo on Parkside. So how do I start? Go door to door

and try to make friends and acquire customers. At the time, there was an established print shop on Hertel, Inkwell Print-They were my biging. gest competitor. At first, I concentrated on Delaware Avenue. Went into every business and was able to

scrape up enough printing jobs to carry me through the first months. Problem was I could not do it all, selling and printing. I went out during the day and worked later at the shop at 277 Tacoma. Sometimes into the night with no supper. Wanted it to work. However, needed to be out and about more of the day. Hired a retired bookkeeper part time. Older man, distinguished looking, articulate and presentable Art Herlson. Most people that came in thought he was the boss and I was the employee. We got along fine and I was able to introduce and establish myself in the

area. Remember this was fifty years ago. It had different ethnic identities. I

remember at least five strong synagogues, sorry I cannot name them, but I recall where they were. I was more familiar with the Catholic churches, St Margaret's, Holy Spirit, and St Marks as they all had strong grammar schools. Was able to do some printing for them. The public grammar schools were 21, 22, 81, 88, 56. I think 81 is the only one left. 88 is now the North Buffalo Community Center. 21 is gone and the other two 22 and 56 are apartments. I am going by memory so that may not be totally accurate. Neighborhood High Schools were Bennett, McKinley and Holy Angels Academy. Stan Makowski was Mayor and Bill Buyers was the Councilman.

Being located off the beaten path, seldom traveled Avenue, it was necessary to do some form of advertising. Problem was no money to spare. There was a young man who used to hang around the shop, Rich Briandi. Came in every day after school. Had no money to pay him but he just seemed to have an interest and was a workaholic. Just wanted to be a

part of it. One day I asked him to go up on Hertel and see if he can get 15 businesses to put their business cards on a slinger at \$10 each. This he was able to accomplish, and the slinger with the 15 business card ads was the first North Buffalo Rocket. Printed 3,000 of them and had my children deliver them door to door in the neighborhood. One of the very first advertisers was Setel Wallpaper on Hertel. They were with me for many years. Hertel Hardware was another.

The Rocket was the key to the success of the business. That will come later. Just want to mention some of the things that were in 1969. The Main corner, Parkside and Hertel was long established then. Joe Sunshine and his sons Mel and Seymore had a major food store on the NW corner. Van Slykes Pharmacy was on the SW corner. A gas station was on the other and M&T bank was on the NE corner. I dealt with M&T and manager Clayt Gerlock. There was a young assistant manger at that bank by the name of Bill Swan. He later bought Black Rock Savings located on Hertel next to Sunshine's Market. Small bank with two or three people. He went on to buy Lockport Savings which grew to become First Niagara. One of North Buffalo's success story.

The biggest business on Hertel was the Sample shop at 1631. Took up the whole block. Started as a women's dress shop but grew into a department

store. Used to call on them as I did on every store on Hertel. Met the founder Luis Bunis and his sons Maer and David. Bill Melrod was the advertising director, so I did deal mostly with him. They were nice to me as an aspiring young entrepreneur. NorthPark Furniture was another staple on Hertel back then. Ray's Cleaner, Shalala Chocolates, Ben Glaser to name a few I got to know. The banks were Marine Midland and Liberty. Used to go into Jimmy's shoe repair. The elderly Mr. Bavasoto was running the shop and his young son Joe was at his side. Remember him well. Worked with his son Joe on many Hertel projects over the years.

I could go on and on with the hundreds of people I met and worked with in North Buffalo. Just wanted to go back to the very beginning. To the first year as a part of the North Buffalo Community. Most of those people have passed but it is great to reminisce and share their friendship. Hope you enjoyed this trip down memory lane. More to come as we celebrate our 50 years as part of the North Buffalo Community.

Ask Rusty - Spouse Benefits vs. Survivor Benefits from **Husband Who Delayed**

Dear Rusty: My husband is taking retirement next year and we went through the application process yesterday. No surprises until we found out that his delayed benefits do not apply to spousal benefits. His whole purpose of delaying retirement was to maximize benefits for me in case of an unexpected death. I have been reading and preparing for this retirement for several years, and I have never come across this information. Signed: Upset Spouse

Dear Upset Spouse: It's true that the question of delayed retirement credits and whether they apply to spousal benefits and/or survivor's benefits is widely misunderstood. Delayed retirement credits, or "DRCs," are accumulated when one delays claiming Social Security retirement benefits until after their full retirement age. DRCs are earned at the rate of 2/3rds of 1% for each full month of delay, or 8% per year of delay. At age 70 that can mean a benefit amount as much as 32% higher if your full retirement age is 66. DRCs don't accumulate after age 70.

The confusion for many comes from believing that the living spouse of the person delaying will be entitled to a spousal benefit based upon the amount increased by DRCs, which is not true. Benefits for a living spouse are based upon the other spouse's full retirement age benefit, not the increased benefit earned by delaying past full retirement age. Simplified, if you have reached your full retirement age when you claim your benefit as a living spouse you will get 50% of your hus-

band's "primary insurance amount," which is the amount he was due at his full retirement age, not his DRC-increased benefit amount at age 70.

Survivor's benefits, on the other hand, are based upon the DRC-increased benefit amount, so if your goal is, as stated, "to maximize benefits in case of an unexpected death," then you and your husband have achieved that goal. If your husband should predecease you and you have reached your full retirement age, you will get 100% of the increased benefit your husband achieved by waiting until he was 70 to apply (including all DRCs). If you claim the survivor's benefit before you reach your full retirement age, that benefit will actuarially reduced be based upon the number of months earlier that you claim it, but you also have the option to delay claiming your widow's benefit until you reach your full retirement age (FRA) and get the full 100% of your deceased husband's benefit at his death. And, incidentally, your FRA as a widow may be a little less than your normal FRA. Please note too that the survivor's benefit doesn't grow beyond your full retirement age, so make sure you do not wait beyond your FRA to claim it.
