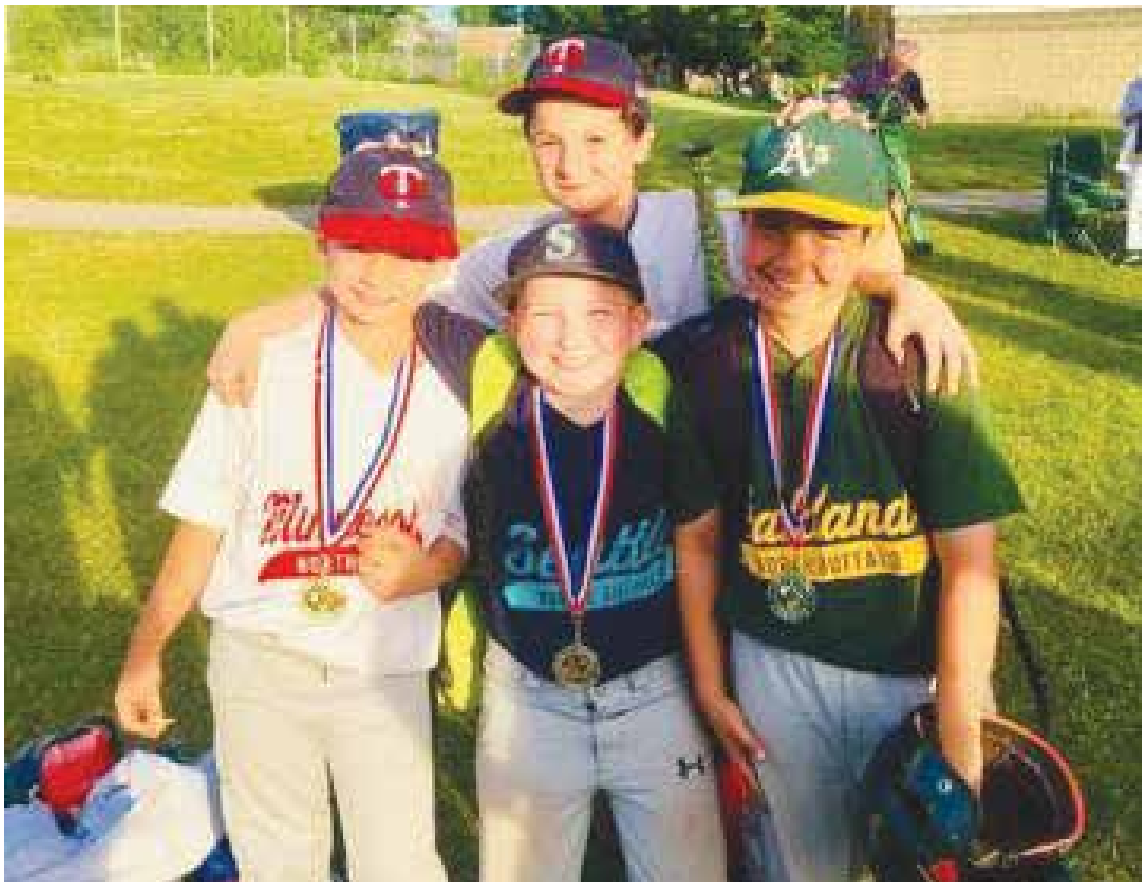


## North Buffalo Loves Baseball!

## Reinhart Proves That He Belongs

Although he finished strong with 25 goals and 50 points for his best NHL season stats There were questions of whether he could sustain and build off this success.

Last season began inauspiciously for Rhinehart going without a point in the first six games including a minus five rating in the second game during a 6-3 loss to the New York Islanders on October 7th. His season stats totaled only 10 points on five goals and five assists through the first 25 games. And then things got even worse.

Over a 25 game stretch from November 24th through January 11th, Rhinehart tallied only three points. This was a period of time when coach Phil Housley had been using him primarily at center which was the position he had been drafted for. Rhinehart's best success with Buffalo has been at right wing. Skating speed is not his

strength. He is a below average NHL skater but this deficiency is not as profound on the wing where he does not need to carry the puck up ice as much as the center or come back as deep into the defensive

zone. So coach Housley returned Rhinehart to the wing on Jack Eichel's line. Rhinehart responded with some very impressive player as shown by

scoring 23 points in his last 22 games. When he signed a new contract in the off-season questions were raised about his strong finish Why wasn't he as successful over the entire season? The implication was that once the Sabres were firmly ensconced in last place and the pressure to perform was over, that Reinhart was more comfortable and only then was he able to relax and preform as expected. While the Riehart camp hoped for a big payday in contract negotiations, he was signed to a bridge contract for two years at \$7.3 million.

With his performance this season, Reinhart has proven that theory to be false. Although he started slowly again with a single goal in his first 14 games along with five assists, Reinhart picked up the pace with 43 points in his last 43 games on 12 goals and 31 assists. He currently ranks 56th among all NHL scorers. His success comes from re-establishing his presence in front of the opposition net for screens and deflections. And using his hockey sense and passing skills to set

up scoring chances around the net. With another season of point per game production, Reinhart can look forward to his big payday in his next contract.

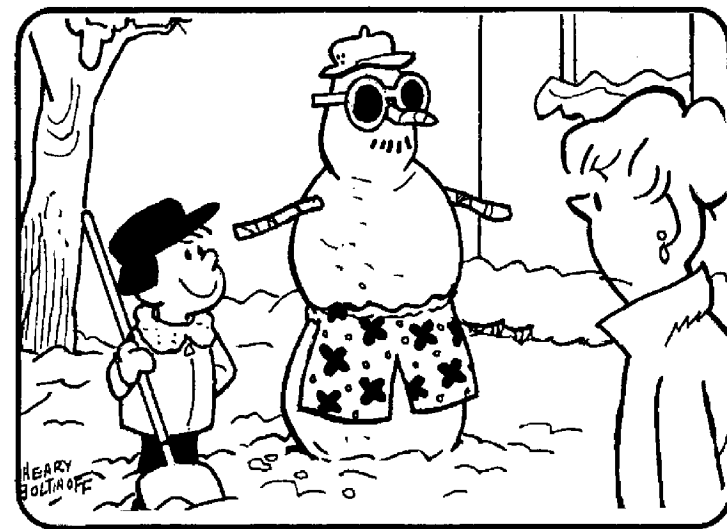

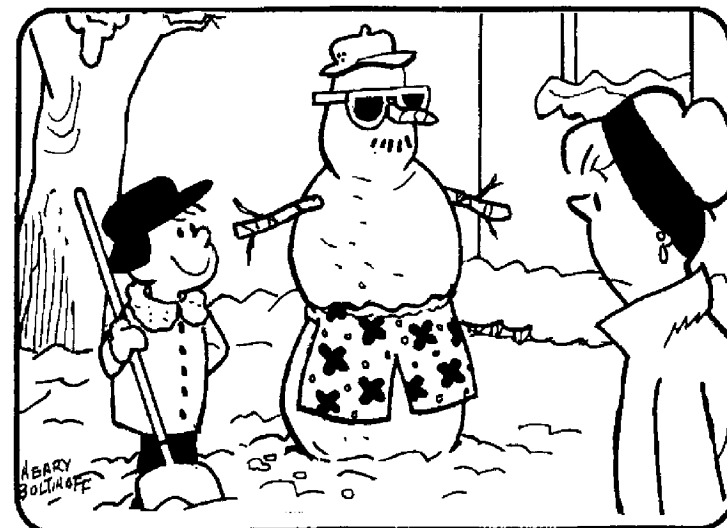

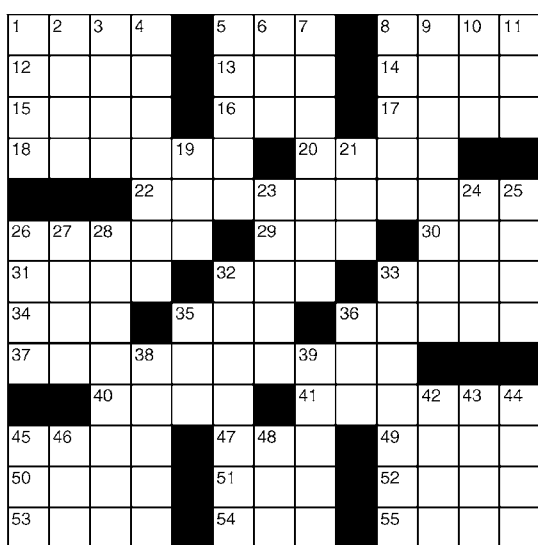

## Northwest Buffalo Beat

# North Buffalo 50 Years Ago

50 years ago, in February 1969 we started our printing business in North Buffalo. What was then known as the North Park section of Buffalo was soon to drop the park and become, North Buffalo. This would also include Central Park, location of the Buffalo Zoo. Born and raised on the West Side it became necessary to introduce our new enterprise to our new neighborhood.

There have been so many changes in the area in the last fifty years. I am going to try, by memory, what I recall about my new business home on Tacoma Avenue. Lots of memories and changes. One of the biggest things I remember is the aban-

doned railroad tracks that went through the area and the land it was located on. The tracks traveled East and West and crossed over Delaware and Colvin with viaducts which no longer exist. Wanted to mention this to pinpoint the site, and the enormous change that has transpired over all those years.

Start with the viaduct that crossed Delaware in the area that is now Delta Sonic. You can tell where the bridge was located as the street dips. Notice next time you travel down Delaware. One of the tragic events to ever happen in this neighborhood happened right there. Three young children walking home from School 81 on

Tacoma, lost their lives at that very spot. A driver who was an epileptic, had a seizure and drove up on to the sidewalk and into the group of young pedestrians. Others were injured. One of those things that stick in your memory and hard to forget. As a result of that incident many laws were changed.

There was a plaza on the East side of Delaware were the Goodwill store is now located. If memory serves me right, there was a Loblaw's super market and a Your Host restaurant. A drug store and some other smaller businesses. The YMCA was there but in danger of closing. Later there was a "Save the Y" movement and obviously it worked as the Y is still there. On the West side of Delaware between Comet and Hinman, there was pretty much nothing but abandoned railroad tracks. In fact, there was once talk about connecting the subway to those tracks and connect Tonawanda to downtown. That also obviously did not fly. Once the area was abandoned by the railroad, the land was sold and bought by devel-

opers.

What did happen was a major step in the development of North Buffalo. The viaduct was removed, railroad tracks cleared, new roads were added, and it became the new home of Target and the Delaware Consumer Square Plaza. With that the whole area blossomed. The Saratoga Restaurant, one of my favorite eating establishments, gave way to the plaza where Evans bank is now located. Turnmore Oldsmobile was on the East side of Delaware and has also departed. You would not recognize Delaware Avenue between Comet and Kenmore Avenue 50 years ago and now. There has been a huge resurgence to this part of the city. It is still part of Buffalo. Maybe the edge but still within the city limits and governed by city laws. Like a bit of suburbia in Urbana.

Now let's move to the major intersection of Delaware and Hertel. The only thing that remains intact from 50 years ago is the North Park Library building that is no longer a library. Car dealer gave way to Burger King. In front of the car dealer on the sidewalk was a news stand. Lasted well past the demise of the car dealer. Kmart came into the area in what was a huge empty field that housed a bike manufacturing business. Kohl's and Big Lots followed. I remember the huge field as I was on the site committee to find a

new home for the North Buffalo Community Center. That was a spot we looked at, acres of land and cheap. The community center ended up in the closed school 88 annex on Sanders road. Better for the neighborhood that those big box stores moved in. With that real estate in the area spiked.

Another thing was how the schools have changed. Right there on Hertel across from Kmart, was a thriving School 21. That also was torn down and is now the dollar tree. School 81 was so crowded they had to build and annex, 88 on Sanders. That eventually closed. What happened to all the children that were around 50 years ago? Where do they go to school?

I did publish an old ad from the Rocket showing the price of groceries back almost 50 years ago. Things were good but became better. With all the development and additions, the surge began. If you wanted to live in the city, North Buffalo was the place to be. New housing went up wherever space allowed. It was nice 50 years ago, but it is much nicer now. More to come.

# Ask Rusty - Using Health Savings Account (HSA) Funds While on Medicare

**Dear Rusty:** My understanding is that once I'm on Medicare the HSA cannot be used. I have prescriptions that cost more with the Medicare Insurance than paying cash, so why can't I use the HSA to pay for these types of prescriptions and for DME with prescriptions?  
**Signed: Wanting to Know**

**Dear Wanting:** The "HSA" (Health Savings Account) is an excellent vehicle to save money tax-free to use for paying medical expenses not covered by other types of healthcare insurance, but the rules surrounding HSAs are often confusing. To be eligible for an HSA, your main healthcare coverage must be (or have been) a high-deductible plan which exposes you to significant healthcare expenses you must pay "out of pocket." While you are working the HSA provides a savings account that you (and your employer) can contribute pre-tax dollars to, up to certain annual limits (\$3,500 if you're single and \$7,000 for a family in 2019). The money contributed reduces your taxable income and thus your tax burden, and money withdrawn from your HSA account to pay medical expenses is not considered taxable income. Certainly, a win-win situation, but there are some restrictions that you need to be aware of:

First, you and your employer must stop making HSA contributions 6 months prior to your date of application for Medicare Part A (hospitalization coverage). Enrollment in Part A is automatic if you are 65 when you apply for Social Security, because you cannot receive Social Security benefits without taking Part A if you are 65. Any HSA contributions made after the cutoff may be subject to tax penalties and they will not be considered pre-tax contributions (this applies to contributions from both you and your employer). But although you can no longer contribute to your HSA 6 months before applying for Part A, you can still use the money which has accumulated in your HSA to pay medical expenses for you and your spouse after you have enrolled in Medicare. A medicine or drug is a qualified medical expense for HSA purposes only if the medicine or drug requires a prescription or is available without a prescription (an over-the-counter medicine or drug) and you get a prescription for it, or is insulin.

If you have prescriptions or expenses for durable medical equipment (DME), the cost associated with the purchase or rental of DME which is prescribed by a medical practitioner to alleviate

or treat a specific medical condition is a qualified HSA expense. If it costs less to pay cash, you can use the accumulated funds in your HSA account to pay those expenses, rather than using Medicare or a Medicare Advantage plan. And as an extra bonus, you can even get reimbursed for your Medicare Part B (and D) premiums using funds which accumulated in your HSA account while you were working and contributing to it.
